**ORDINANCE No.**

\*Authorize a grant agreement with Dress for Success Oregon not to exceed \$50,000 for their Reach East program for pre and post-employment support to women east of 82<sup>nd</sup> Ave (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. Dress for Success' mission, is to empower women to achieve economic independence by providing a network of support, professional attire and development tools to help women succeed in work and life. Dress for success serves a wide variety of women including veterans, single mothers, women struggling to find work, transgender women, and women with educational backgrounds ranging from high-school drop-outs to PhD's.
2. Dress for Success seeks to address the issues of unemployment and under-employment among low-income women on the east side of Portland. Their objective is to expand outreach and services east of 82<sup>nd</sup> avenue. Providing job training, job retention, and access to the suiting program and professional women's group. Through their Fast Track and Hope programs, Dress for Success Oregon will provide individualized information that helps women maintain and advance in employment and work toward achieving a living wage.
3. Dress for Success begins with the premise that women are not yet fully integrated into our economic, social, political or financial fabric and seek strategies to weave women's empowerment and leadership into our community, one woman at a time.


NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a grant agreement, with Dress for Success Oregon, as outlined in a form substantially in accordance with agreement attached as Exhibit A, at a cost not to exceed \$50,000.
- b. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to draw and deliver payment chargeable to Fiscal Year 2017-2018 Budget.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay in funding could result in a delay in services; therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by Council.


