Legislation title: Enhance community service opportunities and strengthen the transparency and accountability of City advisory bodies (Resolution)

Purpose of proposed legislation and background information:

The City of Portland has over 100 boards, commissions, and committees that provide valuable guidance to City bureaus and the Council on a wide variety of issues. However, the City does not have a way to ensure that City staff who manage those bodies and the members who serve are appropriately trained on their obligations. Basic transparency measures, such as mandatory conflict of interest disclosure forms, are not required as a standard practice. The City also does not have a comprehensive database of active advisory bodies. In May, Council adopted Resolution No. 37285, directing that standard policies and procedures be developed. This Resolution directs the implementation of those updates, which will increase the integrity and impact of advisory body recommendations and give both staff and members greater confidence in the value of their service. These updates also build on the City's Public Involvement Principles adopted in 2010.

Financial and budgetary impacts:

This Resolution directs the implementation of standard policies and procedures for the creation and administration of City advisory bodies. An attached memo from the Director of the Office of Neighborhood Involvement anticipates a budget request in FY 2018-19 to support implementation.

Community impacts and community involvement:

Gaps in the City's management of advisory bodies have been identified by both City staff and community members. The updates proposed in this Resolution will have the effect of increasing access to opportunities for service, enhancing the transparency and accountability of advisory body work, and ensuring that both staff and members are appropriately trained on the rules governing their service.

VII. Communications

Members agree that transparency is essential to all deliberations. In that regard:

- Members are requested to copy [both] the City staff liaison [and Facilitator] on all communications from/to interest groups (other than a group specifically represented by a member) commenting on the Body's deliberations. These communications will be included in the public record as detailed below and copied to the full Body as appropriate.
- While not precluded from communicating with the media, members agree to generally defer to the Bureau liaison to field and route all media communications related to the Body's processes and recommendations.
- Members agree to not negotiate through the media, or to use the media to undermine the work of the Body.
- Members agree to raise all their concerns, especially those being raised for the first time, at a meeting and not in or through the media.
