

## **ORDINANCE No. 188447**

\*Authorize an Intergovernmental Agreement with Portland State University to provide funding for a State of Urban Manufacturing Survey (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

### **Section 1. The Council finds:**

1. The Portland Region has strong traded sector economic activity, which drives household prosperity; manufacturing is a key component of regional traded sector economic growth.
2. Portland's manufacturing and industrial job base is critical for maintaining and increasing prosperity through the preservation and creation of middle and high wage jobs and entrepreneurship opportunities across all industrial and employment districts in Portland for people without college degrees who made up 45% of the adult population of Portland in 2015.
3. Global trends have put increasing pressure on local manufacturing businesses to maintain economic competitiveness.
4. The success of manufacturing and industrial businesses in the local economy shapes the income distribution and economic equity of the local and regional population. This research project with Portland State University will further identify the needs and opportunities to support equitable economic prosperity and advance goals and policies of the 2035 Comprehensive Plan and the 2015-2020 Portland Development Commission Strategic Plan.
5. The City is collaborating with Portland State University to further economic development goals of the City of Portland and the Portland Region. A survey of Portland based manufacturing business will provide valuable information on manufacturing business trends, needs and opportunities that will inform future decisions on programs, plans, regulations and infrastructure investments that can better support local manufacturers
6. Increased coordination between local government, educational institutions, industrial district organizations, and business support and workforce service providers for manufacturing businesses through this survey and research project will advance equitable economic outcomes.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to execute an intergovernmental grant agreement with Portland State University in a form substantially similar to the agreement attached as Exhibit 1.
- b. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to pay for this grant chargeable to the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability, Cost Object PNCP000001.

- c. The Director of the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability is hereby authorized to sign amendments for continuing data management, reporting and funding in future fiscal years if appropriations are approved by City Council.
- d. This IGA with Portland State University builds on recent research conducted by University faculty and ongoing coordination between research partners at the University and the City of Portland. The City Council waives the competitive application process required in FIN 2.04 – Budget.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists in order to forward funds for services to continue work that benefits the City. Therefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
