PORTLAND HOUSING BUREAU Dan Saltzman, Commissioner Kurt Creager, Director This 61-unit apartment community planned for Multnomah County property in the Eliot neighborhood will leverage 40 Project-Based Section 8 vouchers from Home Forward to serve very low- and low-income families, with priority given to longtime and displaced residents of the North and Northeast Portland.

When completed, the four-story N. Williams Center will form a "U" shape around a landscaped courtyard. Other site features include community gardens, a children's area, a chicken coop, and gathering spaces for residents. Stacked units and surface lot parking contribute to the project's highly efficient design.

BRIDGE Housing Corporation intends to retain the nonprofit service organization Albertina Kerr, a current site occupant, to continue providing art and garden programs for the developmentally disabled and expand programming to residents. Up to 10 units may be reserved for income-qualifying families with a developmentally disabled member of their household. In addition, BRIDGE will layer in supportive services intended to increase the financial security of residents and help them maintain successful tenancies. The community focus of this development, combined with supportive services, is consistent with the stated community priorities captured in the N/NE Neighborhood Housing Strategy.
