Study Transportation Network Company Liability and personal injury protection insurance coverage and develop a proposal for a driver regulatory board (Resolution)

WHEREAS, the Private for-Hire Transportation (PFHT) industry changed in 2015 with the introduction of Transportation Network Companies (TNCs); and

WHEREAS, a growing number of Portlanders use and provide TNC service; and

WHEREAS, drivers for TNCs need equitable footing in developing regulations for the PFHT industry; and

WHEREAS, drivers for TNCs do not have a fair way to dispute inconsistencies with pay, access to the platform, unfair or biased driver ratings, or other common grievances; and

WHEREAS, the City takes the seriousness of the health and safety of the public to the highest degree; and

WHEREAS, the City is entrusted with the responsibility that Portlanders are safe and appropriately insured while using or providing TNC service; and

WHEREAS, the Portland Bureau of Transportation (PBOT) needs to further study variations in nation-wide TNC insurance coverage to assess whether Portlanders are appropriately insured while using TNC service; and

WHEREAS, the City also values the health and safety of the industry's drivers and PBOT needs to further study the need for personal injury protection, accidental death and dismemberment coverage; and

WHEREAS, PBOT needs to further study variations between Taxi and TNC insurance coverage to assess whether period 1 coverage is adequate for the market; and

WHEREAS, the information gathered will enhance education efforts by PBOT.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Council directs PBOT to conduct a study of Taxi and TNC insurance on, but not limited to, the following:

- TNC insurance riders,
- Coverage differences between company liability and personal injury protection insurance,
- Variation in state coverage requirements,
- Variation between Taxi and TNC insurance coverage,
- Period 1, 2, and 3 coverage,
- Sufficiency of insurance coverage based on past claims,
- Personal injury protection, and
- Traffic collision, death, and dismemberment coverage; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that PBOT will report back to Council within six months; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council directs PBOT to begin collecting TNC rideshare data to learn more about the industry, and work with City Council offices, community stakeholders, TNC drivers, and organizations representing TNC drivers, to develop a proposal to create a new oversight body that focuses on transparent collection and use of data, accessibility, wages, public safety, driver safety, safety and reliability for passengers, equalizing standards across the for-hire sector, and equitable dispute resolution, and to report back to Council within six months.
