* Amend six grants with the Neighborhood District Coalitions for Community Collection to add funds and extend the term to June 30, 2019 for \$200,464 (Ordinance; amend Contract Nos. 32000456, 32000457, 32000458, 32000460, 32000461, 32000825)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. Since 1991, BPS has partnered with Metro to assist Portland neighborhood associations with Community Collection Events.
2. June 16, 2010, Ordinance No. 183885 authorized grants with the Neighborhood Coalitions.
3. In fiscal year 2015-2016, the program funds served over 4,560 households. Neighborhood association members and over 1,629 volunteers coordinated 58 collection events. In addition, volunteers helped 227 senior or disabled residents dispose of unwanted bulky waste. Materials collected included 316.16 tons of mixed solid waste, 42.84 tons of metal and 3.86 tons of plastics for recycling, plus 32 of the 58 events incorporated onsite reuse.
4. The amendment continues the program for neighborhood, community and nonprofit organizations to receive funds for collection events that help Portland residents reduce waste and promote the recycling of source-separated bulky materials that often accumulate and may otherwise be disposed inappropriately.
5. For these events, BPS provides organizations with financial assistance, helping to fund hauler equipment and labor, materials and supplies. In addition, BPS staff provides technical assistance to maximize the variety of materials collected for recycling and reuse at each event; neighborhood and community volunteers staff the events and utilize community partnerships to expand their efforts.
6. Neighborhood Coalitions receive funds from BPS to allocate to neighborhood associations and community organizations that serve communities of color, communities of faith and other grassroots initiatives.
7. The Neighborhood Coalitions are uniquely qualified to provide the desired services in the manner and structure required.
8. As a main partner and fiscal agent to neighborhood associations and community organizations, Neighborhood Coalition offices help BPS meet program goals. The services the Coalitions provide are important to the City because they provide the volunteer neighborhood association system and community organizations with support and offer a vital link between said groups and City government.

9. The amended cost of \$200,464 for the continuation of the program to June 30, 2019 is funded by the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability Solid Waste Management Fund (9PNSWR000013) and Metro Fund (GRANT ID PN000073) in FY 2016-17, FY 2017-18, and FY 2018-19.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Director of Bureau of Planning and Sustainability is authorized to execute amendments with each of the Neighborhood District Coalitions for purposes outlined in Section 1:

- b. The Director of Bureau of Planning and Sustainability is authorized to execute subsequent amendments that do not increase the City's performance obligations or financial risk.
- c. The Mayor and city Auditor hereby are authorized to pay for the contract from the 9PNSWR000013 and PN00730001 cost objects.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay in distributing funds will have a significant impact on scheduled Cleanup events held throughout the City. Therefore this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
