- Suspended in 2015
- Previous code referenced in Administrative Rule

Pedicab & Quadricycle 16.40.500

- Suspended in 2015
- Previous code referenced in Administrative Rule



Executive Town Car

- Revised Executive Town
 Car definition
- Executive Town Car vehicle list (Administrative Rule)
- Advisory Committee can recommend additional vehicle models



Shuttles

- Shuttles definition redefined into two categories;
- Fixed Route / Fixed Schedule
 - Recurring scheduled stops
- Reservation / On-demand
 - Can be reserved ahead of time
 - Available on-demand at PDX and train station



Company Operating Responsibilities

- Requires all companies to institute anti-discrimination policies
- Policies will be reviewed and approved by the Bureau





Vehicle Age Exemption

- Two year exemption for qualified vehicles over 10 years of age
- Applicable to LPT, Executive Town Cars, and qualified WAVs
 - Vehicle must meet all appearance, mechanical and DEQ requirements



Seasonal Permits

Qualified services can obtain a four-month seasonal permit







Accessible Service

Challenges

- Insufficient number of wheelchair accessible vehicles
- Longer wait times for on demand service
- Customer service levels
- Higher cost to operate wheelchair accessible vehicles
- Less desirable for drivers due to lower income potential



Accessible Service

Goals


- Increase accessibility of private for-hire WAV services
- Decrease wait times
- Elevate the standard of customer service
 - Passenger Assistance Sensitivity and Safety (P.A.S.S.)
- Off-set vehicle operating/maintenance costs
- Attract more drivers with earning incentives



Accessible Transportation Fund

Pilot Period

- Route calls for WAV service through a central WAV dispatch service
- Dispatch those calls to approved companies; standard rotation
 - Consumers may still request a ride from their preferred provider
- Dispatch provider will monitor and track all WAV rides
- Participating companies will receive a subsidy for each fulfilled WAV ride
- Companies can use funds to offset cost and to provide driver incentives







Accessible Transportation Fund

Pilot Period (cont.)

- Proposed subsidy of \$15 per WAV ride
- Currently average, 1,200 rides per month
- Estimated increase to 1,600 rides per month
- Estimated budget, \$600,000 for first year (includes dispatch service)
- Program entirely funded through existing Private for-Hire \$.50 ride surcharge
