Two Trust Funds:

- 1. Urban Forestry Fund
- 2. Tree Planting and Preservation Fund



Urban Forestry Fund

Generated from:

 Penalty fees from code enforcement actions involving City or Street Trees

Funds may be used to:

- Replace, establish, maintain City or Street Trees illegally removed or damaged;
- Plant, establish, maintain City or Street Trees;
- Fund education, outreach, technical assistance; and
- Fund other forestry-related activities or programs.

Tree Planting and Preservation Fund

Generated from:

- Mitigation fees paid under development and nondevelopment tree permits
- Penalty fees regarding private trees
- Voluntary contributions

Funds may be used to:

- Plant trees on public or private property (including streets)
 in the same watershed where collected;
- Purchase conservation easements for perpetual retention of trees and tree canopy; and
- Acquire land to permanently protect existing trees.
