## ORDINANCE No.

\*Authorize a grant agreement with Coalition of Communities of Color for \$40,000 for the Portland United Against Hate Pilot Project to complete the first phase in developing the set of recommendations for a data system for community-facing organizations to collect/track/analyze hate incidents (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

## Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. In recent months, many community organizations report increasing incidents of hate crimes and intimidation, including bullying and violence stemming from racism, xenophobia, religious bigotry, anti-Semitism, Islamophobia, ableism, homophobia, transphobia, stigma, and misogyny. This affects every area of our lives, including our workplaces, schools, places of worship, healthcare facilities, the marketplace, and more. Coalition member organizations reject this hateful behavior.
- 2. This community initiated partnership is combining forces with the Office of Neighborhood Involvement (ONI), whose charge is to connect and support all Portlanders to work collaboratively with government to build inclusive, safe, and livable neighborhoods and communities. Community organizations look to ONI to collaborate in creating a robust response to the negative forces that undermine our city and community.
- 3. This bold and intentional collaboration is designed to protect communities from hate and proactively, create a strong base of support, provide the tools and resources to combat oppression, prosper economically and thrive collectively. Everyone and every community deserves a safe, prosperous, and peaceful life, a life free from hate and harassment. We recognize and honor our collective resilience and our right to nurture our communities from a place of compassion, security, and belonging.
- 4. This grant funding from the City of Portland is critical to ensure that this coalition of community groups can move forward in a focused manner. Coalition of Communities of Color will give sub-awards for the one-time pilot project to other community organizations as determined by the PUAH steering committee.
- 5. The FY2016-17 budget includes funding in the General Fund Special Appropriations for the above grant. The City now desires to make a grant to Coalition of Communities of Color in an amount not to exceed \$40,000.
- 6. The City's Comprehensive Financial Management Policies, FIN 2.04-Budget, states that grants should be issued after a competitive application process, unless Council waives the policy in the grant ordinance. These funds were allocated for this purpose as a Special Appropriation and approved by Council in the FY2016-17 Spring BMP.

## NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a grant agreement, as outlined in a form substantially in accordance with the agreement attached as Exhibit A, at a cost not to exceed \$40,000.
- b. The City Council waives the competitive application process required in FIN 2.04-Budget.
- c. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to draw and deliver payment chargeable to the Fiscal Year 2016-17 Budget.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay in funding would delay Coalition of Communities of Color's ability to reach their 2016-17 strategic goals to develop the first phase of the PUAH Project; therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by Council.
