## 188983 ORDINANCE No.

\* Authorize an Intergovernmental Agreement to provide the Multnomah County Department of Health Services \$61,908 in FY 2017-18 for efforts related to the enforcement of specified animal regulations in the City of Portland. (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The City of Portland, Title 13 Animals states that it shall be the responsibility of the Director of Multnomah County Health Department Vector and Nuisance Control, or the director's designee to enforce the provisions of this chapter; and
- 2. The City agrees to provide financial support to Multnomah County for efforts related to the specified animals; and
- 3. The FY 2017-18 budget includes funding in the General Fund Special Appropriations for the above intergovernmental agreement. The City now desires to make a grant to Multnomah County in an amount not to exceed \$61,908.

NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- The Director of the Bureau of Revenue and Financial Services, as a. authorized by Ordinance No.188820 is hereby authorized to enter into an intergovernmental agreement with Multnomah County Department of Health Services as outlined in a form substantially in accordance with the agreement attached as Exhibit A, at a cost not to exceed \$61, 908.
- The Director of the Bureau of Revenue and Financial Services and Auditor b. are hereby authorized to draw and deliver payment chargeable to the Fiscal Year 2017-18 Budget.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay in funding will unnecessarily delay the Multnomah County ability to receive fund for the activities authorized by the IGA; therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by Council.
