## **ORDINANCE No.** 188596

\*Authorize a contract with CenturyLink Communications, LLC for public safety telecommunications related equipment, services, and maintenance, for a five-year contractual total not to exceed \$10,000,000 (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

## Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The Bureau of Technology Services is responsible for the operation and maintenance of the City's telecommunications networks.
- 2. CenturyLink Communications, LLC (CenturyLink) provides the network for E911 (Emergency) services for Multnomah County and the City of Portland. The network for E911 services interfaces to the on-site equipment that is used by the City's call takers and dispatchers. This equipment provides call distribution and processing of all 9-1-1 and non-emergency calls made within Multnomah County. CenturyLink also provides skilled technicians that are specifically trained on the on-site 9-1-1 equipment and software.
- 3. The State of Oregon, Office of Emergency Management, (OEM) also obtains Public Safety telecommunications related equipment and services for the City's 9-1-1 Center under this contract. The majority of the equipment, services, and maintenance costs are paid directly by the State OEM office through collected 9-1-1 funds. Peripheral equipment, components, or services not covered by State funding are paid by the City of Portland.
- 4. On August 15, 2007 Council passed Ordinance 181224 authorizing City contract No. 41108 with CenturyLink (formerly Qwest Interprise America) for public safety telecommunications related equipment, services, maintenance and support. That contract is nearing the end of its ten-year term, and needs to be replaced.
- 5. Portland City Code 5.33.220(D)(12) allows for the City to directly enter into a contract for information technology hardware or software maintenance, upgrades, subscriptions, and licenses from the City's current provider in order to utilize the pre-existing knowledge of the vendor regarding the specifics of the City's system.

## NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Chief Procurement Officer is authorized to execute a contract for public safety telecommunications related equipment, services, and maintenance with CenturyLink Communications, LLC for a contractual total not to exceed \$10,000,000 for the initial term of five years, provided the contract has been approved as to form by the City Attorney's Office.
- Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay in proceeding with

this contract may result in additional expense and delay in providing critical public safety telecommunication services; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by Council.
