

ORDINANCE No. 188683

*Accept and appropriate a grant in the amount of \$68,275 from Meyer Memorial Trust for Willamette Floodplain Streamlined Monitoring Framework (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds

1. The Willamette River is the 19th largest river in the United States, drains over 11,400 miles² of land representing 12% of the total landmass of Oregon, and serves as home to over 2.5 million Oregonians, and empties into the Columbia River in the City of Portland.
2. The City of Portland has many efforts dedicated to improvements in the Willamette River including River Renaissance, Portland Harbor Superfund, and the Central City 2035 planning effort.
3. It is a goal of the Bureau of Environmental Services (BES) to help protect public health, water quality, and the numerous federally-listed threatened species in the Willamette River.
4. Major improvements to BES's systems for managing wastewater, storm water runoff and riverine habitat have made the Willamette River cleaner and safer for recreation, fish and wildlife.
5. To ensure the ongoing success of these past and future investments, BES works collaboratively with other partners in the Willamette River including other municipalities, state and federal agencies, and academic institutions.
6. Along with project partners University of Oregon, US Geological Service and Bonneville Environmental Foundation, the City, through BES, applied to Meyer Memorial Trust for a grant in the amount of \$160,695 for Willamette Floodplain Streamlined Monitoring Framework on June 15, 2017.
7. Meyer Memorial Trust has notified the City and its project partners that that the Trust will award three grants for the Willamette Floodplain Streamlined Monitoring Framework. Grants will be awarded to the City in the amount of \$68,275, to the University of Oregon in the amount of \$45,000, and to the Bonneville Environmental Foundation in the amount of \$47,420, for a project total of \$160,695.
8. This funding will be used to standardize monitoring efforts throughout the Willamette River to ensure consistent investments in future restoration and to inform adaptive management throughout the entire Willamette River that will benefit Portland by further ensuring that the Willamette River is cleaner and healthier by the time it reaches Portland.

NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to accept on behalf of the City of Portland a grant from the Meyer Memorial Trust for the Willamette Floodplain Streamlined Monitoring Framework in the amount of \$68,275 and to execute the grant agreement.
- b. The FY 2017/2018 budget is hereby amended as follows:

GRANTS FUND

Fund - 217

Business Area – ES

Bureau Program Expenses – \$32,000

- c. The Office of Management & Finance Grants Management Division is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement from the grantor, and to submit required online grant documents on the Mayor's behalf.
- d. The Director of Bureau of Environmental Services is authorized to accept on behalf of the City any subsequent modifications by Meyer Memorial Trust for Willamette Floodplain Streamlined Monitoring Framework grant, award number 17070701 provided such modifications do not increase the City's financial obligation or risk. Any modifications that increase the City's financial obligation or risk must be authorized by the Council.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay would unnecessarily delay the City's ability to perform the activities authorized by the grant. Therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.




