ORDINANCE No. 1 8 8 8 4 2

Update Auditor Code to conform to May 2017 Charter amendments that protect the Auditor's independence and add a duty; amend Auditor Code following passage of new state law that preserves City's privilege when information is disclosed to Auditor for the purposes of an audit or investigation (Ordinance; amend Code Chapters 2.12, 2.14, 3.05, 3.21 and 3.77)

The City of Portland Ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. In a special election held on May 16, 2017, voters approved ballot Measure 26-189, with the title caption "Amends Charter: Increases Auditor's independence from audited agencies, adds duty."
- 2. The amendments to the Charter in Measure 26-189 enabled the Office of the City Auditor to make its own decisions about human resources and procurement, as well as obtain independent legal advice.
- 3. The amendments to the Charter in Measure 26-189 incorporated the role of the City Ombudsman, which previously had existed only in City Code.
- 4. The amendments to the Charter in Measure 26-189 granted the Auditor's Charter-based accountability functions Audit Services and the Ombudsman access to confidential and legally privileged information and records so long as privilege is not waived to third parties.
- To protect the City's legally privileged information and records from outside disclosure when they are obtained by the Auditor's accountability functions, the City successfully sought statutory protection through Senate Bill 890, which Governor Kate Brown signed into law on June 29, 2017.
- The Auditor's Code-based accountability functions Independent Police Review, Lobbyist Registration and Political Consultant programs – similarly require full access to City records and information to effectively perform investigations.
- 7. Resolution 37175 asked all City offices to assess whether gender-specific language in policies and procedures should be eliminated and replaced with gender-neutral language.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a) Code Chapters 2.12 and 2.14 are amended as shown in Exhibit A.
- b) Code Section 3.05 is amended as shown in Exhibit B.
- c) Code Section 3.21 is amended as shown in Exhibit C.
- d) Code Section 3.77 is amended as shown in Exhibit D.

Section 2. Council hereby declares that if any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance, or the code amendments it adopts, is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional, that shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the Portland City Code.
