Purpose of proposed legislation and background information:

The Bureau of Environmental Services has sewer customers inside the Portland city limits who reside within Rockwood Water People's Utility District boundaries. BES requires individual customer water meter reading information in order to produce metered sewer billing for its customers in this area.

The Water Bureau has a long-standing Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) with Rockwood Water People's Utility District (Rockwood) for meter reading services in this overlapping area, and has existing systems and practices in place that enable efficient processing and information sharing in order for the City to accurately bill these customers for sewer and stormwater services.

This ordinance will authorize an IGA with Rockwood to continue this agreement. Rockwood will continue to read all City of Portland customer water meters located within Rockwood boundaries and provide the Water Bureau with weekly reports of the meters reads for use in its metered sewer billings on behalf of the Bureau of Environmental Services.

The Water Bureau is responsible for the billing and collection of all sewer and stormwater services and Rockwood is the only organization capable of providing this information to the City.

Financial and budgetary impacts:

The total cost of this Intergovernmental Agreement will not exceed \$305,000. Funding of \$40,000 is available in the FY 2017-18 Budget. Additional funding of \$50,000 will be requested for each

fiscal year through FY 2020-21, \$55,000 for FY 2021-22 and \$60,000 for FY 2022-23. The proposed action will not result in a change to staffing levels or to the forecast water rates.
