

ORDINANCE No. 188502

*Authorize a contract with Applied Technical Systems, Inc. to provide telecommunications cabling and related services not to exceed \$2,500,000 (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. The Office of Management and Finance, Bureau of Technology Services (BTS) is responsible for the support and upkeep of the City's telecommunications systems. This includes moving desk sets, lines, and associated equipment, including monitors and printers from one location to another, between floors and/or buildings, and completing telecommunications installations to support office moves and reorganizations. This work also includes installing structured cabling systems to support high speed voice and data communications, installing miscellaneous telecommunications lines and hardware, and installing, designating, programming, and testing telephones.
2. City demand for these services has increased as the City prepares for staff relocation prior to the Portland Building renovation.
3. BTS requires additional support to assist with the current volume of telecommunication system moves.
4. In accordance with City Code 5.33.160, the City may participate in Permissive Cooperative Procurements to establish contracts or price agreements for the acquisition of goods or services. Multnomah County has entered into an agreement with Applied Technical Systems, Inc. for these services. This agreement allows other governmental agencies to utilize the agreement for such services.
5. Applied Technical Systems, Inc. has a current City of Portland business license tax account, is in compliance with the Equal Benefits Program and EEO Certification. Applied Technical Systems, Inc. is not a State Certified D/M/W/ESB firm. The Bureau's level of confidence for this agreement is optimal.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Chief Procurement Officer is authorized to execute a contract with Applied Technical Systems, Inc. for telecommunications cabling and related services for a contractual total not to exceed \$2,500,000, provided the agreement has been approved as to form by the City Attorney's office.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists as a delay in proceeding with executing this contract may result in additional expenses and delay in telecommunications system maintenance and upkeep; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
