# **ORDINANCE No. 189144**

\* Amend an Intergovernmental Agreement with Portland State University in an amount not to exceed \$50,000 under the FY 2014 Smart Policing Initiative grant program to provide research and services to the Police Bureau for the study of the Neighborhood Involvement Locations program (Ordinance; amend Contract No. 30004383)

# The City of Portland ordains:

### Section 1. The Council finds:

- The Office of Justice Programs (OJP) awarded the City a Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) grant in the amount of \$699,464 for the FY 2014 Smart Policing Initiative (SPI) program on September 29, 2014;
- 2. The Smart Policing Initiative (SPI) seeks to build upon the concepts of offender-based and place-based policing and broaden the knowledge of effective policing strategies. This initiative addresses the need for effective policing, which requires a tightly focused, collaborative approach that is measureable, based on sound, detailed analysis and includes policies and procedures for accountability;
- The purpose of the Intergovernmental Agreement (Contract) is to address roles, responsibilities, and payment for research and services provided by Portland State University (PSU) as related to the SPI grant award and approved Action Plan;
- Portland State University has provided similar analysis and evaluation services for the City in the past and is well-suited to provide such services on this project;
- 5. The City wishes to amend existing Contract No. 30004383 with PSU to add \$50,000 for the SPI grant program; and
- The Council declares an emergency exists because a delay would prevent the City's and PSU's ability to perform the timed activities authorized by the grant program by September 15, 2018.

## NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Mayor and City Auditor are hereby authorized to execute amendments to Contract No. 30004383 between the City and PSU as outlined in a form similar to the amendment attached as Exhibit A.
- b. The Chief of Police or the grant program manager are authorized to execute amendments to the scope of services or the terms and conditions of this Contract, provided the changes do not increase the amount of compensation or increase the City's financial risk.

Section 2. The Council declares an emergency exists because a delay would prevent the City's and PSU's ability to perform the timed activities authorized by the grant program by September 15, 2018. Therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
