ORDINANCE NO. 176235

*Accept a \$276,356 grant from Department of the Treasury, Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms for the Gang Resistance Education and Training program. (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The Department of Treasury, Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms is continuing funding of the Gang Resistance Education and Training (GREAT Program) in the City of Portland for 2002 pursuant to Cooperative Agreement No. ATC020181. The G.R.E.A.T program originally started in 1992 and uses local law enforcement personnel to educate youth about the dangers associated with joining street gangs.
- 2. The Portland Police Bureau will continue to work with local middle and junior high schools to schedule classes to instruct students on the dangers of gangs in accordance with the GREAT program lesson plans. The grant will reimburse for the costs incurred for Officer's time, training expenses, printed materials, administrative expenses and promotional materials related to the GREAT Program.
- 3. The period of performance begins January 16, 2002 and ends January 15, 2003 unless otherwise terminated or extended.
- 4. No match is required. Indirect is not allowed.

NOW, therefore, the Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is authorized to sign the cooperative agreement between the Department of Treasury Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms and the City of Portland.
- b. An increase in appropriation for FY 01-02 and transfer of funds for the grant award is authorized as follows:

The Council declares that an emergency exists in that any delay in the enactment of this ordinance would cause the city to miss the opportunity to accept the grant and delay gang resistance education within the City of Portland; therefore, this ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
