Reporting and Enforcement

ORS 830.035 (1) provides:

<u>The sheriff of each county and all other peace officers</u> shall be responsible for The enforcement of this chapter and any regulations made by the State Marine Board pursuant thereto.

Emphasis added. "Peace officer" includes "a member of the Oregon State Police, a sheriff or deputy sheriff and a city police officer." ORS 830.005(11). Thus, for the "Hit & Run", Unsafe Operation and Reckless Operation crimes and violations discussed above, the State Police, the Multnomah County Sheriff's Office and the City of Portland Police Department all are responsible for their enforcement, if within their jurisdiction. However, the Marine Board website provides s "Report A Crime" form as well as a "Boating Accident Report" form:

Does this ORS 830.035 mean that the first Peace officer (Jeff Myers, City of Portland Policeman) on the scene of a hit and run, should have launched an investigation ?
