*Authorize application to the Oregon Department of Transportation for grants in the amount of \$470,000 as part of the 2018 Transportation and Growth Management Program (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The Portland City Council shares the ODOT Transportation and Growth Management Program's Objectives for planning that provides transportation choices; creates vibrant communities; supports economic vitality and growth; saves public and private costs; and promotes environmental stewardship.
- 2. Staff in the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability (BPS) has reviewed the TGM grant program, coordinated with other City bureaus and agencies, submitted an initial preapplication to ODOT on March 9, 2018, and received affirmation to proceed to full application to ODOT to Review and Update the Macadam Plan District including applicable development standards on March 27, 2018:
- 3. BPS seeks a grant of \$220,000 for the Macadam Plan District Active/Public Transportation Options and Development Standards Update.
- 4. Local match in the amount of \$30,000 will be provided by BPS in the form of salary, benefits, and materials and services in the FY 2018/19 and 2019/20 budget of BPS.
- 5. The Bureau of Transportation (PBOT) seeks a grant of \$250,000 to update the Portland Freight Master Plan to incorporate previously completed planning initiatives and address key trends and challenges confronting the freight logistics industry.
- 6. PBOT Local match in the amount of \$34,100 will be provided by funds from General Transportation Revenues in the form of salary, benefits, and materials and services in the fy 2018-19 and 2019-20 budgets of the Portland Bureau of Transportation.

NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to make application to the Oregon Department of Transportation for the above referenced grant in the total amount of \$470,000
- b. The Mayor is authorized to provide such information and assurances as are required for the grant period.
- c. The Office of Management & Finance Grants Management Division is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement from the grantor, and to submit required online grant documents on the Mayor 's behalf.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because the grant applications are required to be submitted no later than June 8, 2018. Therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
