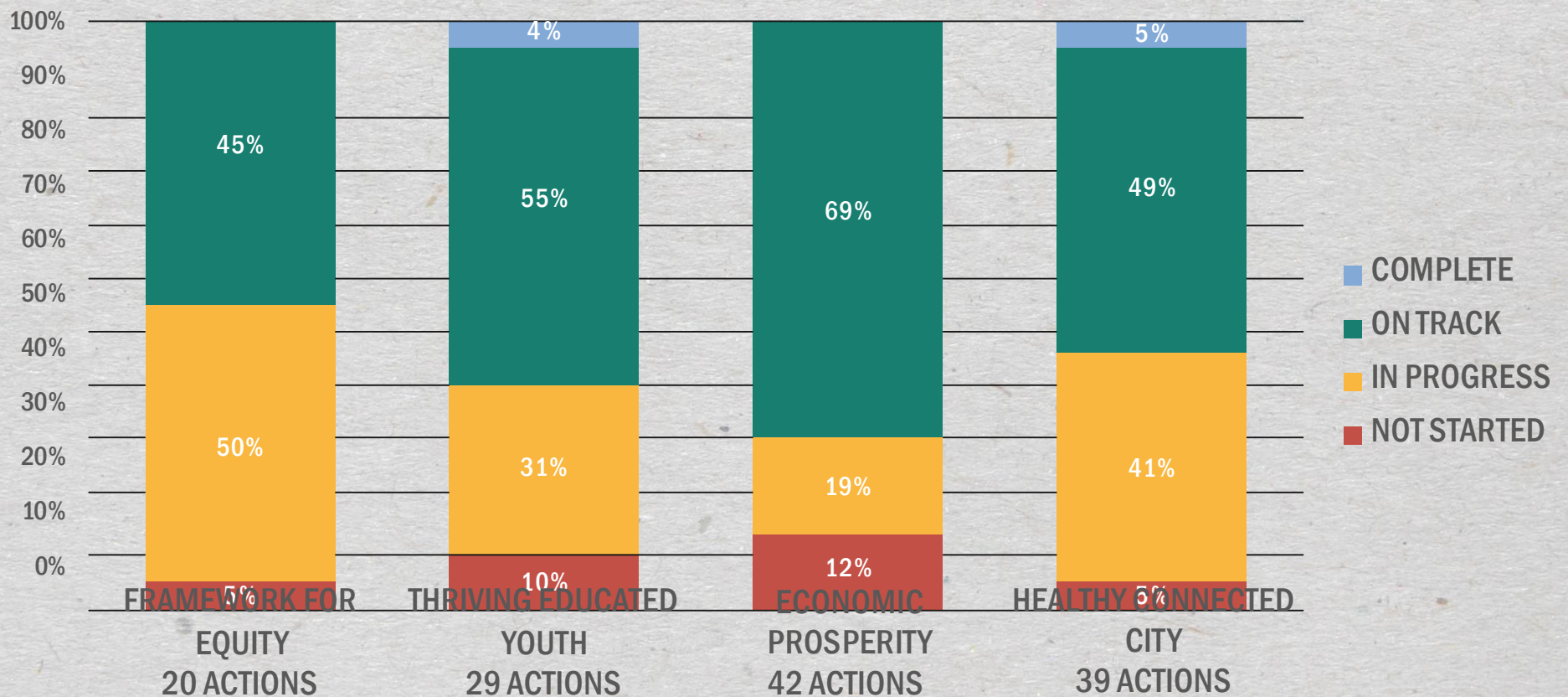

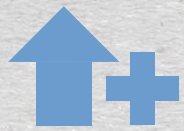

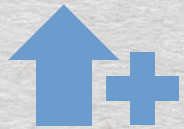

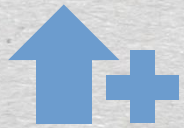

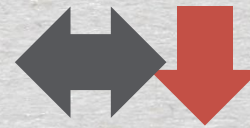

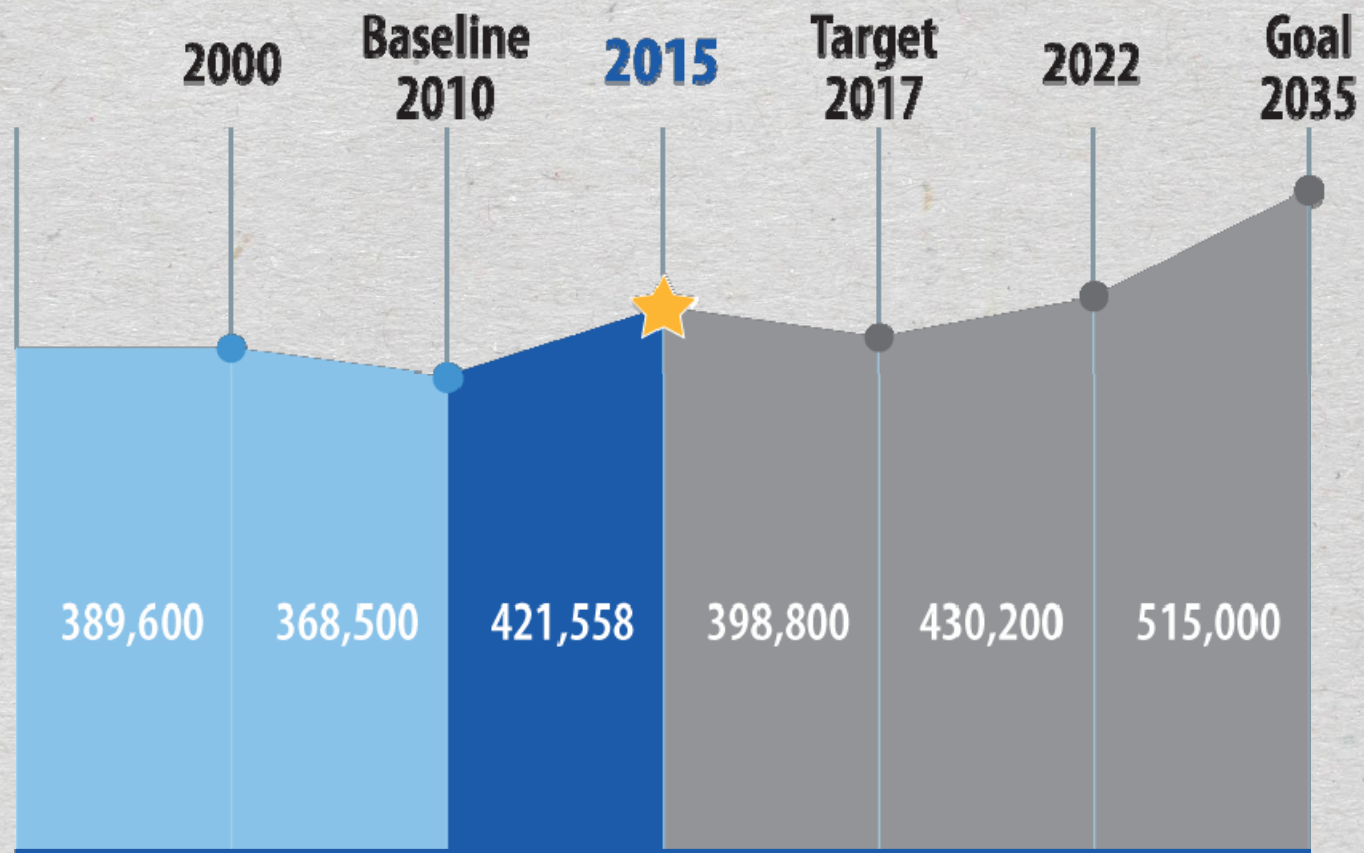

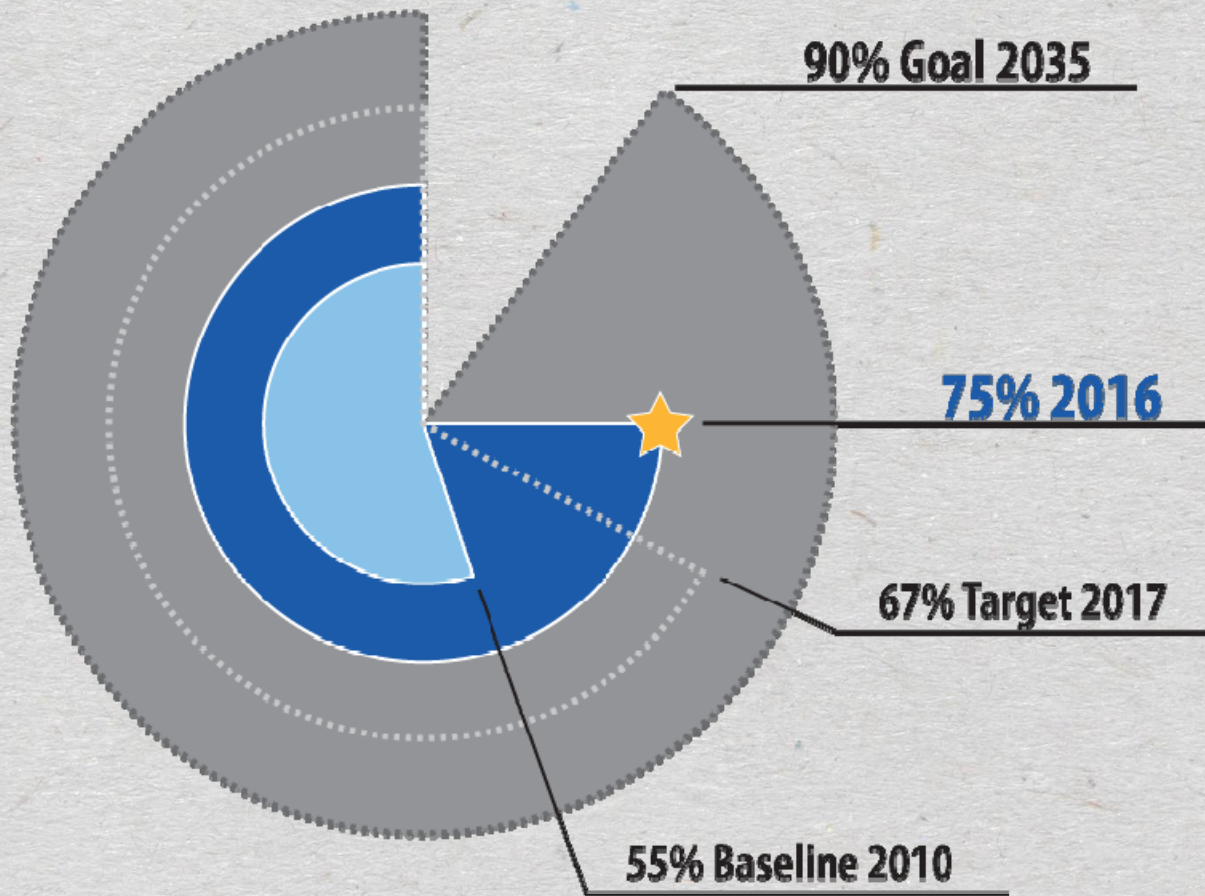

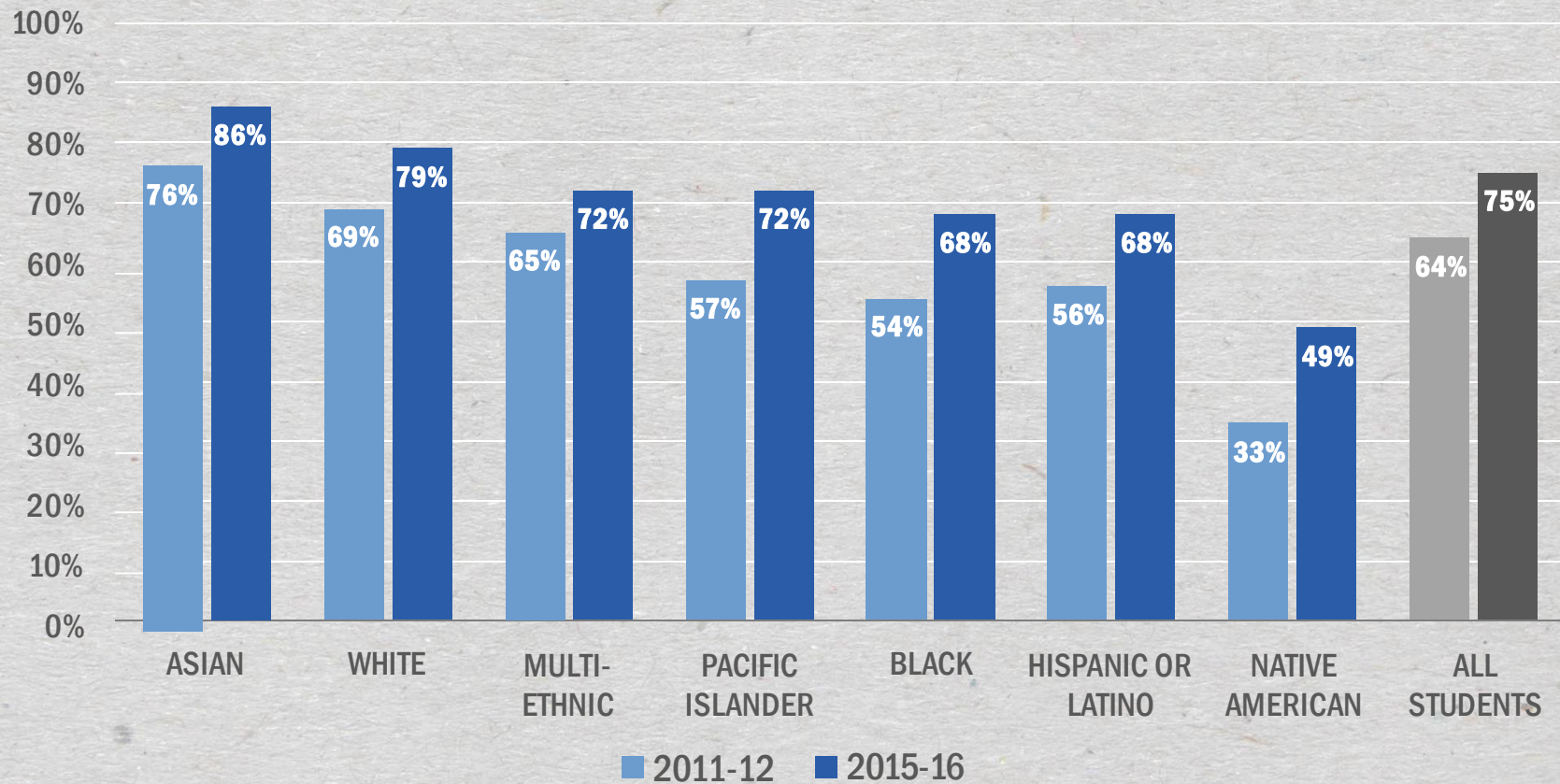
On-time Four-year High School Graduation Rate



ON-TIME GRADUATION RATES BY RACE



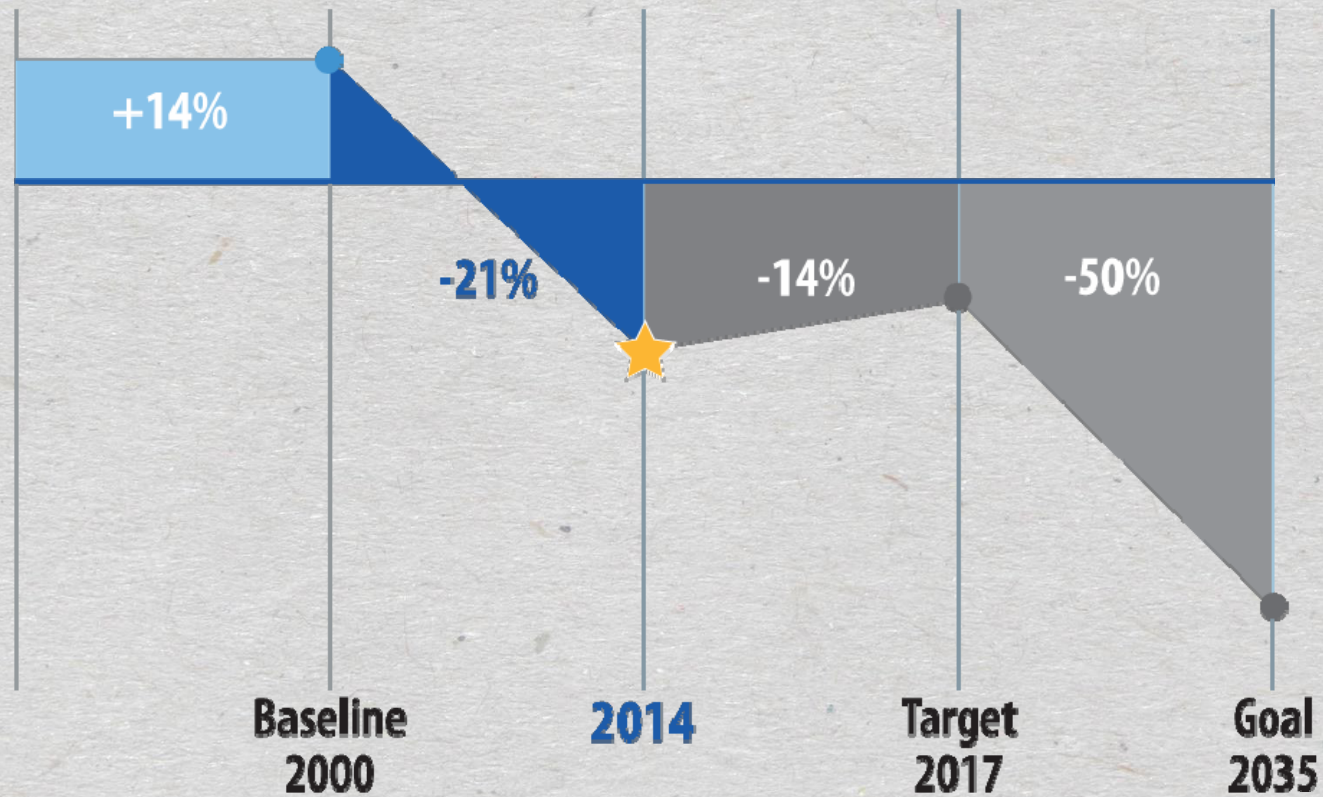

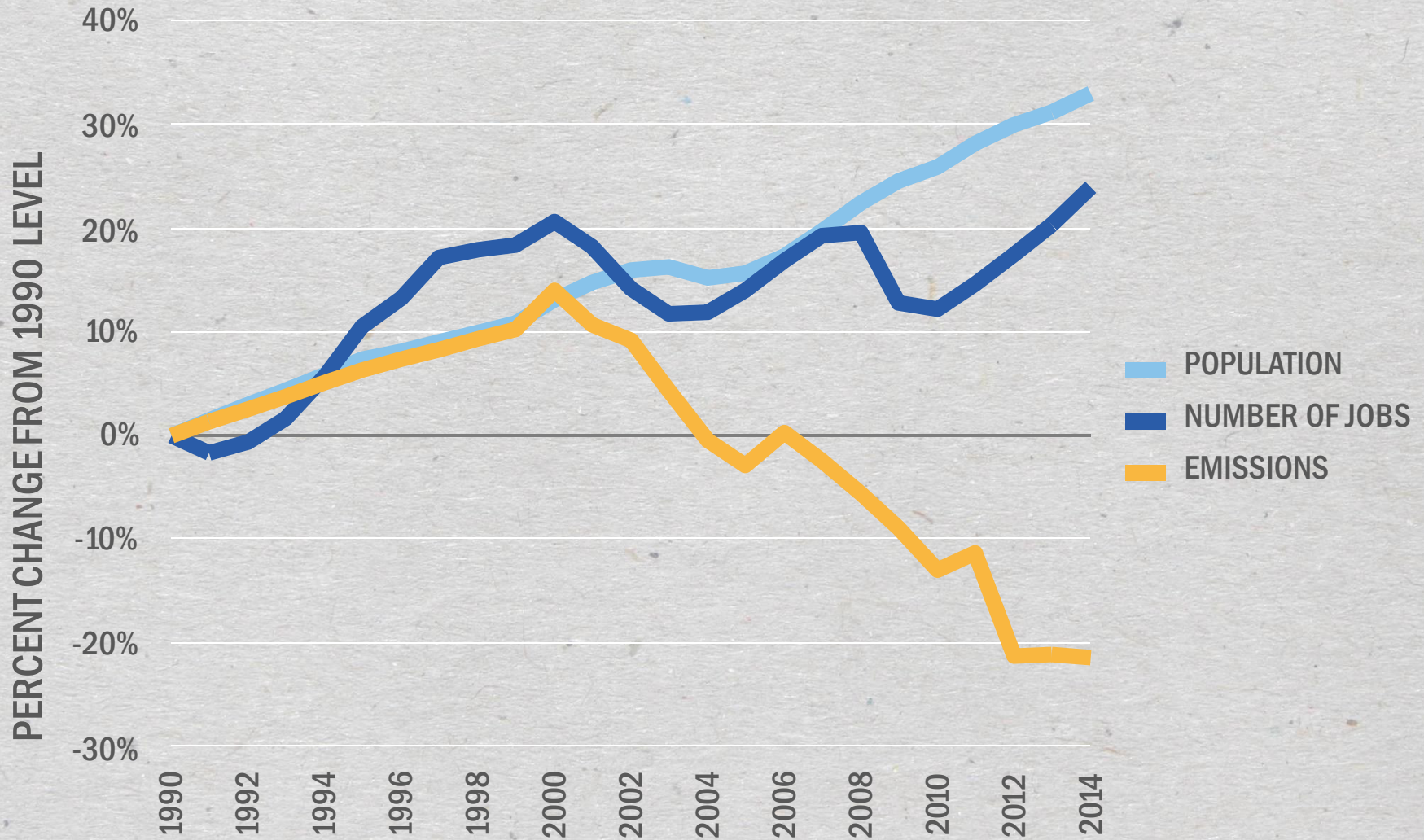

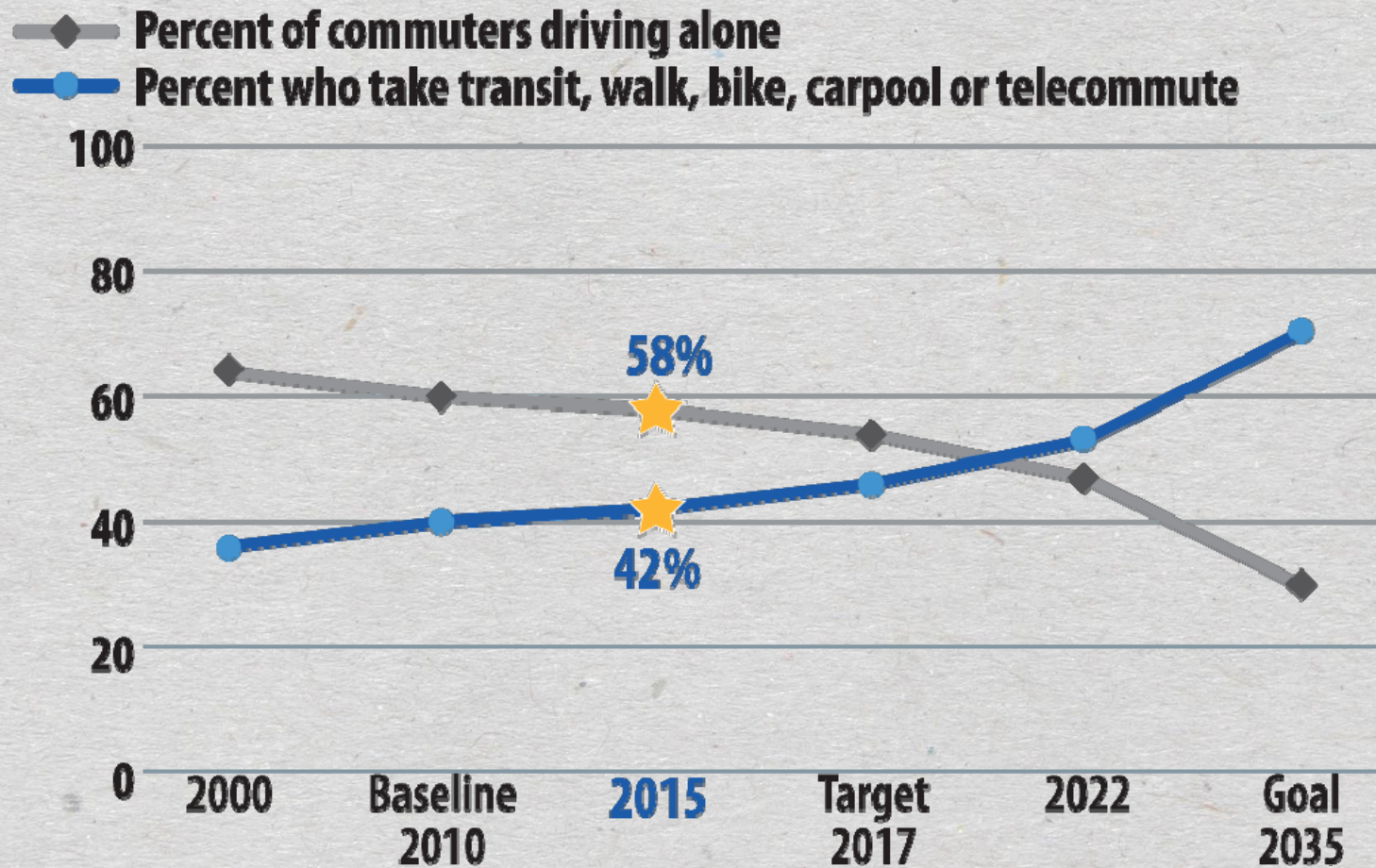
Percent Below 1990 Carbon Emissions Levels

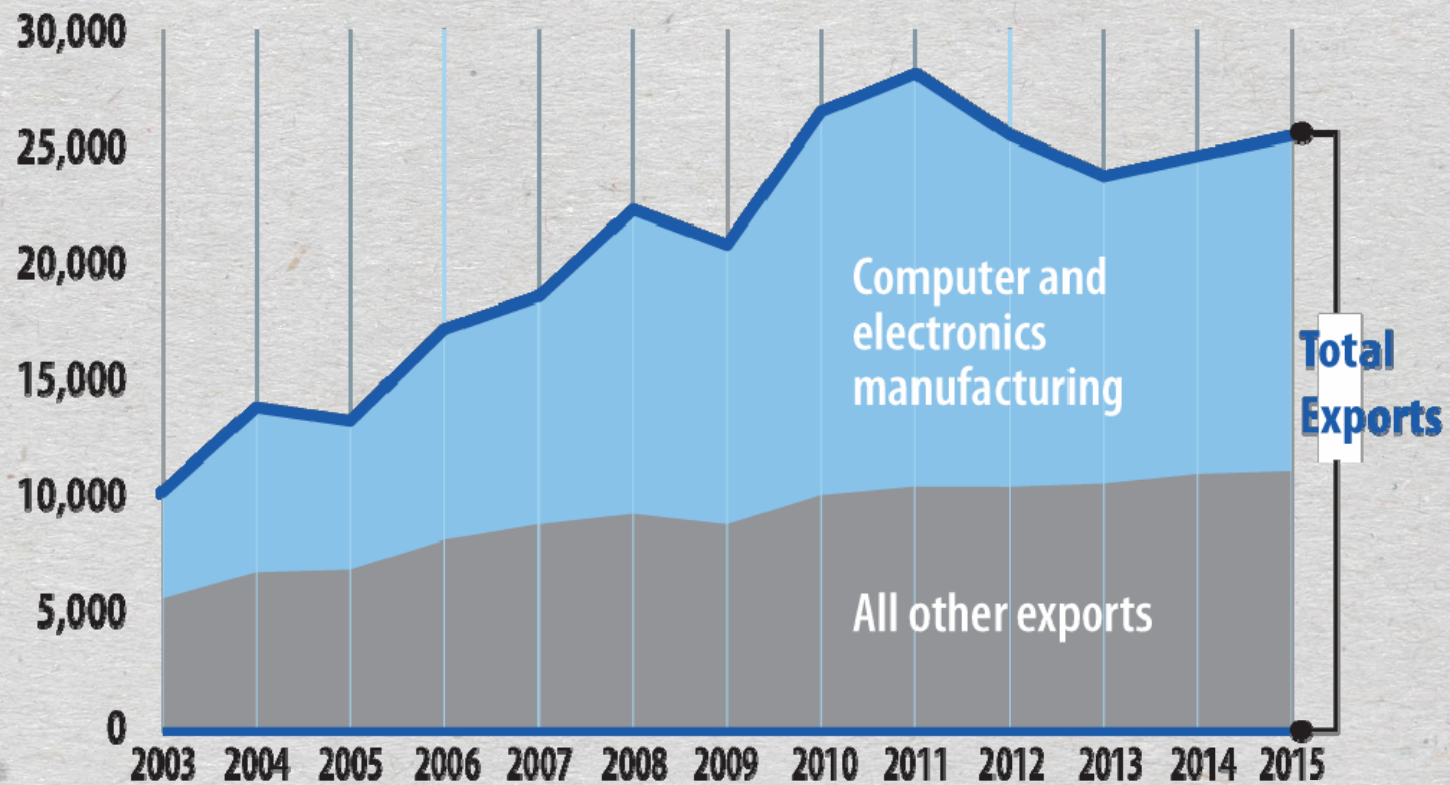

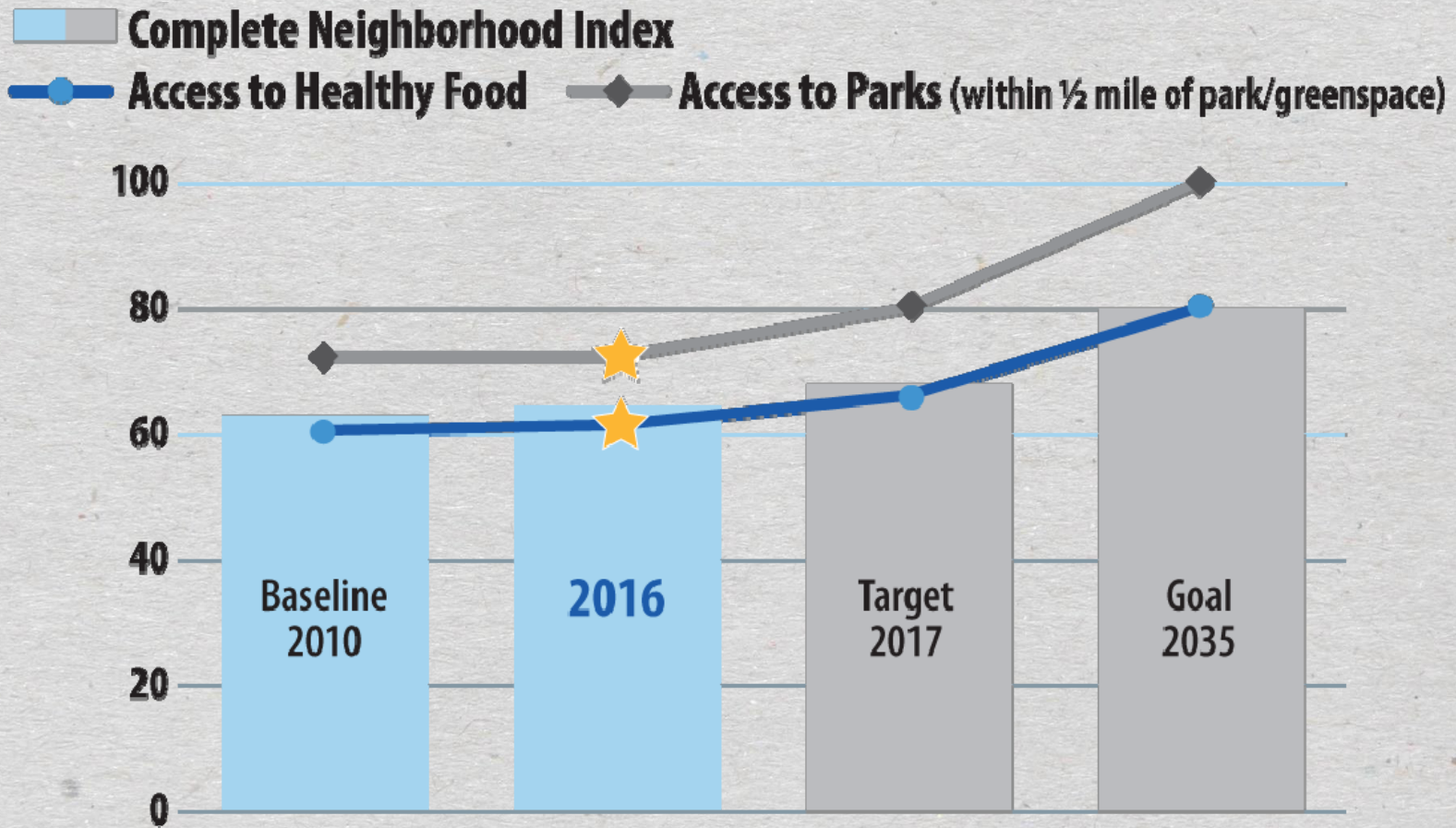

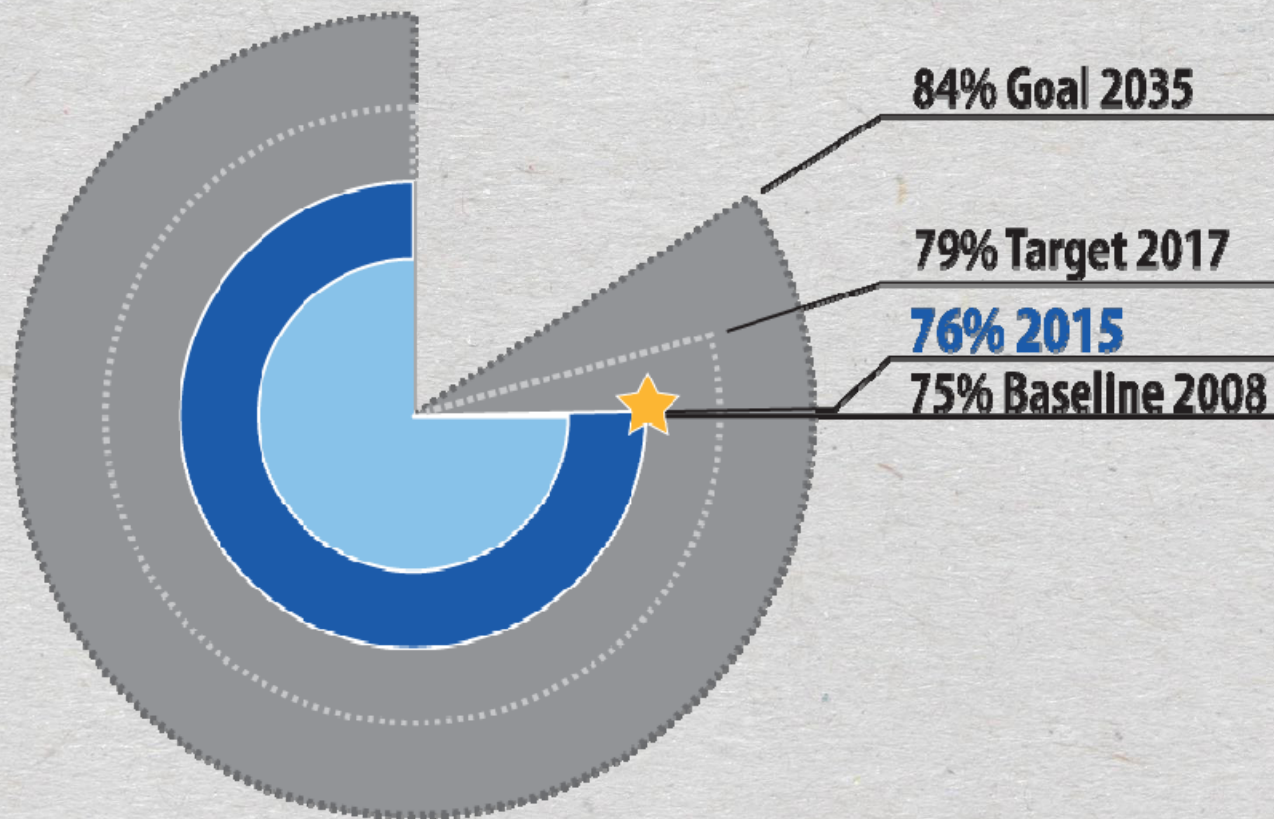

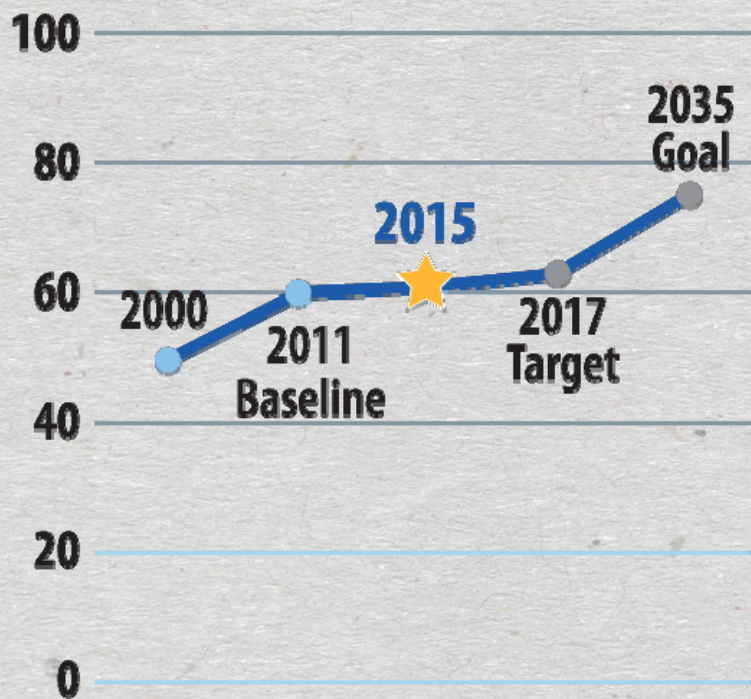
Percent of Eighth Graders at a Healthy Weight



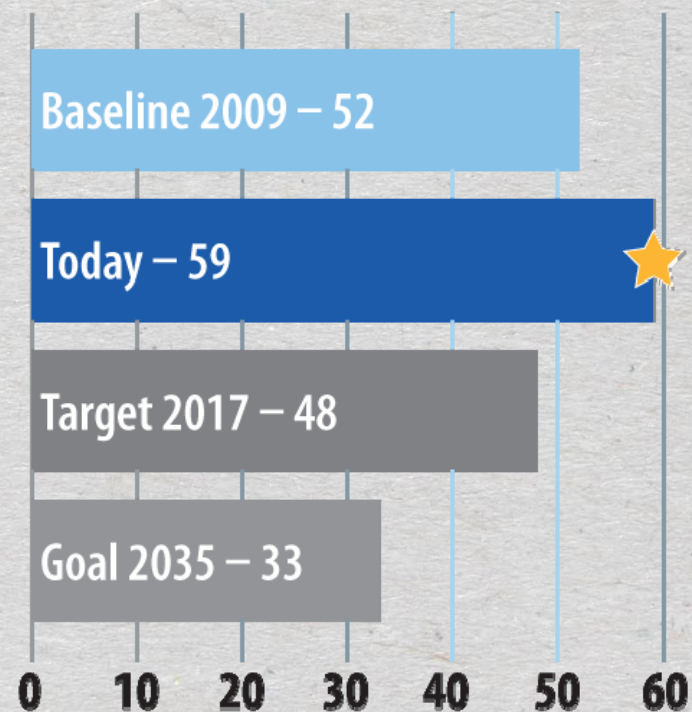

Percent Who Feel Safe Walking Alone at Night in Their Neighborhood



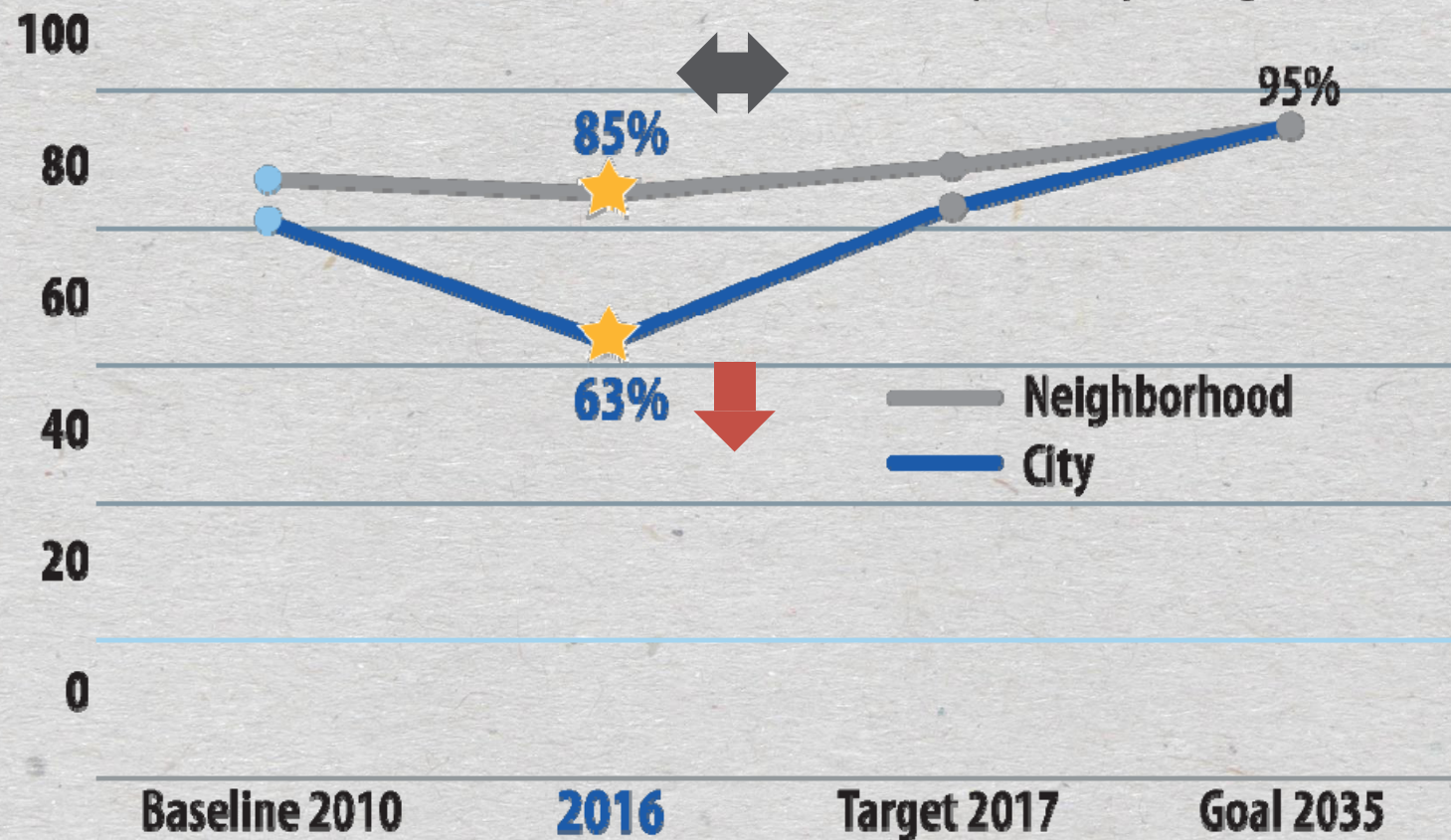
Serious Crimes Per 1,000 People



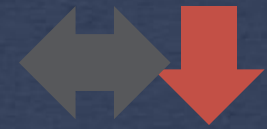

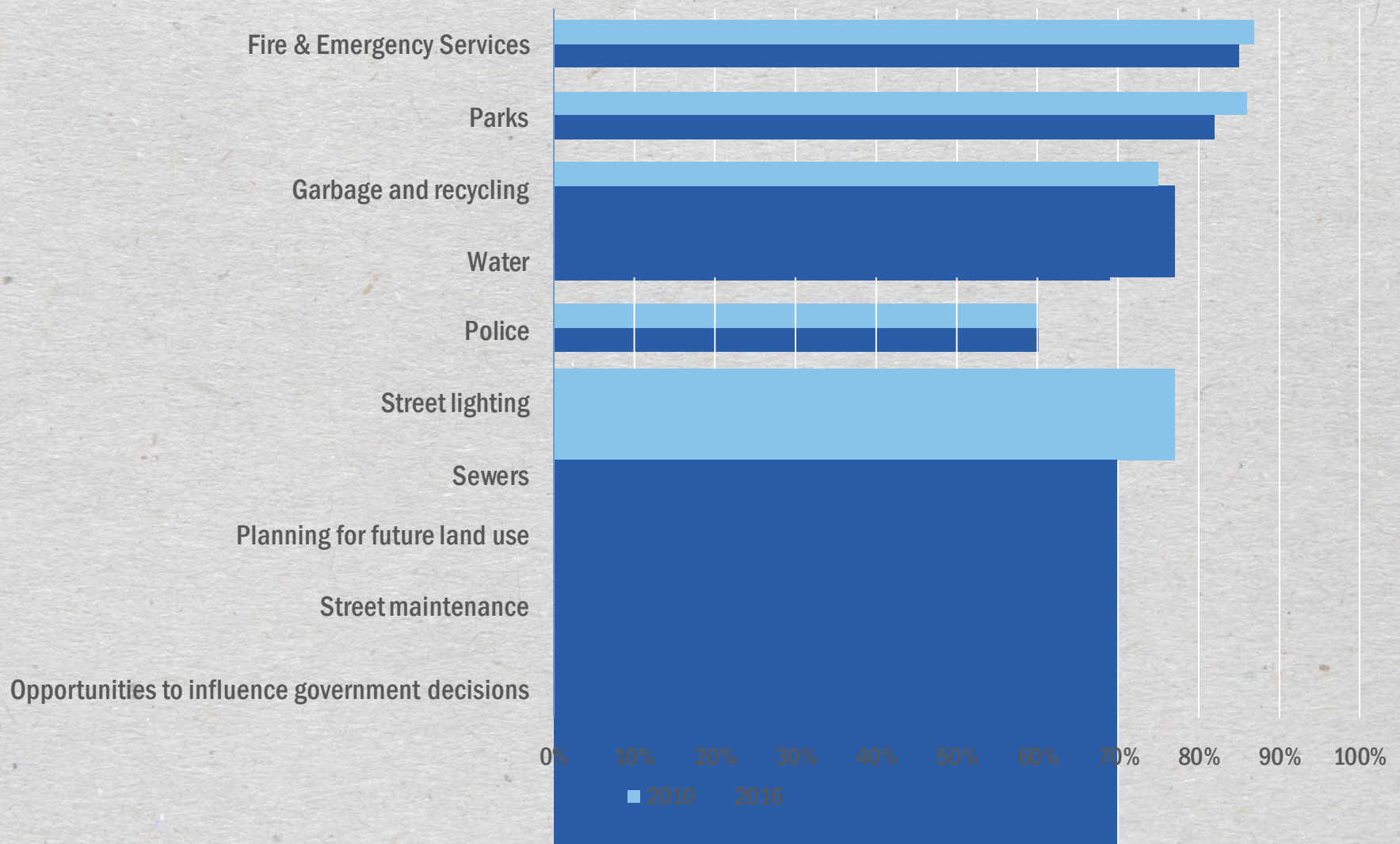
Percent of Residents Satisfied with Livability of City/Neighborhood

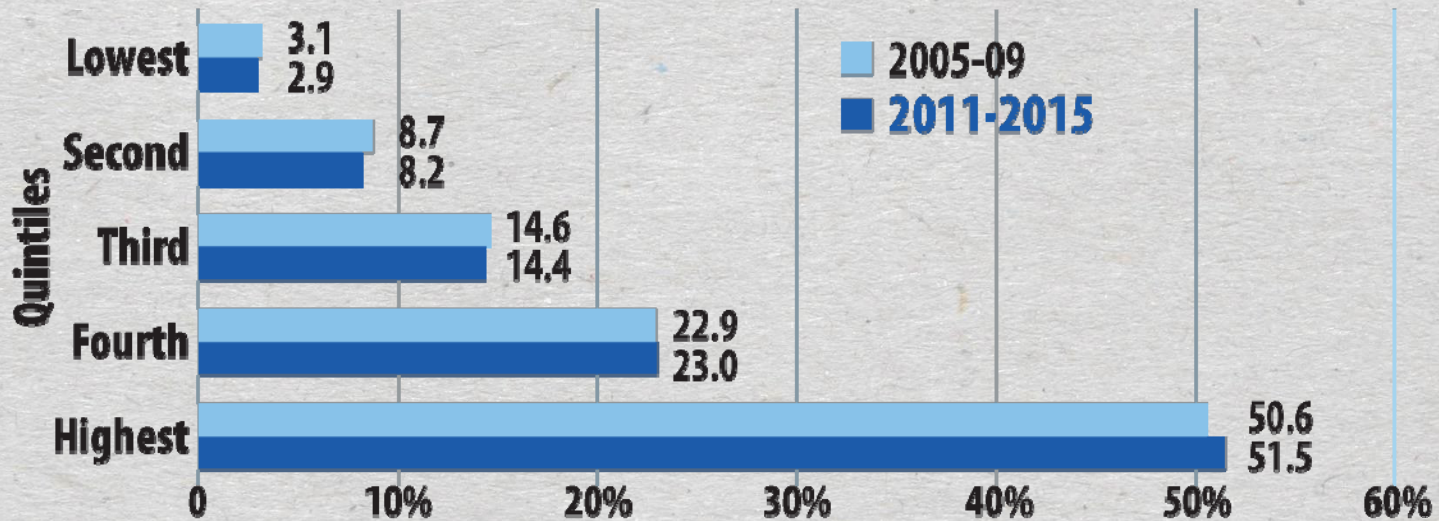

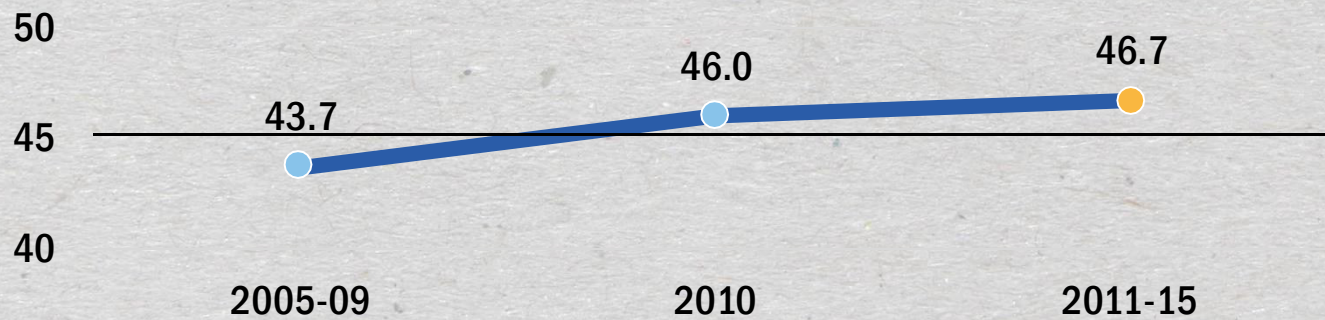

Income Distribution for City of Portland



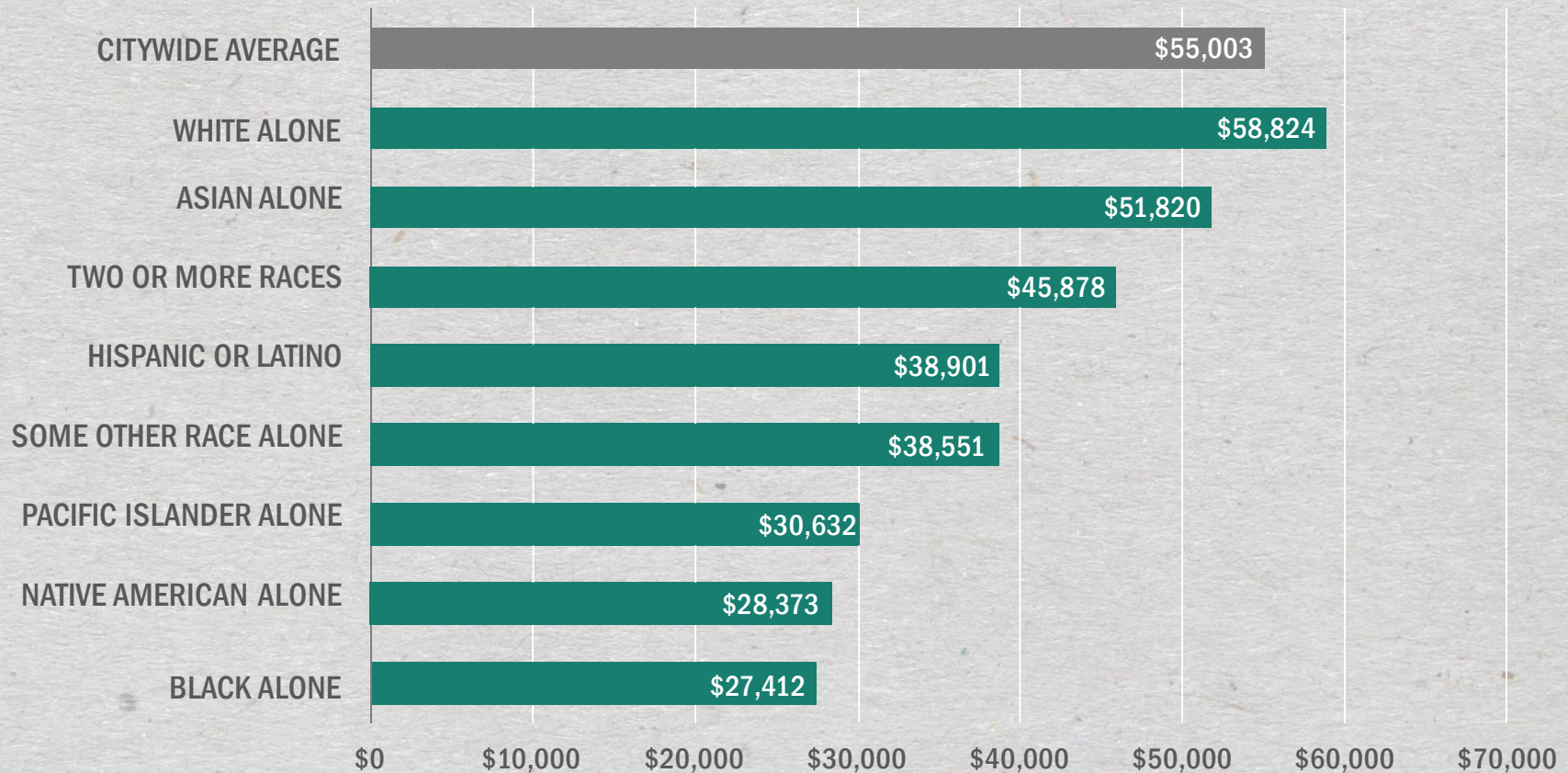

MEDIAN HOUSEHOLD INCOME BY RACE



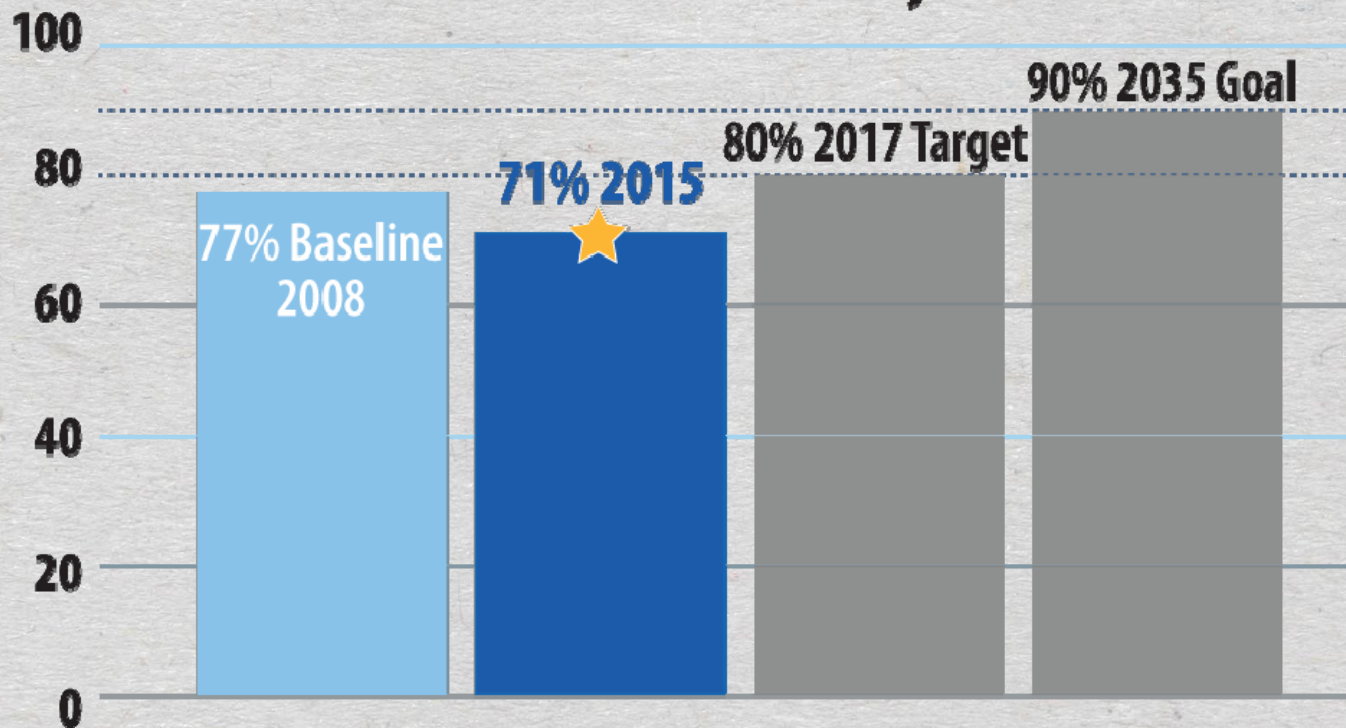
MEDIAN HOUSEHOLD INCOME BY RACE OR ETHNICITY PORTLAND, OR 2011-15

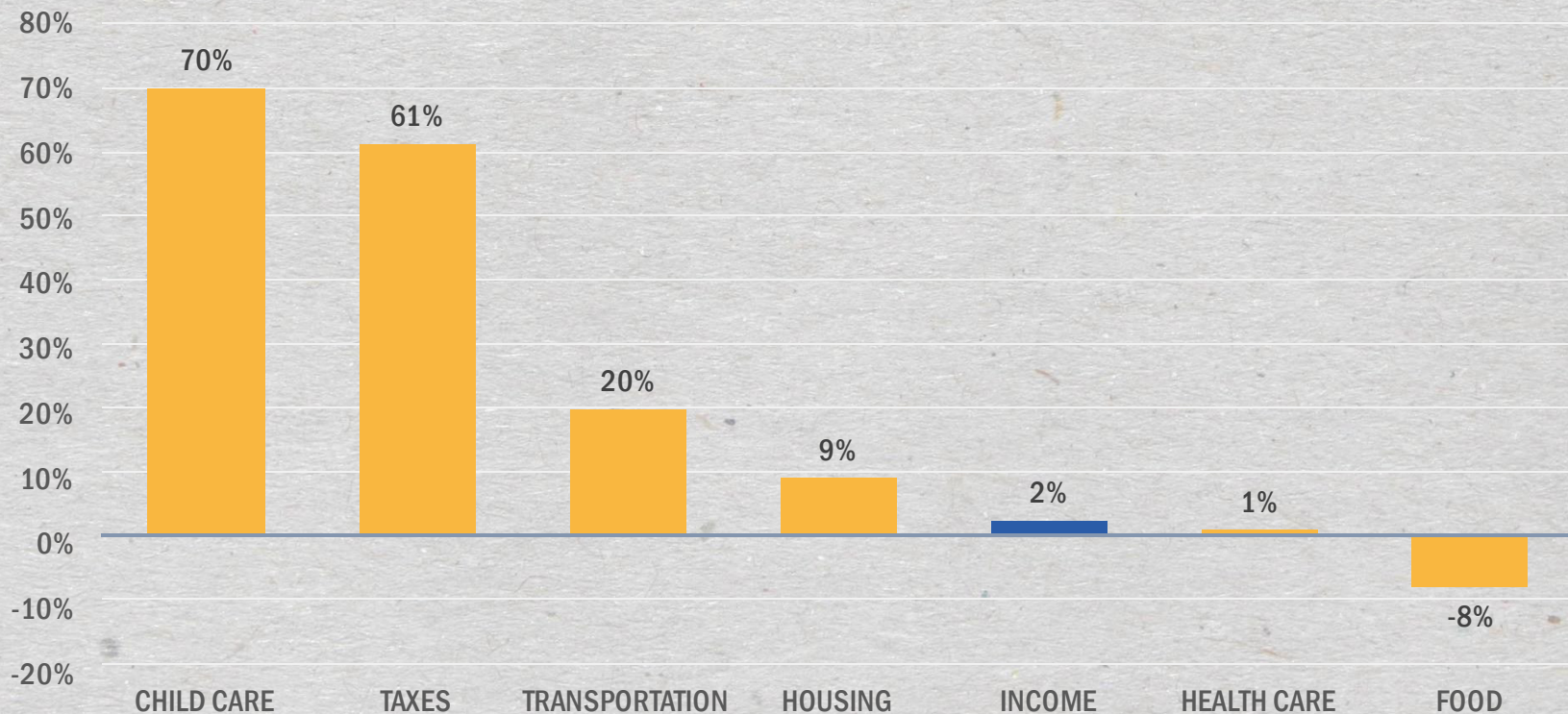
**Percent of Households Above Self-Sufficiency
in Multnomah County**



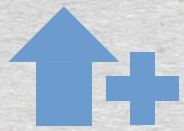
HOUSEHOLD EXPENSES ON THE RISE



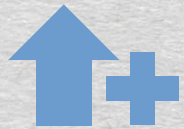

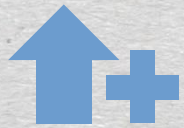
