ORDINANCE No. 188881

*Accept a grant in the amount of \$112,500 from Metro for the Rossi Farms Development Plan and authorize an Intergovernmental Agreement (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds

- 1. Bureau of Planning and Sustainability applied to Metro for a grant in the amount of \$112,500 for The Rossi Farms Development Plan on June 21, 2017 (Ordinance 188470).
- 2. Metro has notified the City of Portland that it will award a grant for the Rossi Farms Development Plan to the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability in the amount of \$112,500.
- 3. A total match of \$50,000 includes \$30,000 provided by the General Fund from the Planning Program, PNCP000001 in the FY 2018-19 Bureau of Planning and Sustainability Budget and a match in the amount of \$20,000 from the Rossi/Giusto/Garre families. BPS match will be in the form of salary, benefits, and payroll taxes.

NOW, THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- The Mayor is hereby authorized to accept on behalf of the City of Portland a grant from Metro for the Rossi Farms Development Plan in the amount of \$112,500 and to execute an intergovernmental agreement in a form similar to the agreement attached as Attachment 1.
- b. The Office of Management & Finance Grants Office is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement from the grantor, and to submit required online grant documents on the Mayor's behalf.
- The Director of the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability of the City of Portland is authorized to accept on behalf of the City of Portland any subsequent modifications by Metro for the Rossi Farms Development Plan grant, award number 935015, provided such modifications do not increase the City of Portland's financial obligation or risk. Any modifications that increase the City of Portland's financial obligation or risk must be authorized by the Portland City Council.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay would unnecessarily delay the City's ability to perform the activities authorized by the grant. Therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
