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Ordinance No. 17271. ✓

An Ordinance granting permission to Mrs. James Phillips and her son to sell Indian bead work on the streets of the City of Portland without the payment of a license fee.

The City of Portland does ordain as follows:

Section 1: That permission be and is hereby granted to Mrs. James Phillips and her son to sell Indian bead work on the streets of the City of Portland, without the payment of a license fee until January 1, 1908, for the reason that she is an Iroquois Indian and exempt under the National laws from paying a license.
