## ORDINANCE No. 1 8 8 8 9 3

\* Accept and appropriate the FY 2017 Urban Areas Security Initiative Grant in the amount of \$2,496,835 from the Oregon Office of Emergency Management to enhance emergency preparedness through planning, training and equipping emergency responders in the Portland Urban Area. (Ordinance).

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The Department of Homeland Security provides financial assistance to selected urban areas through its Urban Areas Security Initiative (UASI) Grant Program. The City of Portland, in conjunction with regional partners (TriMet, Port of Portland, Multnomah, Clackamas, Washington and Columbia Counties of Oregon and Clark County, Washington) applied for financial assistance to address the unique equipment, training, planning, exercise and operational needs of this large urban area.
- 2. The Department of Homeland Security has designated Portland, Oregon as the core urban area in the State of Oregon. The City of Portland will be eligible for a portion of the \$2,496,835 available to our regional metropolitan area.
- 3. Funds will be used and dedicated for equipment, training, planning and exercises planned and executed through the Regional Disaster Preparedness Organization (RDPO), for which the City of Portland is a core member. The RDPO has completed a regional strategy to guide the use of federal homeland security grant funds in the Portland Urban Area. The Portland Bureau of Emergency Management (PBEM) will administer the Grant for the region.
- 4. There are no financial match requirements for this Grant.

## NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to accept on behalf of the City of Portland, a grant from the Department of Homeland Security Urban Areas Security Initiative Grant Program, from the Oregon Office of Emergency Management in the amount of \$2,496,835 and to execute the grant agreement.
- b. The FY 2017/2018 budget is hereby amended as follows:

**GRANT FUNDS** 

Fund - 217

Business Area – EM00

Bureau Program Expenses - \$2,496,835

- c. The Office of Management and Finance Grants Office is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement from the grantor, and to submit required online grant documents on the Mayor's behalf.
- d. The Director of Portland Bureau of Emergency Management of the City of Portland is authorized to accept on behalf of the City of Portland any subsequent modifications by

the Oregon Office of Emergency Management for the Department of Homeland Security, FY 2017 Urban Areas Security Initiative Grant, grant number 17-170, provided such modifications do not increase the City of Portland's financial obligations or risk. Any modifications that increase the City of Portland's financial obligation or risk must be authorized by the Portland City Council.

e. The Director of the Portland Bureau of Emergency Management of the City of Portland may execute Intergovernmental Agreements and amendments to these Intergovernmental agreements with TriMet, Port of Portland, Multnomah, Clackamas, Washington and Columbia Counties of Oregon and Clark County, Washington, related to UASI 2017, grant no.17-170.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay would unnecessarily delay the City's ability to perform the activities authorized by the grant. Therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by Council.
