




The school districts are maintaining their obligation to provide one full time equivalent arts teacher for every 500 K-5 students




The Revenue Division continues to improve administration and collection of the tax.




The tax generates about \$10 million per year, \$2 million short of initial expectations.




The Regional Arts and Culture Council has increased the number of organizations receiving grants funded by the Arts tax.




The 5% expenditure cap will be exceeded.



Meeting the 5% expenditure cap would undermine the tax and defeat its purpose.



Arts Tax Committee membership is almost 100% new. All the original committee members' terms have expired.



Committee Recommendations

- 1. The committee supports the Revenue Division's recommendation for changes to the 5% expenditure cap.
- 2. The committee recommends that the Council establish an expectation that each school district will produce a state of the arts report documenting the impact of the arts tax funds.
