

Bios of Appointees

Ms. Santner was Director of Portland Parks & Recreation from 2003 until she retired from the City of Portland in 2011. Her nearly 30 years of parks service was exemplified by her commitment to equity and design. Highlights of her career stretch the gamut from such projects as Powell Butte Nature Park and the Vera Katz East Bank Esplanade to managing the 1994 Parks Bond to strong policy direction to make certain that parks are considered critical city infrastructure in all city-wide budgetary decisions. A landscape architect by training and native of Iran, Santner brings a unique and comprehensive understanding of Portland Parks & Recreation to the 2014 Parks Bond Oversight Committee.

Ms. Loper grew up in Portland and spent her career with Portland Parks & Recreation. Starting in college, she held various positions over time including Volunteer Coordinator and Outreach and Communication Manager. Her broad exposure to virtually every aspect of the suite of Parks & Recreation services makes her an invaluable member of this Committee. She understands the roles and responsibilities of employees and volunteers of PPR and how upgrades to the park system help staff respond to citizen recreational needs. She also understands the budgeting protocols and monitoring/managing funding to meet bureau-wide objectives. She retired in 2012 after 4 years as Assistant Director. She worked on many bond and levy programs (before, during and after) ensuring the public was involved and informed throughout the process.

Ms. Mason is a marketing and communications leader in the Architecture and Engineering field. She is currently the President of the Philippine Chamber of Commerce and has been involved with the organization for the last four years, assisting the board with rebranding, increasing communications and visibility, and supporting minority-owned small business. She has worked for architecture, engineering, and construction firms for more than 30 years, including time spent as a project manager on public and private landscape architecture projects. Through this experience, she has grown her depth of understanding of the design and construction process. Ms. Mason was recently appointed as co-chair for the International Committee for the Oregon Association of Minority Entrepreneurs.
