 PPB is currently responding to a large volume of crashes from Immigrants/ Refugees/New Portlanders (IRNP's)



Most are self-taught drivers and are not familiar with local laws
& not properly equipped to drive

- ODOT subsidy for driver's education only applies to students under 18 and is usually only taught in English
- IRNP's over the age of 18 do not have the opportunity to learn traffic safety with accessible training





It is estimated that 15% of hit and run suspects in Portland are IRNPs

Multnomah County Court in 2013:

- 8106 requests for interpreter service
- 17 different languages





Oregon Judicial Department & 2012 US Census Bureau Study indicate:

- 14 24% in Portland Metro Area actively speak a foreign language in their home
- As many as 17% were foreign born



They need to drive, because transportation options are severely limited in East Portland

Out of necessity for employment, many immigrants start driving in their early 20's – the majority unlicensed
