Purpose of proposed legislation and background information:

Homelessness is a humanitarian crisis which threatens the dignity and safety of very vulnerable people in our community. The City, Multnomah County, and Home Forward share a long history of partnership in the fight against homelessness and will be partnering to create 2,000 additional supportive housing units by 2028. The Corporation for Supportive Housing (CSH), a national leader in the field of affordable housing and homelessness, has projected a need for 2,800 new supportive housing units in Multnomah County.

Financial and budgetary impacts:

This Resolution directs the creation of a plan to bring 2,000 additional units of supportive housing to our community by the end of 2028. That work will require significant resources, which will be evaluated and detailed in the plan this Resolution directs. Future budget needs will be proposed to the City Council as part of its annual budget process and as it makes decisions about purchases pursuant to the affordable housing bond.

Development of the plan directed by this Resolution will be jointly funded by the City of Portland and Multhomah County. A funding request of between \$25,000 and \$50,000 will be considered as part of the Fall BMP.

Community impacts and community involvement:

This investment will serve the most vulnerable in our community. This Resolution was drafted in partnership with Multnomah County and other community partners.
