ORDINANCE No. 189022

*Authorize an Intergovernmental Agreement with Metro in the amount of \$20,000 to provide funding for Momentum Alliance to conduct community engagement as part of the Southwest Corridor Equitable Development Strategy (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. Council directed the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability to develop an Equitable Housing Strategy for the Southwest corridor in anticipation of future light rail transit improvements.
- 2. The Bureau of Planning and Sustainability leads the Southwest Corridor Equitable Housing Strategy which is nested within Metro's Southwest Equitable Development Strategy (SWEDS).
- 3. The Bureau of Planning and Sustainability is committed to equitable community engagement within the Southwest Corridor project area, partnering with Metro and community-based organizations to create an equitable development strategy that benefits low-income, communities of color and/or immigrants and refugees.
- 4. Community-based organizations like Momentum Alliance and their project partners with missions that include serving low-income households, communities of color and/or immigrants and refugees are uniquely positioned to partner with Metro and the City to ensure an equitable development strategy is strongly informed by the lived experiences of those populations.
- 5. \$20,000 will be paid to Metro to expand the work being undertaken by Momentum Alliance and their project partners to engage low-income residents and people of color in the Southwest Corridor Equitable Development Strategy. Funds are available in the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability FY 2017-2018 budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to execute an intergovernmental grant agreement with Metro, in a form substantially similar to the agreement attached as Attachment 1.
- b. The project will anticipate expenses from FY 2017-18.
- c. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to pay for this grant chargeable to the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability, Cost Object 9PN000000071.
- d. The Director of the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability is hereby authorized to sign amendments for continuing data management, reporting and funding in future fiscal years if appropriations are approved by City Council.
- The City Council waives the competitive application process required in FIN 2.04-Budget.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists in order to forward funds for services to continue work that benefits the City. Therefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
