Juan Gabriel, aka "El Divo de Juarez," was larger than life itself. His sheer talent, prolific songwriting, and evocative style broke barriers throughout Latin America. So when PDX Latinx Pride co-hosted a tribute to Gabriel at Summer Free For All's first LGBTQ event, Portland's queer Latinx community and allies showed up in force. From the stage adorned with tissue-paper flowers, fitness instructor Gisella Contreras got everyone on their feet with Latin-dance-inspired Zumba[®]. Next came Drag Queen Storytime with Chic Ana and a bilingual reading of *The Very Hungry Caterpillar* by Latino Network's Early Childhood Services staff and mothers. Then, as Joaquín Lopez and Diana Ruiz led a musical homage to Gabriel, families and friends sang along—rarely missing a word. After a free, nutritious lunch and rambunctious play, kids in North Portland's McCoy Park gathered around as Young Gifted Artists (YGA) rolled out the day's art supplies: butcher paper, crayons, markers, paints and stencils. YGA is a collaboration between two collectives—YGBPortland and Deep Under Ground (DUG)—focused on connecting Black and Brown artists with Black and Brown youth. Mia O'Connor-Smith, co-founder of DUG and a community organizer with YGA, grew up in St. Johns, playing at Pier Park and working for Portland Parks & Recreation. Mia believes kids need teachers and mentors who look like them. "YGA was born from love

for our community. The biggest way you can change a life is to inspire someone to be greater or different. We gotta let the youth know they are valued and they deserve to dream." MCCOY PARK
