ORDINANCE No. 189026

Authorize an Intergovernmental Agreement and Joint Funding Agreement with the U.S. Geological Survey in an amount not to exceed \$60,000 to model chinook habitat in the Willamette River. (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The Bureau of Environmental Services (BES) protects public health, water quality, and the numerous federally-listed threatened species in the Willamette River. To ensure the ongoing success of the BES mission, BES works collaboratively with other partners including other municipalities, academic institutions, and state and federal agencies such as the U.S. Geological Survey.
- 2. The Portland City Council adopted the Framework for Integrated Management of Watershed Health on March 8, 2006 as part of the 2005 Portland Watershed Management Plan, Resolution No. 36384. The framework defines healthy urban watersheds and watershed health goals, including biological communities that are frequently the first and most sensitive indicators of drainageway impairment and improvement. Salmon are highlighted because of their special legal, economic and cultural status in the Pacific Northwest.
- 3. On November 27th, 2017, Council approved Ordinance 188683 to accept a grant from the Meyer Memorial Trust in the amount of \$68,275 to develop a Willamette Floodplain Streamlined Monitoring Framework. Additional funding for the project was awarded to the University of Oregon (\$45,000) and the Bonneville Environmental Foundation (\$47,420).
- 4. BES desires to enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement and a Joint Funding Agreement with the U.S. Geological Survey (USGS) to develop a quantification model to assess high quality spring chinook habitat in the Willamette River to form the basis for a standardized monitoring tool for all floodplain restoration activities in the Willamette River. Development of a habitat restoration monitoring framework will allow BES and others to track progress toward salmon recovery goals. The remainder of the grant awarded to BES will be allocated to staff time to oversee the IGA and other activities associated with the scope of work.
- 5. The established cost is \$60,000. The USGS will provide matching funds up to \$32,000. Funds are available in the Sewer System Operating Fund, FY '18-'19 Budget, Bureau of Environmental Services, ESWS000011, 529000.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

a. The Director of the Bureau of Environmental Services is authorized to execute an Intergovernmental Agreement, in a form substantially similar to Exhibit A, with the USGS for the purpose described in Section 1, in an amount not to exceed \$60,000.

- b. The Director of the Bureau of Environmental Services is authorized to execute a Joint Funding Agreement, in a form substantially to Exhibit B, with the USGS for the purpose described in Section 1.
- c. The Director of the Bureau of Environmental Services is authorized to negotiate on behalf of the City any modifications to the Intergovernmental Agreement and the Joint Funding Agreement with USGS provided that the modifications do not increase the City's financial obligation above 25% of the original IGA amount, and do not change the City's indemnification. Any modifications that increase the financial obligation above 25% or alter the indemnification must be authorized by Council.
- The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to draw and deliver warrants chargeable to the Sewer System Operating Fund Budget when demand is presented and approved by the proper authority.
