Purpose of proposed legislation and background information:

There are significant gaps in the City's bikeway network that discourages riding bikes to work, school, shopping, etc. The Seventies Greenway project will address deficiencies in this corridor.

The project will address these deficiencies by filling in major gaps between safe and comfortable north-south pedestrian and bicycle routes in the City.

Specifically, the route will provide 11 enhanced crossings treatments such as curb extensions, island, RRFBs, cycle tracks, multiuse paths, etc. for pedestrian and bicyclists at busy streets and nearby schools

Financial and budgetary impacts:

The project has received \$2,000,000.00 in federal funds, and \$3,010,706.00 in TSDC funds to cover the estimated \$5,010,706 in expenses.

Community impacts and community involvement:

The project will have minimal impact to property owners since the project mainly deals with bike stencils on existing paved roads and some minor sidewalk and curb extension at some key intersections. There will not be any ROW acquisition but there is a potential for some temporary construction easement at some driveways but these easements are typically for the benefit of the property owner.

PBOT will do extensive community outreach during the design and construction phase of the project. There will be mailings and open houses events. PBOT will maintained a close communication with the adjacent property owners.

PBOT will continue work communicate during the construction phase closely with property owners as well.

100% Renewable Goal:

This ordinance action will only accept a grant from FHWA and does not have any impact on City's total energy or renewable energy.
