ORDINANCE No.

*Authorize a subrecipient grant agreement to the Organizing People/Activating Leaders in the amount of \$20,302 for FY 2017/18, FY18/19 and FY19/20 for the SmartTrips, Smart Cities Transportation Demand Management program (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- The City of Portland is the recipient of \$669,602 funding passed through Metro Regional Transportation Options (RTO) Program from the Federal Transit Administration ("FTA") Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) and Surface Transportation Program (STP) grant funds from July 1, 2017 to December 31, 2019.
- 2. The RTO Program is designed to manage demand on the transportation system and increasing use of travel options. The Bureau of Transportation (PBOT) Active Transportation & Safety Division program, SmartTrips, Smart Cities TDM programs will develop, implement, and analyze an individualized marketing initiative, a series of guided walks and bike rides and clinic, and an open streets program to bring robust active transportation opportunities to community-led events.
- 3. A key component of the SmartTrips, Smart Cities project is a partnership with Organizing People/Activating Leaders (OPAL) for \$20,302 from July 1, 2017 to December 31, 2019. This partnership will increase the project's ability to reach traditionally under-represented groups that the City of Portland is striving to provide opportunities to engage in active transportation. By combining City of Portland's demonstrated success in transportation demand management programs and OPAL's skills engaging underserved communities, the project will equitably provide opportunities for active transportation throughout the city.
- 4. The Bureau's level of confidence in the cost estimates for this project is 100%.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. That the Commissioner-in-Charge is hereby authorized to execute agreements with OPAL in the amount described above in accordance with the Subrecipient Agreement attached as Exhibit A.
- The City Council waives the competitive application process required in FIN 2.04 Budget.
- c. That the Commissioner is hereby authorized to draw and deliver warrants chargeable to PBOT operating fund budget when demand is presented and approved by the proper authority.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because delay in funding will interrupt the ability of OPAL to provide the project deliverables; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
