

AMENDMENT No. 5
GRANT AGREEMENT NO. 32000391

This Amendment No. 5 to Grant Agreement 32000391 between the City of Portland (“City” or “Grantor”) and El Programa Hispano Catolico Proyecto UNICA, a subsidiary of Catholic Charities, a non-profit corporation (EPH UNICA or “Grantee”), is effective as of June 25, 2018.

RECITALS:

- A. Pursuant to the Invitation to Submit a Request for Grant circulated publicly on or about April 15, 2010, City sought to provide grants to fund domestic violence victim-centered and culturally specific navigator/ advocacy services on site at the Gateway Center for Domestic Violence Services (“the Center”), located at 10305 E. Burnside Street, in Portland, Oregon.
- B. Portland City Council, through City Ordinance No. 183785, authorized a grant agreement with Grantee after Grantee was selected for grant award based on its response to an invitation to provide Latina-specific navigator/ advocacy services at the Gateway Center for Domestic Violence Services.
- C. The resulting Grant Agreement No. 32000391 was executed on or about June 1, 2010. The effective date of the Grant Agreement was June 1, 2010 to May 31, 2013.
- D. Portland City Council, through City Ordinance No. 185323, amended the original grant agreement, to extend funding for navigator services through June 30, 2014, and client assistance monies through June 30, 2015.
- E. Portland City Council, through City Ordinance No. 186683, amended the agreement again to extend navigator services through June 30, 2015.
- F. Portland City Council, through City Ordinance No. 187330, amended the agreement again to extend navigator services through June 30, 2017.
- G. Portland City Council, through City Ordinance No. 188472, amended the agreement again to extend navigator services through June 30, 2018. The current Amendment expires June 30, 2018.
- H. Among other services, EPH UNICA administers client assistance fund for Gateway Center participants in the amount of \$19,000. EPH UNICA charges an annual \$1000 administration fee for the client assistance funds.
- I. Requests for service have increased at the Gateway Center, and the need for client assistance has consequently increased. Accordingly, more funds are needed to fairly and adequately administer client-assistance payments to Latina survivors of domestic violence.

Therefore, the Parties agree as follows:

1. The Recitals above are true and correct and are part of this Amendment No. 5.
2. The Grant amendment shall make an additional \$4,500 available for client assistance. An additional \$500 will be available for administrative costs for EPH UNICA. This is a total increase of \$5,000 to cover Latina-focused navigator services.
3. In the event additional funds are needed to maintain the EPH UNICA client-assistance fund, the Grantee may request and Grantor may approve additional funds, if available, without presentation to or approval by the City's Chief Procurement Officer or City Council, and may instead proceed with the approval of the Commissioner-in-Charge of the Center, so long as the additional amounts do not exceed \$5,000 on top of the current award amount of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00).

The Parties have executed this Amendment No. 5 to Grant Agreement 32000391 in duplicate on the day and year written, and the corporate signature of Grantee being by authority of the Board of Directors of the executing corporation.
