ORDINANCE No. 189016

Authorize an Intergovernmental Agreement between the City of Portland, City of Gresham, City of Vancouver, Clackamas County, Port of Portland, and Clark County, Washington to maintain and equip a unit capable of an immediate response to situations involving explosives and explosive disposal (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) Chapter 190 and Revised Code of Washington (RCW) 10.93 provides that a unit of local government may enter into a written Agreement with any other unit of local government for the performance of any or all functions and activities that a party to the Agreement has the authority to perform;
- 2. Six units of local government in the Portland Metropolitan area recognize the ongoing need to maintain a highly trained and properly equipped unit capable of immediate responses to situations involving explosives and explosive disposal;
- The units of local government listed above wish to participate in and maintain the activities of the Metropolitan Explosive Disposal Unit (MEDU) pursuant to ORS 190.010 and RCW 10.93 and 39.34; and
- 4. This Agreement makes clear that once a request for assistance is made, MEDU shall be an agent of the requesting agency for the purpose of dealing with explosives and explosive disposal for the duration of the MEDU mission and by making a request for assistance, a requesting agency or body authorizes MEDU to respond to the requesting jurisdiction and conduct operations there.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Mayor and City Auditor are authorized to execute an Agreement in a form similar to the Agreement attached as Exhibit A.
- b. The Chief of Police is authorized to execute amendments to the scope of services or the terms and conditions of this Agreement, provided the changes do not increase the amount of compensation or increase the City's financial risk.
