## ORDINANCE NO. 188517

\* Apply for and accept a grant in the amount of \$445,680 from the Oregon Department of Transportation and appropriate \$225,000 for reimbursement for the 2017-19 Work Zone Enforcement Program grant (Ordinance)

## The City of Portland ordains:

## Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) Transportation Safety Division notified the City that it will award a grant in the amount of \$445,680.
- 2. The Portland Police Bureau wishes the City to apply for and accept the ODOT Transportation Safety Division Work Zone Enforcement Program grant for Fiscal Years 2017-19.
- 3. The ODOT project will fund overtime for the Police Bureau Traffic Division to provide high visibility and high contact enforcement efforts while on patrol in identified ODOT work zones.
- 4. ODOT reimburses officer overtime at a rate of \$68.10 per hour and sergeant overtime at a rate of \$75.30 per hour for activities specified toward this grant program.
- 5. Local match in the amount of \$51,010 is required by matching straight-time hours, which will be funded by existing bureau General Fund appropriations during the grant period.
- 6. The effective grant period is July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2019.
- 7. The Council declares an emergency exists so as not to unnecessarily delay the City's ability to perform the activities authorized by the grant.

## NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to make application to the Oregon Department of Transportation for a grant in the amount of \$445,680.
- b. The Mayor is authorized to provide such information and assurances as are required for the grant period.
- c. The Mayor is hereby authorized to accept on behalf of the City of Portland the subsequent grant award in the amount of \$445,680 from the Oregon Department of Transportation for the 2017-19 Work Zone Enforcement Program.

d. With the acceptance of the grant award, the FY 2017-18 Budget will be amended as follows:

**GRANTS FUND** 

Fund - 217

Business Area - PL

Bureau Program Expenses - \$225,000

- The Office of Management & Finance Grants Management Division is authorized to e. perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement from the grantor, and to submit required online grant documents on the Mayor's behalf.
- The Chief of the Police Bureau of the City of Portland is authorized to accept on f. behalf of the City of Portland any subsequent modifications by ODOT for the 2017-19 Work Zone Enforcement Program, provided such modifications do not increase the City of Portland's financial obligation or risk. Any modifications that increase the City of Portland's financial obligation or risk must be authorized by the Portland City Council.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists so as not to unnecessarily delay the City's ability to perform the activities authorized by the grant. Therefore this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
