

ORDINANCE No.

188934

*Amend Intergovernmental Agreement with Oregon Department of Environmental Quality for the funding of Portland Harbor Stormwater Source Control Coordination not to exceed \$90,000 (Ordinance; amend Contract No. 30004707)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. The Council has designated the Bureau of Environmental Services (BES) as the City's lead representative for the Portland Harbor Superfund Site. BES is coordinating this work with multiple other City programs
2. An important part of the Superfund work is identifying sources of contamination discharged to the City's stormwater conveyance system and ultimately to the Willamette River and its sediments and eliminating those sources to prevent future recontamination.
3. The City has been working closely with DEQ to develop a comprehensive stormwater management plan for Portland Harbor, and has funded a DEQ Portland Harbor Stormwater Source Control Coordinator through an Intergovernmental Agreement. The Intergovernmental Agreement provides DEQ with resources to evaluate and control stormwater discharged from Portland Harbor upland industrial sites to the City stormwater conveyance system and the Willamette River. DEQ costs include personnel services, services and supplies and DEQ indirect costs.
4. The Intergovernmental Agreement was initially authorized by Ordinance 178748, passed by Council on September 15, 2004 and extended to 2010 by Ordinance 180181, passed by Council on May 31, 2006. An Intergovernmental Agreement to continue the work through 2016 was authorized by Ordinance 183747 passed by Council on May 5, 2010. An Intergovernmental Agreement to continue the work was authorized by Ordinance 187167 passed by Council on June 2015. Ordinance 187167 authorized BES to extend the Intergovernmental Agreement as necessary but not to exceed \$90,000.
5. The Intergovernmental Agreement was renewed in 2016 and 2017 and will reach the authorized spending limit of Ordinance 187167 by June 30, 2018.
6. It continues to be necessary to extend the Intergovernmental Agreement that funds a DEQ Portland Harbor Stormwater Source Control Coordinator. The Bureau of Environmental Services recommends continued renewal of the Agreement and increasing the funding limit not to exceed \$90,000.
7. The annual cost of this agreement is estimated at \$30,000. Funds are available in the Environmental Remediation Fund, FY 2017-18 Budget, Bureau of Environmental Services, Cost Center ESDR000004, Account No. 529000.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Director of the Bureau of Environmental Services is authorized to execute an Intergovernmental Agreement Amendment for the purpose described in Section 1, in a form substantially in accordance with Attachment A, in an amount not to exceed \$30,000, for the initial one-year term of the IGA Amendment.
- b. The Director of the Bureau of Environmental Services is authorized to execute subsequent amendments to the Intergovernmental Agreement, as needed but not to exceed a total of \$90,000 for all amendments authorized by this Ordinance.
- c. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to pay for the Intergovernmental Agreement from the Environmental Remediation Fund.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because the previous funding limit for the Intergovernmental Agreement will be reached by June 30, 2018 and the need to coordinate Portland Harbor source control work is ongoing. Therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.


