Introduction: We want to ground our work in asset-based community development. - 1. What changes did you see in your city and/or neighborhood that contribute to a positive or negative community experience?
- 2. Are community services in your city and/or neighborhood adequate? If not, what is missing? (Community services can include: recreation activities, social services, parks programs, etc.)
- 3. What economic development activities would you like to see in your city and/or neighborhood? (Economic development can include: job training, job creation, microenterprise projects, improvements to business store fronts, etc.)
- 4. What improvements projects do you think are needed in your community? (Infrastructure improvements include: more lighting, street improvements, sidewalks, pedestrian crossings, park projects, etc.)
- 5. Do you know of anyone who has experienced barriers to housing choice or housing discrimination? How does this impact the community as a whole?
- 6. Given our discussion of community services, economic development, infrastructure improvements, and housing choice, what are your top priorities? Why?
- 7. If you could change one thing in your city and/or neighborhood, what would it be?
