## Tree Preservation and Removal in Development Situations

### Title 11, Trees Framework for tree preservation and removal

#### **Development Situations (11.50)**

#### Current

- Trigger=Ground disturbance associated with a building or other development permit. Does not matter where ground disturbance is located.
- Exemptions for small sites, high building coverage sites, high intensity zones, dead dying dangerous trees, and others.
- Must preserve at least 1/3 of nonexempt trees. No replacement required.
- **Result=**As many as 2/3 of non-exempt trees can be removed with the development permit, **regardless of location of ground disturbance**.

#### Non-Development Situations (11.40) Current

- **Trigger=** Request for removal of a tree, when not associated with a development permit.
- Removal *may* be permitted depending on health, species, size, number and location of tree. In some cases, factors such as practical alternatives, economic, ecologic and community concerns are considered.
- Replacement is required.

## **Proposed Amendment-Summary**

- Trees subject to Development Situation regulations <u>only</u> if ground disturbance <u>impacts</u> at least one tree.
- Impact=Disturbance within the Root Protection Zone (defined, 1 foot radius/1 inch of tree diameter).
- If there is not an impact to at least one tree, removal of any tree is subject to regulations for trees in Non-Development Situations. A permit outside of the development process through Parks Urban Forestry is required. (Chapter 11.40)

# **Proposed Amendment-Results**

- Removal of trees cannot occur with the development if there is no impact to a tree's root protection zone.
- Anticipated that less trees will be removed through the development process. In addition, trees removed through a non-development permit will be replaced.

# **Other Amendments**

- Codifies that tree removal allowed through a development permit cannot occur until that permit is issued.
- Clarifies that tree plans are required for every development permit to verify which trees are or are not approved for removal.
- Codifies administrative review and appeal procedures (Administrative Review by BDS Director or City Forester, as appropriate, with appeal to Code Hearings Officer).
