ORDINANCE No. 188747

*Authorize a grant agreement with Causa Oregon in an amount not to exceed \$50,000 to support DREAMers and urge Congress to continue the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals program and to pass the DREAM Act (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. Causa Oregon is Latino immigrant rights organization funded in 1915 by farmworkers, Latinos, immigrants, and allies in order to defeat ballot measures that would have negatively impacted the lives of Latino families in Oregon.
- Causa Oregon is a fiscal sponsor for the Oregon DACA Coalition, on behalf of DREAMers, for whom the DACA application fee presented a financial hardship, and for legal services.
- 3. On March 22, 2017, the City of Portland reaffirmed its status as a Sanctuary City, one that welcomes and embraces diversity and is committed to protecting and supporting immigrant and refugee communities.
- 4. The City of Portland strongly opposes the decision to rescind DACA, and proudly stands with all DREAMers who call the United States home.
- On October 5, 2017, the City of Portland passed Resolution No. 37320 to declare support for DREAMers and urge Congress to continue the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals program and to pass the DREAM Act.
- 6. The FY2017-18 budget includes funding in the General Fund Special Appropriations for the above grant. The City now desires to make a grant to Causa Oregon in an amount not to exceed \$50,000.
- 7. The City's Comprehensive Financial Management Policies, FIN 2.04-Budget, states that grants should be issued after a competitive application process, unless Council waives the policy in the grant ordinance. The budget for this grant was approved in Fall Bump for FY17-18 with resolution No. 37320 for the above grantee; a competitive application process was not implemented for this grant.

NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a grant agreement, as outlined in a form substantially in accordance with the agreement attached as Exhibit A, at a cost not to exceed \$50,000.

- b. The City Council waives the competitive application process required in FIN 2.04-Budget.
- The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to draw and deliver payment C. chargeable to the Fiscal Year 2017-18 Budget.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay in funding would delay Causa Oregon ability to continue providing services to the DREAMers; therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by Council.
