Purpose of proposed legislation and background information:

The City of Portland experienced severe winter weather from January 12th – 15th, 2017 resulting in significant snow accumulations and patches of ice throughout the City. Due to the severity of this storm, the Portland Bureau of Transportation (PBOT) sought additional resources from the Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) to expedite in plowing the streets and clearing downed trees from the roads.

SDOT provided a total of eleven trucks, materials and equipment, and fifteen crew members to help PBOT get the roads clear and keep Portland moving. The equipment included four heavy duty and four light duty plows, an aerial lift for downed tree removal, a wood chipper and a chain saw crew truck.

Financial and budgetary impacts:

\$140,459 for the 2016-2017 fiscal year. There is sufficient appropriation in PBOT's budget to reimburse the City of Seattle.

This legislation will result in a Memorandum of Agreement being executed between the City of Portland and the City of Seattle.

Community impacts and community involvement:

Community members who live and work in the City of Portland have been positively impacted by SDOT's generous offer of assistance. PBOT was able to quickly and efficiently respond to community concerns as they occurred throughout the severe weather conditions. Moreover, our community was able to safely navigate throughout the City and return to work/school in a timely manner.
