To the Hon

Gentlemen

in accordance with Resolution
Passed by your Honorable body at your
last Meeting, instructing me in Concert
with his Hon the Mayor, to employ
eight Men to guard the City at night
until steps more efficient was taken
for that Purpose.

I would beg to state
That on Thursday night last that I
employed the following named Persons
for that Purpose.

To wit John Talbot, John
P Walker, The Postress, (Doil Monastics,
Robert Gray, James H. Luppicus,
Mr Joe and A. A. Lucas, all of
whom stood guard that night, with
several other Citizens who volunteered those
services after I had the above named
gentlemen employed.

yesterday the Citizens
organized themselves into a volunteer
City Guard. So it became unnecessary for
me to employ a guard the one night only
all of which is respectfully submitted

To the Honorable City Council of the City of Portland OI

The Undersigned Citizens of the City of Portland in consideration of the now raging war between the Whites and the Indians of this Territory, and the wholly unprotected state of our City especially at nights, do pray Your Honorable Body

that You may please take such immediate steps as will secure the safety of our City by day and by night against our common foe and the danger of fire, either by the enrollment of all citizens into a Citizens armed night watch or by engaging competent watchmen by pay for the City,

and that furthermore You will please pass an act by which during the pending Indian war all Indians whomsoever be prohibited by penalty of bodily chastisement from visiting our City either by day or night

and that furthermore You will please take any such other measures as You may deem proper and efficient for the security of this City and her Citizens
