


That date sounds fine, if it is still available.

I have a list of some ideas that I wanted to present the city Council, and so I wanted to sign up for another communication for a future date. Can I basically do that now or should I wait for each one to happen and then ask for a new slot?

My next one is a concept for reducing differential exposure to police stops. Differential exposure is the notion that poor people get hit by the police more because they live in areas of high 911 calls. Police stops in Oregon (And nationally) are primarily through traffic violation.

I'm proposing a "month of Jubilee" and which police officers in Portland would be directed not to write tickets for headlights or other vehicle violations, but to hand out a flyer listing cooperating auto parts and auto repair shops. Those shops would get a subsidy to lower the cost of lightbulbs, reflectors, and other improvements to bring the poorest population (And all citizens) into compliance with the law.

Police officers get to be "the good guys" by not have to into even write a repair ticket which requires follow up in court. They also get to increase the number of basic contact stops where they would cursorily check ID, registration, and insurance. They would inform the population that enforcement on these items will increase heavily after the month of Jubilee is over.

While there may be a temporary loss of revenue due to lower ticketing for one month, increased enforcement in the following month will bring in some extra, and Portland will be able to say that the function of police is to bring the population into compliance with the law, not to simply chase revenue by punishing.


Communications are the first item on the official agenda and we start at 9:30 a.m. You will have three minutes to address the Council but you may also submit written material, please provide seven copies.
