

How the Black Panthers Operate Part V These are the words of Stokely Carmichael, originally called the "brains" behind the Black Panther Party. The violent tactics of the Black Panthers can be best understood in the biographical framework of the man who helped give the Black Panther Party its birth.

Stokely Carmichael was born June 29, 1941, in Port-of-Spain, Trinidad, but has lived in the United States since he was eleven. He automatically became a U.S. citizen when his parents were admitted to citizenship in 1953. He attended the Bronx High School of Science and then obtained an AB degree from Howard University in 1964.

Carmichael began studying Marxism and revolutionary tactics in high school. By 1960 he had been completely indoctrinated in the Communist Party strategy of using "civil rights" as a facade behind which the Party could accomplish its purposes. Although working closely with Martin Luther King, Jr., and pretending to help the American Negroes get their "rights" by "non-violence," Carmichael worked secretly with the most violent type of Communist revolutionary strategists to lay the foundation for a future day of fire and bloodshed.

By the middle of 1966 Carmichael had developed the image of a civil rights martyr who had gone through twenty-seven separate arrests for the "cause." He was therefore "elected" head of the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee which had been set up at the suggestion of Martin Luther King, Jr., in 1960.

The use of the word "Non-violent" in the SNCC organization soon appeared crudely out of place when SNCC (usually called SNICK) turned out to be the most militant of the Left-wing Negro organizations in the early 'Sixties. In fact, it puzzled people who had admired Martin Luther King that he should have been identified with its founding. But that was before the public was beginning to get reports from Congressmen that the FBI had found King working in close association with a Soviet Agent and had employed a top Communist on his staff named

By 1966, however, Stokely Carmichael saw no reason to hide behind the non-violent slogan any longer. He told newsmen during an interview that, "This nonviolence bit is just a philanthropic handout. I don't see why people keep thinking about that. The violence is inevitable. I don't try to stop the fight. I try to prepare the people I am organizing so that when the right time comes they will be able to win it."

What Carmichael really meant was that he and his associates were going to provoke a fight. And it had a diabolical purpose: to isolate and alienate Black Americans from all other Americans.

ORIGIN OF THE BLACK PANTHER MOVEMENT

Even before Carmichael became the chief of SNCC, he had launched an experimental program to seize and sovietize one entire county in the state of Alabama. It was Lowndes County. In March. 1965. Stokely Carmichael and another prominent SNCC official, John Hulett, set up the Lowndes County Freedom party with a black panther as its symbol. The symbol proved popular and soon it became known as the Black Panther Party.

No longer was the cry "civil rights" or "equal rights" but "Black Power." Carmichael ridiculed the possibility of Negroes cooperating in any movement to identify American Negroes with the American culture. His line was pure Marxist-Leninism: "When you talk of Black Power you talk of bringing this country to its knees. When you talk of Black Power, you talk of building a movement that will destroy everything Western Civilization has created."

A tract entitled "The Black Panther Party" by Elizabeth Barnes helped explain the objectives of the new movement. Other literature also became available. It developed that the Black Panthers were going to use their Black Power to gain complete political control of Lowndes County, Alabama, and then use *Continued on page 10*



the power of taxation to expropriate all the land. They intended to set up an all-county Soviet, meaning a Black Power county government which would own all the means of production. As we shall see in our next article, this was to become part of a new movement called the Republic of New Africa which Communist agents have been advocating for thirty years as a revolutionary device to seize most of the Southern States.

THE BLACK PANTHERS SURFACE IN NEW YORK CITY

Meanwhile, in New York City, the promoters of RAM (Revolutionary Action Movement) with its secret terror troops called The Black Guard, came to the surface with another branch of the Black Panther Party.

On August 29, 1966, the Black Panthers sponsored a public rally in Harlem featuring Stokely Carmichael, Max Stanford (RAM's Field Secretary) and William Epton (an admitted Communist and leader of the Progressive-Labor-Party). Max Stanford Maoist shouted to the crowd:

"Black men must unite in overthrowing their white oppressors, must do it like Panthers, smiling, cunning, scientifically . . . stalking by night and sparing no one."

Fortunately, the greatest hindrance to the spreading contagion of these Black Power people has been America's loyal Negro population. The Black Panthers of New York discovered this in September, 1966, when they tried to stage a school boycott in Harlem. The boycott failed and three of the Panthers were arrested.

It was decided that pending some future time when they could agitate the people of Harlem into a more militant mood, the Black Power movement should throw its influence behind a project on the West Coast where a cadre of Negro ex-convicts were being recruited for a Black Panther chapter with headquarters in Oakland, California This turned out to be the project which really caught fire.

THE BLACK PANTHER MOVEMENT IN CALIFORNIA

In our last article we treated the leaders of the California chapter in considerable detail because they ultimately took over the national Black Panther movement. RAM had originally ordered two of its most reckless militants, Huey P. Newton and Bobby G. Seale, to organize the Black Panthers in Oakland. Both ended up with murder charges against them.

On October 29, 1966, the Communist-dominated Students for a Democratic Society held a Black Power Conference at the University of California at Berkley. Stokely Carmichael was the major speaker.

From then on Black Panthers began roaming about in packs of a dozen or more, carrying loaded guns and flaunting their "Black Power" strength as though they were inviting a confrontation with police or anyone else who would create an incident and get them publicity.

February 21, 1967, a Panther "honor guard" was parading the widow of Malcolm X around the streets of San Francisco. When police a ...npted to stop this Panther militia, Huey Newton leveled his shotgun at them and dared them to draw their weapons. The police retired rather than risk a shoot-out.

The shoot-out could not be avoided October 28, 1967. Huey P. Newton was being questioned about a minor traffic violation when he suddenly shot and killed one police officer and severely wounded another. After being convicted of murder he was sentenced to a mere two-to-five years imprisonment.

THE MERGER OF SNICK AND THE BLACK PANTHERS

By 1968 the Students Non-violent Coordinating Committee had been rather thoroughly exposed and therefore, on February 17, a hugh fund-raising rally in Oakland was selected as an appropriate occasion to announce the merger between the Black Panthers and SNCC (SNICK). Eldridge Cleaver (Panther candidate for the President of the United States) announced that the following people would serve on the new Panther cabinet: James Forman, Minister of Foreign Affairs; Hubert Geroid "Rap" Brown, Minister of Justice; Stokely Carmichael, Prime Minister. It was apparent that the Soviet-directed conspiratorial machinery was consolidating its strength behind the Black movement and using the Black Panthers as the incendiary torch to light the revolutionary explosion.

The very next month the Panther leaders announced their most brazen insult to the people of the United States: the formation of a Communist structured Republic of New Africa. Many people are only beginning to appreciate the full implication of this betrayal of the Negro population in the United States. That is why our next article will be devoted exclusively to this treasonable campaign to split away a whole region of the United States and coerce the Negro population to live in a Black Soviet Republic of America.

SIGNS OF A COMING STORM


On August 29, 1968, Los Angeles police searched a car containing four Black Panthers in which they found literature entitled "Defense Chemistry." It turned out to be "offense" munitions: instructions for the manufacture of self-igniting molotov cocktails; Pyridine, Butyric Acid, or Valeric Acid for forced evacuation of buildings, Perchoric Acid for the crankcases of police cars and anti-riot vehicles. When this acid is poured into a cold engine it is stable. When the motor commences running it bursts into flame.

There began to be numerous thefts of large quantities of dynamite, blasting caps and timing devices. These were followed by a variety of explosions, most of them amateurishly executed, but deadly nevertheless.

November 12, 1968, a Panther leader demonstrated a shoulder-held machine-gun and stated that within a week the Panthers in that area would have thirty more of these weapons. The very next night, fifty of these machine-guns were distributed to Black Panthers in the Los Angeles area. Members were assigned missions which included attacks on local police stations.

On Nove er 12, 1968, an Oakland meeting of the Panthers was told to immediately obtain heavy caliber weapons and at least one thousand rounds of ammunition for each weapon. "It was emphasized at the meeting that the Black Power Revolution would probably occur by 1972, when all conditions were favorable."

On March 19, 1969, an act of highly technical sabotage was committed on the Southern Pacific lines in Solano County, California. Rails had been loosened and the safety mechanism had been rewired so the on-coming trains would have no warning. Two locomotives and thirty cars were wrecked resulting in a fire and at least \$500,000 in damages.

In July, 1969, the Black Panthers played host to four thousand delegates from nearly three hundred revolutionary front organizations. The meeting was called to set up the National Revolution onference for a United Front Against Facism. This conference was held at Merritt College in Oakland, California, and we have described in a previous article the domination of this entire conference by leading Communist personalities. Throughout the three-day convention the slogans of International Communism were chanted with ritualistic regularity.

The November, 1969, edition of *Political Affairs*, the leading theoretical journal of the Communist Party, carried an eight-page article entitled, "The Black Panther Party." The author, William L. Patterson, a top Party leader declared:

"It is necessary that Communists, especially, should recognize the urgency of supporting this effort . . . The Panthers now have organized contingents in approximately 33 states. At the present they are in the center of police attacks. J. Edgar Hoover, the fascistminded head of the FBI, calls the Panthers the most dangerous organization in the New Left. That is some evidence of their importance.

"The membership of the Communist Party should stand in the forefront in defense of the Black Panthers."

IN THE OFFING: A TWO-BARRELLED ATTACK AGAINST THE UNITED STATES

Intelligence officers have known ever since Oleg Penkovskiv Case broke that Soviet strategy against the United States is headed toward a showdown in the early Nineteen Seventies. The attack is to be two-pronged. Internally, the United States is to be made as unstable as possible with riots, financial chaos, unemployment, strikes, and a general breakdown of law and order. Externally, the Soviet Union to achieve multi-megaton missile superiority by about 1973 (Secretary Laird originally estimated 1975, then 1974 and now says it may come "sooner"). With the SS-9's and SS-11's pointed in our direction externally, and chaos prevailing internally, the leaders of International Communism think they can compel the American people to accept a "compromise" of satellite status in a Soviet world in preference to extinction.

Several things could occur to upset this hard-line strategy but the Soviet tactics in Vietnam, Cambodia, Paris, the SALT meetings, the Middle East and the latest missile build-up in Cuba are all part of coming external showdown. The internal showdown is the responsibility of the Black Panthers and the of the forces of internal subversion which were exp resented at the Conference of Revolutionary Openzations at Oakland during July, 1969.

Whether law enforcement likes it or not, the difference of the confrontation is going to be intense, fanatical and violent.

AMERICANS WHO CONTRIBUTE TO THE CLIMATE OF CONFUSION

It is amazing at this late stage of subversive escalation that some people in high places should still be confused about what is going on. J. Edgar Hoover made it very clear as to what FBI investigations have disclosed. Senator John L. McClellan, Chairman of the Senate Permanent Investigations Subcommittee has issued a twenty-three volume report of extensive hearings entitled *Riots*, *Civil and Criminal Disorders*. The subversive activities of the Communist-directed Black Panther Party are spelled out in careful detail.

But in spite of all this we read in a UPI dispatch of January 27, 1970, this kind of statement from U.S. Deputy Attorney General Richard G. Kleindienst: "I don't regard the Black Panthers as a menace to the internal security of the United States. They are the extreme outward manifestation of a social problem."

It is because Americans *want* to solve the social problems of its minorities that it has tolerated the criminal violence of the militant groups as long as they have. It is high time Deputy Attorney Generals and other misguided, superficial students of the subject stop excusing revolution to burn the country down as merely a manifestation of somebody's desire to solve a social problem. This conspiracy is out to create the worst social, economic, political and military problems the United States has ever faced.

Mr. Hoover and others have warned us that much of the revolutionary violence is being financed by some of the richest people in America. Once again, believing that they are solving some kind of "social problem," they have been pouring their treasures into the pockets of the most violent professional revolutionaries. Unfortunately, the Federal Government's Office for Economic Opportunity has been found doing the same.


It simply demonstrates the absolute necessity for a far greater publicity effort and a much broader public education program as to the profound realities confronting this nation. Unfortunately, the vast majority of the newspapers, national magazines, radio and TV combines, have not been in sympathy with such a proposal. They have insisted upon excusing the excesses which we observe all around us as merely a passing phase of social and economic problemsolving.



and its effect on the standards for admissibility of confessions. It spells out exactly what you can and cannot do in carrying out the Miranda requirements. Fortunately, we had igmored public indifference and had gone right ahead preparing for that which seemed virtually inevitable. When it came time to do the job, we did it.

Circumstances would strongly suggest that in the not too distant future we may have the job to do again.

In refrence to information reguested about known activists or militants in our area the following is a list of names with no mug shots as none of them have been argested recently or at least in our city. As a matter of fact it is unknown for sure if the names are correct as they are strangers in Yakima & this info. is from car rentals as well as flight lists from Air West.

On the morning of 7-31-70 this dept. became involved in the surveliance of many negro subjects who were coming to Yakima to attend a confrenne which was going to be held at the Patillo African Village in east Selah. This information came via the local FBI office & one of the principle members that was going to attend this meeting in Yakima was Don Brown the reported brother of H. Rap Brown. The Patillos are from California originally somewhere close to the LA area & have become involved in that area & left reportedly for some of their activities. Thye are currently attempting to build an African Village with the aid of money from some of the local churches & so far they have at least recieved many thousands of dollars plus a federal grant for this building program. Thelma Patillo & Charles Patillo have been active in forming youth activities where the gloved clenched fist is used, black coats etc. My private opinion is that the Patillo's are very active in organizing militant movements & the result of the people that did come to Yakima is some indication that they have the right connections to have some attendance from some of the more active militants both on the east coast as well as the west coast.

This meeting was attended by persons from LA as well as San Francisco, Portland, Seatile, surrounding area of Yakima, New York, Chicago, Nassau, & possibly other points around the US that we are not fully aware of yet or at this time at least. Some of these people traveled a long distance just to attend **that** a barbecue especially the dude from Nassau. We had informants in the meeting but at the time of many of the closed door meetings no one was allowed inside except some of the traveling big shots. Even the Patillos did not attend some of the meetings so this seemed to be a meeting of some of the bigger people in the circle of activists but at this time we have no word or idea what was discussed behind the closed guærded door.

The persons in from out of town were strangers & many of the people that attended the barbecue were complete strangers & thye were simply a front for some good hard back room polictics. Even the local blacks shat are inclined to be militant did not get into the meetings.

As far as any of the local blacks going to Portland to attend this convention there has been no definite word of any of them making a special trip to Portland for this occasion. This report will contain only the names of the persons that we could obtain from the records as to have been in Yakima as we have no pictures or pertiment information. As a matter of fact the militants in our area are not organized at this time although Phil & Don Plesant are trying. We have several groups of teen agers that create small problems but nothing of any magnitude. We have currently blessed with four individuals that are blacks from Seattle that are making things bad for the drunks on the street but we cannot get any of the victims to give any more information than they were the victims of strong arms by four blacks & positive ID has not been made at this time. The local Blakks are a little upset & amy may take care of the problem in their own way.

The first subject mentioned coming to Yakima & probably the main person is Donald Brown reported brother to Rap Brown. Brown flew from Washington DC to Portland via United Air Lines after stopping in Chicago. While in Chicago a Black by the name of W. Stewart also boarded the same United Flight as Brown & the two flew into Portland on the same flight. At this time we have nothing mor e to add than that except Brown & Stewart were both leaving Yakima on the same date. While in Portland they met up with two more blacks who had flown up to Portland on another flight from California.

The one person that arrived in Yakima from Portland via San Francisco was A. Adeigbola of 1317 Prospect New York New York. A vehicle was rented from Hertz by Adeigbola on a National Crdit Card which is registered to Executive Council 815 2nd Ave. New York New York. This subject had a return reservation from Yakima to Frisco then flying from Friscoto Kennedy in New York via American Air Lines.

The other subject in Yakima along with the above three that arrived on the same flight was listed as <u>H. Callender</u> 2311 So. Ave. New York New York who also rented a Hertz vehicle on a National Account Credit Card, also made out to the Executive Council 815 2nd Ave. New York, New York. Callender started his journey west on 7-27-70 from Nassau, to Miami, from Miami to Frisc & then from Fisco to Portland. When in Portland all four men flew to Yakima together, & all were going to leave Yakima on the same flight back to Portland where they were going to split & go different directions. While in Yakima Callender cashed a money order for \$1,000.00 which he recieved in one **danit** dollar bills & evidently he distributed them to some of the kids that attended the barbecue.

Most of the information & copies of the manifests etc. were turned over to the FBI & very likely that is where most of the information will die. We no very little about who the people were or might be in reality. I have attempted to get some of the information back from the FBI & perhaps if it is determined the who why what when & where we may be enlightened. At this time we are still in the dark except from for some conclusions.

We had several people fly in from Frisco & their fare was paid for by the Malcom X Educationa Center in San Francisco. These people created a scene at the ticket counter in Frisco but they walked like lambs in Yakima.

At this time the conjecture is that this meeting was of some top level meeting discussing some future activity. We feel that Yakima will not be the recipient of this activity but with the Federal Funds & Church Money this African Viallge thing has got to finance some activity in the future. I personally feel that the Patillo's might be affiliated with a national party or organization & wouldn't be suprised if this was sommunist affiliated.

If we can be of further assistance please advise. Sorry about no pictures & the vague info. but that is all we know at this time.

Mrs. Harris advised the manager that she had seen approx. 60 people accumulated in one area, the area basically described as the vicinity of Vancouver/Ivy, near a Methodist Church with an alley behind it, Down the alley there is a spot where a building is being torn down. This is the area of concentration. Writing officer and his partner attempted to Xlocate this area, unable to do so. Mrs. Harris, described as having worked for MC Hospital or the City Water Bureau for an extended length of time. Supposedly a very stable citizen in the area. District cars were advised to keep a sharp lookout and we returned to service.

After the explosion, the burglar alarm at Lincoln Park Food located at 3536 NE Union, started sounding. However, this was accidental due to the intensity of the bomb going off that shook the entire area. Returned to service at 3:49 am.

Sir: ROY ALAN BROWN of 4223 NE 15th, telephone- 281-4610 contacted this office today with information. Mr. BROWN is a special Police Officer employed by McDONALDs at their business address. He advises that there were a bunch of White hippies picketing McDONALDs yesterday through the afternoon. He says that one of these men was carrying a bundle wrapped in brown butcher's paper that was about the right size and shape to contain 3 or 4 sticks of dynamite. When he noted this he asked his fellow security guard at McDONALDs get a license number for the persons automobile. Nothing more was thought of it until the bombing and Mr BROWN has been trying since then to get the license number from his co-worker. This man has not been available to his telephone at this time but Mr BROWN will contact him as soon as possible and relay the license number of the car. Mr. BROWN also stated that the manager of the McDONALDS restaurant was taking pictures of thepicketing yesterday and is quite likely that he will have had a picture of the man with the bundle. Mr. BROWN feels that he would be able to identify this person.

Telephone call was received from Officer Tardiff of the Traffic Division. Officer Tardiff works part time for the Lampus store on Union Avenue and was talking to the druggest Mr ED HOLLAND. Mr Mørrøan HOLLAND told Tardiff that about 4 o'clock yesterday a White male, about 30 years old, 5-10, 180# came in and asked for 1 pound of potasium chloride. Mr. HOLLAND told this person they did not have such material available and the person left. Mr. HOLLAND told Tardiff that he recognized the person as having been in the store previously, went through his prescription logs and thinks the name might ALLEN MOCAN of 2138 SE Brooklyn. He is not sure that this is the name of the person that asked for the potasium chloride. MOGAN's name has been checked through Records with negative results.

Lt Smith at North Precinct was contacted and request made that Officers from his precinct who canvassed the neighborhood immediately following this bombing write reports giving the addresses of all houses where they made contact and the results of those contacts. These reports will be forthcoming.

They consequently died as a result of their wounds. Some racial tension developed in my community as a result of the incident. The tension is being brought about by Heard B. CHAPMAN and Gerald K. BARLOW.

Some indication is that JONES and WARREN, as well as BARLOW may be familiar to your department. I have no information that CHAPMAN or STENNIS have been in your area, but I would appreciate any information that you are at liberty to forward concerning any of these individuals or their known associates. She was again turned down and left and approximately a week later, returned alone. She was refused any donations and has not returned since that time. The Wagstaff Battery intends to join with several other businesses in the area and hire a special patrolman to check the area as a fire guard.

SIR: This morning we talked with MR. CARL C. CHURCH, of the <u>Coast Mirro</u> Company, 1732 NE Second, phone:287-1236. MR. CHURCH stated that he was the business manager of this firm and that MR. ROUGHTON, the owner, was not in at the time of our visit. We advised MR. CHURCH of the reason for our call and he stated that they were approached on the same date as Nestelle's and Mc Pherson Furnace, this having been determined to be the 28th of April, 1970; with a request for a donation.

He describes the two subjects as a colored female, maybe twenty years of age, not very tall, possibly 5'2", very slender. And a black male, about 5'9" to 5'10", 220# to 230#, very large, with a beard. He said that these subjects talked with MR. ROUGHTON, presented him with some of their literature, requesting that they make a donation to the Panther Breakfast Program. He was given a packet of photos of known Panthers and associates and from these, picked local number 52067, being that of KENT FORD, as the likeness of the subject that was with the female in the office. He states that no overt threats were made, however, when being refused the donation a statement was made by the colored male "We'll be back". MR. He said that he was contacted on the same date as McPherson Furnace and Coast Mirror Company. As he recalled, sometime around the first of May but has been firmly tied down to 28th of April, 1970. He states that a male Negro and a female Negress came into the store, handing him a brochure requesting that he donate money to this cause. He describes the male as being small, very slender, the male as being about 5'9", 230#, and upon viewing the group of Panther militants, selected the photo of KENT FORD, local number 52067, as positively being the subject in his office this date. He says there were no actual overt threats made, however, during the conversation the subject kept repeating "You've got to give us money." MR. NESTELLE advised them that he wasn't in a position, business was not good enough to allow him to donate at this time. At which time he stated the subjects did leave. MR. NESTELLE felt that possibly the reason they put up no great pressure was the presence of numerous customers in the building and the office at the time of their discussion. MR. NESTELLE states he will be willing to cooperate with this office in any way and will call if any further contacts are made.

RE: CONTACTS OF THE ALBINA BUSINESS DISTRICT

Sir: Contacts with positive results, #1 HALSEY 88¢ STORE, 5302 NE 33rd ph. 282-3191, manager, JAMES A. TOWNSEND, 9919 SE Stanley, ph. 659-4191. The report involves a call that the manager or the manager's mother-in-law received in June of 1969, a year ago, in which TOWNSEND stated they received a call at the store regarding a contribution from a party representing Miss Tan Portland. They wanted a contribution originally of \$50 and it was finally agreed upon for \$20 in which tickets for the RICHARD SUE - JIMMY BANG BANG WALKER fight would be sent to them. TOWNSEND stated that the fight never came off and that they did receive tickets but never received the \$20 back. The group calling and representing themselves for the Miss Tan Portland contest did not give any names or addresses and that the contribution would be paid in for the fight in return the money would end up supporting the Miss Tan Portland contest. The manager, Mr. TOWNSEND and his mother-in-law explained that they would not be able to contribute the original \$50 due to the fact that the BIG C Grocery Store directly next door had burned and business was considerably down. Mr. TOWNSEND stated that the contribution request dounded to him like more or less a pressure type request but he did not offer any other explanation and did agree to go through with it.

Approx. 3:10 pm this date we went to the B & R SHOE STORE at 2940 NE Alberta ph. 281-5819 and contacted the owner of the store, BARNET WAGNER, dob: 3/20/18 4210 NE 69th Ave. ph. 284-0832. Mr. WAGNER stated at this time, that approx. 5 weeks ago he was contacted by telephone from a man, he believed to named STEVE. This man stated that he was a representative of the Black and White Unity Organization and asked Mr. WAGNER if his store would contribute money to his organization to prevent racial violence. Mr. WAGNER stated that it probably would be possible for him to contribute a small amount of money to this organization. A few days later a woman came to the store, whom he described as a WF, approx. 5'5, heavy build, approx. 35 to 40 yrs with brown hair. The woman stated that she was aware of the telephone conversation between Mr. WAGNER and the subject he previously described as STEVE and that she was at the store to pick up the money for the contribution to the Black & White Unity Organization. The woman stated that she had heard that Mr. WAGNER had previously contributed to the Albina Float Committee and Mr. WAGNER feels that this organization probably got his name through that committee. Mr. WAGNER then wrote out a \$5 check and gave it to the woman. The woman wrote out a receipt and gave it to Mr. WAGNER. Mr. WAGNER stated that he believes he still has the receipt at home and was advised to contact Lt. Still if he should recover the receipt. Mr. WAGNER stated that both the telephone conversation with the original caller and the conversation between he and the white female at the store was kept on a very polite basis. The woman again stated, when she arrived to pick up the money from Mr. WAGNER, that the donation was for the Prevention of Racial Violance. Mr. WAGNER stated to these Officers he did not understand how these contributions would help prevent racial violence but felt that anything that he could give to the organization would probably be beneficial.



At approx. 5 pm this date we went to the WHITE-MANN CO. at 5001 NE Union, ph. 288-5303, and contacted the owner there FRANCIS WHITE of 6642 NE 25th, ph. AT 2-4238. At that time Mr. WHITE stated approx. 2 months ago, two NBC males and one NF, whom he described as adults, entered his store and asked him for a money contribution to the BLACK PENTHER BREAKFAST FUND. Mr. WHITE stated that he did not wish to donate to this fund and asked the three people to leave his store. He then spoke briefly with the three parties and then they left the store. Mr. WHITE stated at no time was he threatened by either of the three people. Mr. WHITE stated that at the time he was approached by the three subjects they had in their possession several Black Panther Newspapers. Contacts were made at the following locations with negative results.

IN THE ALBINA DISTRICT

Sir: On 6/12/70 approx. 2 pm, we contacted the owner of the ALBERTA TAVERN at 417 NE Alberta, ph. 284-9310. The owner TONY KRANK lives at 317 NE 92nd in Vancouver, ph. 693-0992. The ALBERTA TAVERN had a fire the night prior to this date and the owners, TONY KRANK and his son were out front boarding the establishment up. We contacted the owner, thinking possible that foul play had been involved with the fire but we do not know any of the details of that fire. The owner stated the fire broke out after he closed at 1 am and the clock showed it stopped at 1:45 am. The owner took a seat in the back of the police vehicle we were using and we had a short discussion with him regarding contributions, etc. and he stated that he thought that he was protected by the Black Panthers. He stated he thought they were nice quys. We then asked him why he had these particular thoughts but he did not elaborate but stated that the Black Panthers came in approx. 2 months ago into his establishment and for approx. 2 hours they held some form of a meeting. Mr. KRANK stated they then got up and left the place with no trouble. Mr. KRANK states he has owned the ALBERTA TAVERN since February and doesn't feel that he has had any unusual problems up to this time. His attitude was cooperative but Officer Kopuch and mysell became interested when he stated that he thought he was protected by the Black Panthers but did not elaborate when asked why he thought so. We asked him then if he had any idea about the fire or why it may have happened and he stated no, he didn't know of any reasons.

Mr. KRANK did not know the numbers of Black Panthers that attended the meeting or any of them by any particular name other than he stated he knew they were Black Panthers and that they were holding a meeting in his place. He apparently did not inquire as to what type of meeting or why and we could not get any information out of him whether the meeting had anything to do with why he thought he was protected or if it had anything to do with the fire. End of ALBERTA TAVERN interview.

GRENFELL'S GROCERY, 4239 NE Union, ph. 284-9694, the owner DONALD GRENFELL, home address 3027 NE Ainsworth, ph. 282-9395. Mr. GRENFELL states he was contacted approx. 2 to 3 weeks ago by two Negro males, one he described as KENT FORD. They approached him and asked him for contributions to the Black Panther Breakfast Fund. Mr. GRENFELL stated that he couldn't give any money as he was broke and could barely make ends meet in his little grocery store but he had a small eggs on sale for 25¢ a dozen and Mr. GRENFELL states that he gave them approx. 15 dozen eggs. He states that he received a receipt signed by KENT FORD and that the receipt had to do with the church at NE 9th and Going, which is the Highland Community Center. Mr. GRENFELL states that he was not pressured as they did not state that they would be back but neither of them were any too polite when they left the store after taking the 15 dozen eggs. Mr. GRENFELL felt it would be best to cooperate in the hopes it would reduce any trouble in the future. Mr. GRENFELL also states that Black Panthers come in to his small grocery store, which is located near their headquarters and do quite a bit of grocery shopping. I asked him why how he knew they were Black Panthers and he says he simply knows they are 46

Black Panthers. He states along with their shopping they do a considerable amount of shoplifting also. Mr. GRENFELL states they didn't leave any indication as to whether they would be back in a months time or if he would have any trouble with them and Mr. GRENFELL states he doesn't know exactly how he will handle the next situation but hopes possibly to get any information or names from them in the event they do return to the store. End of this interview.

At approx. 2:40 pm this date, we went to ELECTRO-MATIC INCORP. at 6110 NE Union and contacted the manager there, TOM MADDOX. He stated at that time no particular group or organization had approached him and requested any contributions of any unusual manner. ELECTRO-MATIC INCORP. is a member of the Albina Boosters and Mr. MADDOX stated at this time that at the last meeting of the Albina Boosters, when insurance of the business places were being talked about, the Black Panther situation and the Black Panther Bseakfast Fund donations did enter into the discussion. Mr. MADDOX did not elaborate on what was said at that meeting. Mr. MADDOX stated at this time that it would be worth our while to contact ROY CARLSON at the ARBOW SALES AUTO CO., 4611 NE Union in regards to unusual contributions. At this time we left the ELECTRO-MATIC INCORP. and proceeded to ARROW AUTOMOBILE SALES.

Approx. 3:20 pm this date we contacted ROY CARLSON, the owner of ARROW AUTOMOBILE SALES at 4611 NE Union. At that time he stated that he had conclibuted of last year to the Black ranthers. Mr. CARLSON stated that so far this year he has contributed \$10 to the Elack Panthers Breakfast Fund, that check going to the Highland Community Center. This organization is located at NE 9th and NE Going. Mr. CARLSON stated that he is approached once a month for these type of donations but did not elaborate on how many contributions he has made. Mr. CARLSON further stated that when he makes these donations, usually two NBC males come into his automobile dealership and ask for the money. Mr. CARLSON said that he has had much trouble with vandalism the past coupld of months and seemed to be obviously afraid to talk freely with us at this time. His attitude at this time may be due to the location at which he was being talked to as people were walking in and out of the room in which we were carrying on our investigation. It may be adviseable to have detectives contact ROY CARLSON and talk with him in a more convenient place. Mr. CARSLON further stated that he is afraid to visit his place of business any night after 6 pm.

We then proceeded to GARY WORTH PLYMOUTH at 4401 NE Union and contacted the manager there, GARY MC MANUS, 17505 SE Alder, ph. AT 3-5176, bus. ph. 288-636 Mr. MC MANUS stated that last Monday night he was approached by two NBC males and asked for his monthy donation to the Black Panther Breakfast Fund. Mr. MC MANUS made out a \$25 check and gave it to the two NBC males and they left. Mr. MC MANUS stated that that night two fire bombs were thrown into his place of business. Mc. MC MANUS does not know if the Black Panthers are connected in any way to he two fire bombs that were thrown into his business. Mr. MC MANUS stated that approx. 2 months ago he was asked to contribute to this fund by three NBC males, approx. 16 to 17 years of age and he refused That same night 16 of the automobiles parked on the GARY WORTH PLYMOUTH lot were vandalized. This amounted to the breaking off of the antennas on the automobiles. Mr. MC MANUS states that he was approached by the Black Panther at least once a month and sometimes twice a month for contributions which he does give amounting to \$15 to \$25 at a time. Mr. MC MANUS states that he 45

does receive receipts when he gives these contributions but is unable to locate these receipts at this time. Mr. MC MANUS has been making these contributions for approx. 4 months. It should be noted that Mr. MC MANUS states that KENT FORD is a regular customer at GARY WORTH PLYMOUTH and from time to time KENT FORD does ask for these contributions personally. Mr. MC MANUS' attitude towards KENT FORD is very negative. Mr. MC MANUS' attitude toward the police is a very favorable one and if any follow up work is done on this report he should be contacted. Mr. MC MANUS stated that after his last \$25 contribution to the Black Panther Breakfast Fund and having the two fire bombs thrown into his place of business that night, that his contributions will now stop. Mr. MC MANUS stated that he had reported only one of these bomb (fire) tossings to the police.

We then went to POLLOCK MOTORS at 4206 NE Union and interviewed the owner there TED POLLOCK. Mr. POLLOCK stated that on 6/8/70, he was approached by three Negro males, approx. 18 to 19 years of age and asked for a donation to the Black Panther Breakfast Fund. Mr. POLLOCK wrote out a \$10 check and gave it to these three subjects and they wrote him a receipt. This receipt was shown to this officer and was signed with R.V. last MIXMARKE name appeared to be POSTON. Mr. POLLOCK stated that he was not threatened when asked for this donation. While talking with Mr. POLLOCK it appeared to this officer that Mr. POLLOCK was a little embarressed to tell this officer that he had made a contribution to the Black Panther Breakfast Fund. If this man is approached by detectives at a later date he should be approached very cautiously as he appeared to be bit shy to talk to officers about the donation. Mr. POLLOCK still has the receipt in his possession and will hang onto it if detectives should want to look at it.

Sir: Mr. MC MANUS told us that about 4 mos. ago he was contacted by Kent Ford who demanded money for the Black Panther Breakfast Program. MC MANUS advised he sent an employee to check on the program, and found that the Panthers were serving breakfast to school children at that time, and so donated \$25. a month to the program. This in the belief that it might bring relief to his company from vandalism that

they have recently incurred.

MC MANUS states he has given approx. 4 donations \$25. each the last being 6/8/70, at that time he received a receipt signed by an R.V. POSTON.

It should be noted that the Intelligence Div. has a list of the Breakfast coordinator Committee for the Black Panthers and lists a LINDA THOMPSON on the staff and Asst. Staff containing 6 names one of them being R.V. POSTON.

MR. MC MANUS told us that he has never been threatened by the people who come in to receive these donations, however, he does not give because he wishes to, but because he feels that if he doesn't there will be trouble.

MR. MC MANUS gave us a picture of the most recent check given to the Panther Organization, and a picture of the receipt signed by R.V. POSTON. This is with this report.

Sir: Continuing this investigation we contacted MR. OLSON who informs us that he was first approached about the Black Panther Breakfast Program by two negro females about 1 yr. ago, the girls came in asking for money and was given \$25. in cash. MR. OLSON received a receipt, however, was unable to locate

same. After viewing mug pictures, picked JOYCE RADFORD as possibly being one of the females.

MR. OLSON was again contacted about 3 wks. ago by a negro male who he knows as KENT FORD, states FORD asked for money for the recently installed clinic for blacks at Vanc. & Russell. OLSON turned him down and was contacted a few days later, again by FORD and finally after about 3 contacts by FORD, OLSON wrote out a check for \$25. for the Hampton Memorial Fund. This on 5/20/70. The check came back stamped Paid to the Credit of payee Freedom Bank of America. There was no signature under the endorsement.

MR. OLSON stated he was not threatened, however, he did make a payment because he felt there would be trouble if he didn't. MR. OLSON does not approve of the Black Panther Program, and states he does not appreciate the attitude of the Black Panthers when soliciting funds as they do not ask for them, they demand them.

MR. OLSON informs us he was contacted by Boysen Paints about 1 week ago a nd told that that two negro females would come in and he was to give them paint for a home that they were fixing up in the Albina area. This home was to be used to teach a black education center, Boysen paints was to pay the bill. OLSON said a JOYCE L. BRADEN supposedly a student from Reed College did come in with another girl and picked up 10 gallons of paint, Boysen Paints paid for the paint.

OLSON would be a willing witness should he be called upon to testify.

Valley Decorating Co. at 2030 N. Williams stated that they had been approached. They stated that they felt that they had been intemidated, but that there had been no actual threats. Kent Ford was identified as being one of the subjects.

We next contacted Saltsman Mtrs. NE. Union & Shaver. They gave a check for five dollars, were not threatened but felt some p ressure. Dave Dawson also came in and sp oke to them about a new car. He mentioned that if he got a good enough price it would probably be good fire insurance but did not press the subject.

We could find no other businesses in east prec. that admitted to being to contacted and apparently the businesses previously listed are all that have been contacted as of this time. We also contacted the special in Penney's at the Lloyd Center and no businesses there have been approached.

This is a black over red Ford with blue paint splotches. Also the veh is missing a bood. The veh was parked bet a garbage truck and another veh and no one was moving around the location.

Surveillance was kept on this veh for a perios of time, however no subjs came to the veh and the writers left the area.

NARRATIVE

Sir: On Thursday, June 12th, Miss WRIGHT presented herself at the Detective Office at 1:30pm for a pre-arranged interview.

Miss WRIGHT had formerly been employed at the Grandma's Cookies on N. Vancouver just prior to the recent fire-bombing of that establishment.

Just prior to the burning of Grandma's Cookies Miss WEIGHT was in conversation in the Grandma's Cookies lunch room with one RONALD J. HENNE, 4618 NE 30th, phone- 282-5806.

Mr. HENNE had been talking of the recent burning of the Allied Plating when Miss WRIGHT made the remark that Grandma's Cookies is also on the list. This statement was the reason for our interview with Miss WRIGHT.

Miss WRIGHT was interrogated in interrogation room A. Miss WRIGHT is a White female and informs us that she has been going with Colored males from the Albina area for the last several months. She has been closely associated with a JOHN FRATER, Colored male, 22 yrs, 6', 195#, medium dark complexion, address-100 N Cook, employed at Northwest Natural Gas. Miss WRIGHT states that she believes FRATER is not involved in any of the illegal activities in the Albina area and thinks that he is straight.

Miss WRIGHT also has gone with a LEO WASHINGTON alias RAYMOND RODREQUES. Approximately 25 years, Colored, 5'11", 165#, address- 3929 N Mallory, and has worked part time at the Sheritan Hotel as a busboy. Miss WRIGHT states that WASHINGTON is from the San Francisco area. Miss WRIGHT believes that WASHINGTON is involved in several illegal activities in the Albina area however would not elaborate. She states that WASHINGTON told her that Grandma's Cookies and the Fred Meyer store at Union and Killingsworth were on a fire-bombing list. WASHINGTON also told WRIGHT that some stores in the Lloyd Center area would be fire-bombed, those showing prejudice.

Miss WRIGHT stated that this was all of her knowledge of the fire-bombing activity in the Albina area. States that she did not know how WASHINGTON came by his information, nor did she know who was going to be involved in the fire-bombings.

Miss WRIGHT advised that she also knew a GEORGE DAVIS, 25 years, 6'2", 220#, Colored male who works as a security guard at the Silk Hat. DAVIS hangs around with the subject WASHINGTON.

Miss WRIGHT also admitted knowing an ANTHONY STONE, Colored male, address unknown, and a GALE FARE (phonetic spelling), Colored male, address-103 Blandina, 23 years, 6', 150#, employed at Victory Bumpbr on SE Lincoln.

Miss WRIGHT was shown the pictures of severl suspects in fire-bombings in the Albina area and from the group picked only the picture of FREDDIE WHITLOW stating that she had seen him at the Silk Hat with a cirl friend? Miss WRIGHT disclaimed any further knowledge of this situation and the interview was terminated.

Detective Chappel was contacted by Miss WRIGHT's mother and told that Miss WRIGHT would likely be not completely honest as she tends to have sympathy with the subjects in the Albina area.



NARRATIVE

Sir: While working Special Detail, contacted the Kienow's Grocery Store at NE 33rd & Schuyler. Contacted the Assistant Mgr., JOSEPH MARLER. He stated he was contacted on 6/15/70 by two NBC, approx. 16 years, with a typed form asking for donations to the United Church of Christ. He informed them that they would have to get their donations from the main office on River Road in Milwaukie, Oregon. He also stated that he does not know whether he would be able to identify these individuals or not later on.

Contacted the mgr. at the HELEN BERNHARD BAKERY at 1717 NE Broadway. The subject's name was BEN BERNHARD. He stated that he had a letter from a group indicating that most of the Model City's planning board members, which he is a member of, have contributed \$10 and they would like to know whether he would contribute this amount or not. He recalls that the letter was from the Black & White Unity Grag Organization, however at this date he has not been contacted to contribute. The subject BERNHARD does not recall when he got the letter, nor has he had the chance to check with the other members of the Model City to see if they have actually contributed.

Contacted the Cycle Hub Motorcycle Shop at 3602 NE Sandy, ph. 232-9253. The subject's name was CLIFF MAJHOR. He stated that on 5/26/70 he was contacted in the morning by a female subject who asked if they would like to make a donation to the Black & White Unity Organization. They stated that if they would like to sony contribute \$50 to place an ad in their paper, this could be arranged. He then decided that this was too much money whereby a final sum of \$17.50 was agreed on by the two parties. There was some mention also in the conversation about money for the float for the Rose Festival for the Albina district. In the afternoon, two females, both white, showed up and asked for the contribution to the Black & White Unity Organization of a woman waiting on customers by the name of SHARON TROXEL. She went back to MR MAJØHOR who stated this was alright and thereby she issued a check #5669 to the First National Bank, Hollywood Branch, to the subjects. They gave her a receipt however, in the confusion of many customers in the store, asked for it back to check it and the subject TROXEL never got the receipt back. The checking account # is 024163. They stated that the cancelled check will be back in their hands by July 10th, 1970 for any investigations or they could contact the Hollywood Branch to see who endorsed the back of the check. The subjects were described as: #1 - WF, in her fifties, 5'2", 145 lbs., gray brown hair, wearing a howedress of unknown color. She stated that she could possibly id the subject. #2 - described as WF, 19 to 20, 5'5", 120 lbs., long dark hair.





NARRATIVE

Sir: We contacted the SPEAR BEVERAGE CO. at 3808 N. Williams, ph 288-5726, and talked to the owner MATT SPEAR and he stated that several times during the last five or six months he has been contacted by the Black Panthers regarding donations. MR SPEAR did not come out and mention the name BLACK PANTHER, but he stated after seeing a picture of a Negro male on television and he stated it was KENT FORD(?). He said of the several times this subj cam in all were for donations to the Black Panther Breakfast Fund.

MR SPEAR stated that ford acted in a very gentlemanly manner at all times, and SPEAR himself seemed to be impressed in the way FORD did handle himself.

MR SPEAR stated he either wrote a check to him or on some occasions gave him cash, and each time it was \$10 to \$15. On several occasions FORD came in alone, but on at least one occasion he said it was a female who came in for donations. MR SPEAR thought that the female gave the name something similar to RUTHEREORD, but ne doesn't recall. SPEAR stated the last time FORD was in was approx two weeks ago; and he didn't know whether FORD had been in sinc then, as MR SPEAR is out of town quite a bit of the time away from his job. SPEAR stated that at no time has he been threatened or has he been forced in any way for contributions, that FORD is very polite and does not say that he will be returning or does he leave any indication as to when he will be back.

MR SPEAR stated he had never been contacted by any one else regarding any other form of contribution or donations or solicitations, and MR SPEAR himsel did not seem to let this meeting with KENT FORD bother him at all.

Next contacted the Flower Shop (Nick's Flower Shop) 4040 NE Union, ph 281-118 We talked to ERIC SUNDHOLM, who works in the shop five days a week, and he stated that about one week ago a Negro male about 18 yrs of age came in and asked for a donation for the Black Panther Lunch Fund. When SUNDHOLM stated that they were overly solicited and that he would be unable to donate, the Negro youth simply left leaving no threats or implying he may be back. MR SUNDHOLM stated they do have many broken windows in the greenhouse located at this address and that they don't operate the actual green house any more due to the excessive number of broken windows. We dod not know if this is any reflection at all on the fact that he does not donate any type of funds for the Black Panther cause. MR SUNDHOLM stated they do contribute to several Negro churches in the area, and he feels that these are all legitimate.

We contacted the manager in Salzman Motors located at NE Union and Shaver and talked to the young man in there; he stated he had already been contacted by plain clothes officers. We didn't go into any details, and I did not get his name, but I'm under the impression that he has been giving to the Black

Panther Breakfast Fund voluntarily to avoid any trouble. He mentioned the sums of \$10 or \$15 periodically but did not go into detail and then left to talk to a customer at that time.

Went to Billy's Tavern at 6811 N. E. Union & contacted the owner there. CHARLES KEATON. He stated at this time that he had several of his customers tell him that a few of the other taverns had been approached and asked for money, this being \$7.50 a month, from the Union Ave. Boosters. He said his patrons had informed him that the approach was usually made by a white female blond representing herself as a member of the Union Ave. Boosters and asking for a monthly donation of \$7.50. The white female informed these business owners that if the money was not paid, the business would be burned. MR KEATON informed us that one of these business places involved was the Who's In Tavern. (WHOZ INN Tavern/right spelling), at 2238 N. E. Alberta. A short time later we went to the Whoz Inn Tavern where we balked briefly with a part-time bar tender. We did not identify ourselves at the time to the bartender, but he did inform us that the owner of the bar will be working this week from 9pm to lpm because of Jury duty. The owner usually bartends at the tavern during the day-time hours, and will do so next week when he returns from jury duty. It seems advisable that the detectives contact this owner either after 9 p.m. in the evening or possibly some time next week. MR KEATON was unable to give us the names of any other business places who may have been approached and asked for money.

We contacted the owner of LEONARD'S Market, 3965 N. Mississippi; he stated that approx six months to one year ago he was contacted by the Black Panthers (aprx three in number) who came to his store and asked him to advertise in the Black Panther newspaper. He said he did not wish to advertise in the newspaper, and the three subjects then left the store without making any threats.

We then proceeded to the FLOYD CENTER at 4511 NE Union. Here we interviewed JOSEPH PULLIAM. He is part owner of the Floyd Center Automobile Sales and stated that the Black Panthers have been in to his place of business and asked for donations to the Breakfast Fund. He stated he did not give any contributions to the Black Panthers, stating that the Panthers did not threaten him,

Contacted Nationwide Finance at 4008 NE Union, mgr being JAMES ALLAN, who said that last week he had three NBC teen agers come into his place of business and ask for money donation to the Black Panther Breakfast Fund. MR ALLAN stated he did not have the authority to donate to this type of organization. He said that the three NBC subjects looked very discouraged and left his place of business. They did, however, leave behind a small advertisement asking for donations to the Breakfast Fund. This paper is entitled, "BLACK PANTHER PARTY CARE OF SANDRA BRITT, 5255 N. Vancouver, Portland." This paper will be attache to this report.

Sir: Interviewed the owner of Gold Hammer Customs Slip Covers at 839 N. Killingsworth. The owner there EDWIN GOLDHAMMER stated that in May of this year, he was approached by a white female who came to his business place and asked for a donation to the Black & White Unity Organization. He stated that the woman was polite and she gave to her \$7.50 in the form of a check. The female gave him a receipt for \$7.50 from the Black & White Unity. Black and White Unity is located at 927 SW Oak. The receipt that the woman gave to MR. GOLDHAMMER will be attached to this report.

GOLDHAMMER stated that he has not been approached by any other organization other than the Black & White Unity.

We then proceeded to the Piedmont Floor Covering Store at 3525 NE Union. There we interviewed the owner STEPHEN A. MACEK, home phone, 223 8041. He stated that Black Panthers have been into his business establishment and asked him for contributions on several occasions, the last being 3 weeks ago. MR. MACEK was first approached by the Black Panthers approx. 6 to 7 months ago.

MR. MACEK stated that everytime the Panthers want something from his store, they either come in groups of 2 or 3. The Panthers have obtained from this store 2 gallons of paint, several paint brushes, and have asked for money donations to the Black Panther Breakfast fund. MR.MACEK stated that he has not been threatened by the Black Panthers, however, these officers felt while in interrogating MACEK he may have been trying to cover up some fear. MACEK is cooperative and the return visit by the Police to talk to him will not be met with any resistance.

On the last visit to MACEK's store, they left literature asking for contributions to the Black Panther Breakfast fund. Part of this literature will be attached to this report.

Went to the Piedmont Pharmacy at 3837 NE Union and talked with owner Terrill CRIPE. He stated that Kent Ford had been in and asked for donations to the Black Panther Breakfast Fund twice and/the last few months. CRIPE has refused to donate money to this fund and stated that he had not been threatened.

Interviewed EARL REPP, owner of Repp;s Market at 3904 NE Union. MR. REPP stated that several Black Panthers had come into his market just after the first of January and asked for food contributions to the Black Panther Breakfast Fund. MR. REPP stated that the 2nd time the Black Panthers came into his market and asked for donations

Sir: On 6-17-70 Officer Swetman and myself were detailed to make a preliminary survey of the businesses in our district. (Dist 51, East Prec. boundaries between SE Stark, NE Broadway, E. 21st and the Willamette River on the west).

We contacted the major businesses of the Lloyd Center personally and contacted the Lloyd Center Security Capt. and informed him of the solicitation problem that we were having. We requested that he contact the remaining Lloyd Center businesses thru the business managers on a discreet basis and then relay his findings to Sgt Schwartz of the Larc Detail. The Captain stated that he would personally see that our request was followed thru inside the shortest possible time span.

We contacted Security Officer Froke of J. C. Penney Co., 1100 Lloyd Center, who stated that approx one month ago the store was solicited by three NBC males in their late teens or early 20's, but that they got no farther than the switchboard operator before they were discouraged.

We then contacted the Safeway store, NE 10th & Broadway, MR ROGER JOHNSON, Mgr. He stated that approx one week ago their asst Mgr was contacted by one Negro male subj who told him he was a member of the Black Panther Organization and requested an immediate contribution of \$2,500 to free him. He continued clarifying his request in that he was actually being held captive by them and the \$2,500 would enable him to buy his freedom. MR JOHNSON stated that his Ass't Mgr was gullible enough to believe the story but the subject received no money from the store, and the Ass't Mgr has since been replaced. The Mgr stated the incident was reported to the police and Officers Chase & Newman, Dist Car 63, did the report.

We contacted the Foreman & Clark store in the Lloyd Center and spoke with the Mgr. who stated that the only incident of solicitation he could recall happened about five to six weeks ago, when three NBC juveniles carried a taped together cardboard box with a hole at the top and came into the store requesting contributions but he could not remember what for or how much they wanted or whom they represented.

The Simmons Credit company owned by a MR JIM SIMMONS of 1023 NE Union stated that he had been solicited a number of times for ads in some of the Black Panther Communities newspapers, mostly by JIMMIE BANG BANG WALKER, however, aside from this the only incident of contribution he could recall was giving to the Sponsorship of Albinas entry into the Rose Festival Parade. SIMMONS made no mention of the amount (s) of his contributions.



ARSON INVESTIGATION LT STILL 6-17-70

The Lafayette Radio Co. owned by MR and MRS WASSON, 631 NE Grand Ave., stated they had been contacted last Thursday by one lone NBC Subj who was applying for a job. He was informed that they had no openings. He then began a series of questions such as:

"Have you ever hired Blacks?" "Why not?"

"What is your attitude in the hiring of blacks?" etc.

MRS WASSON stated that the subject went so far as to touch one of the clerks and asked if her being touched by a black person bothered her. MRS WASSON stated the subject was in the store for approx one hour and upon leaving he stated that he would return.

All of the abve businesses were instructed by the officers to notify the police dept immediately upon being confronted by solicitations from any source. They were instructed to contact Sgt Schwartz of the Larc. Detail or the East Prec.

The Mgr of the Upjohn Co. at 1333 NE Union suggested that we employ the Better Business Bureau as a means of contacting all of the business owners in the city. This could be used at a later date after the security portion of the detail was more lax.

Sir: Contacted the Albina Transmission Co. 4545 NE Union and spoke with the owner there THOMAS LUCAS. At that time he stated that on 6/8/70 three NBC subjects whom he described as being 16-18 yrs. of age, came to his place of business and asked for a donation to the breakfast for school children program. He told the three subjects that he did not have any money to donate to the program, but would donate \$1. and did so in the form of a check and he received a receipt from the NBC subjects signed CLAUDE HAWKINS. This receipt is dated 6/8/70 and will be attached to the original copy of this report.

He stated that he was not actually threatened by any of the three subjects, however, did inform us that he did not like the attitude of the three NBCs when he stated he would only donate \$1. MR. LUCAS has not been contacted other than this one time regarding a donation to the breakfast for school children program.

At the time of the interview with MD. INCAS, he appeared to be very hesitant in answering our questions and was perspiring a great deal. His voice also appeared to be very nervous.

I contacted C & C Motors 4747 NE Union, 288 6151, and talked to the Manager owner Ron Compton. He stated that on this past Monday 6/15/70 a group representing the Black Panthers came into his place of business asking for donations to the Black Panther Breakfast Fund. He stated that he did not have his checkbook at the office with him, and that if they would come back tomorrow which would be Tues. 6/16/70 that he would give them a check. They did not return and he has not heard from them since. The owner states that he gave for their denstienfund a donation of \$10 to \$15. approx. 1 yr. ago. He states that it was a female accompanying several males when they came in asking for the money. MR. COMPTON did not state much about their attitude and it didn't seem to bother him one way or another about the donation.

He also states that the people that came in this past Monday were young in their late teens, early 20's possibly, but definitely did represent the Black Panthers. When asked if he would have issued a check to them if he had his checkbook with him at the time or if they came back the following day, he stated that he would give them \$10. or \$15.

MR. COMPTON's attitude toward us was very favorable, and he appeared to answer any questions that we asked him without any pause.

I contacted M & H Garage 4100 NE Union, 284 9417, and talked with part owner GARY HAMES. I asked him the usual routine questions and he appeared extremely innocent and honest about the whole thing during the short interview. This is a Time Service Station in a rather rundown condition, and the young owner appeared to be kind of glad to see us leave the premises, although we did have a megative report from this business.

The following are a list of the places of business we contacted with negative results other than minor incidents in which people are consistently contacting them regarding one type of a donation or another some very legitimate and some not so legitimate where some children are involved in the dealings. 

At the request of Lt. Hewlett, I contacted three information sources concerning the Black Panther Breakfast Program. I first talked with Rev. Sam Johnson of the United Highland Church of Christ. Rev. Johnson told me the Black Panther Breakfast Program has been suspended for the summer, that there are plans to reinstate the program when school begins in September. Rev. Johnson seemed to be in sympathy with the Black Panthers and talked at some length at why he supported the panther programs. Nothing of value was gained from the conversation, other than to learn of the program's temporary suspention.

I also talked with Mr. F F Runyon of Runyon's 88¢ Store. Mr. Runyon told me that he has continued to contribute \$75 monthly to the Black Panthers for their various programs. Kent Ford called for the usual donations for the month of July, but told Mr. Runyon that the program for school children had been suspended for the summer and therefore he would not accept the \$25 donation for that program. However, he did accept \$50 for the Malcolm X Dental Clinic and the Fred Hempton People's Health Clinic.

I then talked with Mr. L Leviske, General Manager of McDonalds. Mr. Leviske states that he has continued to donate \$ 50 lbs of hamburger meakager meat per week to the Albina Community Action Center. Although the receipt is made out the this organization, the donation is always picked up by Kent Ford or one of his associates. They recently argued about the receipt being made out to the Albina Community Action Center. Ford argued that the receipt should be made out in the name of the Black Panthers, however, Leviske stated the agreement was to donate it to the Community Action Center and he would not deviate from this agreement. Mr. Leviske added that all receipts are locked in his safe and are available for photo copy to any law enforcement agency.

These two subjects operated together last night in a burglary which has been cleared up and with them was a colored subject. This subj desc as Negro male, 25 yrs, 5-10, 175-180%, two inch natural hair, small mustache and goatee, name unknown. This subj drives a yellow Olds. or white Pontiac Catalina, 2dr sedan with Washington plates, resides in the Chehalis Valley area. He carries a .357 mag. long bbl'd rev. and has both .38 Special and 357 ammo. This gun is carried in the waist band of his trousers and is covered by a jacket. Subj has indicated to MOSER and MARTIN that he is on a gun buying trip and is in the Portland area purchasing mescaline for sale in order to obtain money to go on a buying trip to Calif. for weapons. He intends to go into the Calif. area some time this week, will return after purchasing numerous weapons and will will sell them in the greater Portland area. Should add that this subject a Washington Plate on his vehicle, license number unknown.

Although MOSER and MARTIN cannot recall this Negro's name at this time, they believe it is similar to DAVE.

Both MOSER and MARTIN have been dealing in narcotics with two subjects residing in the Albina Dist. known to them as CHARLES and RANDY. CHARLES is described as Negro male, early 20's, drives a green Pontiac, year unknown. RANDY is desc. as white male, also in his early 20's, and possibly of a Jewish religion. RANDY drives five vehicles, three of which are Thunderbirds of /55 vintage, a fairly new motorcycle, and possibly a white Volkswagen. These subjects reside in the 3rd block north of Alberta in "C" shaped apts on the south side of the street between Vancouver and Williams Ave. They use the third door of this apt. and traffic/and out of rear door. There is a parking lot at the rear of these apts. They are allegedly very heavy dealers in narcotics in the Portland area known to MOSER and MARTIN as being a couple of the top dealers. They allegedly deal in all types of narcotics, mainly heroin, marijuana, and mescaline.

The subj RANDY makes numerous trips by air flight btwn Portland and Chicago, and Portland and Calif. He recently returned from Chicago and laid down six ounces of heroin on the dining room table, stating he had purchased it there. MOSER stated he believed these subjects are syndicated and they sell only as wholesalers in this area.

MOSER and MARTIN also deal with a colored subject by the name of JUNIOR WILLIAMS desc as Negro male, who drives one of the following automobiles: a white with black top Cadillac Conv., approx 1955 vehicle,

a plush green Corvair, 1960 vintage, or a

green Ford Falcon Station Wagon, 1961 vintage.

WILLIAMS lives across the street from the pool hall on Williams Ave. WILLIAMS occasionally works as a service station attendant at the Time Service Station at Williams & Fremont. WILLIAMS is supposedly dealing heavily in good heroin and guns.

MOSER stated he has been dealing with a RON HAYES, owner of the Top Shop, Union and Mason, this is an automobile upholstery Shop. HAYES is a fence who will buy most anything and is reportedly at this time buying diamonds and guns, mainly. MOSER states that HAYES is known to carry up to 20 diamonds in his wallet at all times. HAYES is reportedly selling most of his guns for the top dollar, this being approx \$50 for hand guns, and has a steady order from a Negro subject called "FAT ALBERT," FAT ALBERT is allegedly a leader in the Black Panther organization.

MOSER also told us that Leeco'S ? Art Motors is a leading fence for hot cars in the Portland area at this time. Cosarts are reported to purchase hot cars from auto thieves, repaint them, change the I.D. numbers and license numbers plates, place them on lots in the area and also trade them with gypsies mainly, who transport them either north or south from Portland. A subject by the name of KENNY (last name unknown) but it starts with the initial "T, " who is the service manager or sales manager at Lee Cos Arts ? is the got between for that concern. MOSER states that people can sell anything to KENNY by just walking in and contacting him usually in the service or the Paint Dept. KENNY is desc. as WM, 30 yrs, 5-8 to 9, fairly long brown hair. KENNY either buys the items out right or holds them for sale. Either KENNY or COART ? has some type of warehouse in the Vancouver, Wn. area where these hot items are stored prior to sale or movement. MOSER tells us that either oneJERRY WAND or MIKE SCROGGINS, who is a personal friend of KENNEY'S "T" could and probably would assist the police Dept in setting him up. Officer MAYHEW, NARCotics >

MOSER tells us that a person unknown to him who lives in the St Helens, Oregon area has been selling home made hand grenades in the Portland area. These are deviced with a pin, and according to MOSER, not too reliable. These hand grenades are selling for approx \$25 each. He informed us that JERRY WARD who is known to this Dept in the Narcotics Div. could make a buy from this subject in St. Helens.

After interviewing these subjects in the Jail office, we called the Narcotics Div. and we learned that JERRY WARD was there at the time. Arrangements were made with the Narcotics Officers Dennis Baker to transport WARD to the St Helens area this evening and try to purchase one of these hand grenades. This was done by Baker and WARD, however, they found that the subject was visiting in the Portland area this evening and it is unknown ifat present he is manufacturing said hand grenades. Narco Office EAKER is arranging to meet WARD tomorrow evening for another attempt at this subject and will make the follow up investigation on this phase.

MARTIN informed us that one MIKE DOYLE, known to this Dept., a burglary has been subsiding by manufacturing methodrine. He states that this subject's MO is to take four suticases and register in a motel, manufactur the first phase of the methodrine, then check out. The following day he registers into another motel, makes the final stages of the methodrine. He states that MIKE DOYLE does not use the same motel more than once.

It is not known to the writers just how reliable the above info is, however, both MARTIN and MOSER were interviewed at different times and gave basically the same information, however, as previously mentioned in the first part of the report, MOSER'S info was more extensive and lucid.

While waiting for the tow the writer observed a '61 whi Chev, lic# unk containing a large group of negro male HE subjs parked directly behind the police veh which was on the W side of the street on Vortawick near Failing. As the Chev passed by the writers they were able to detect the a boy mucking saying "There is that bald headed mother fucker; apparently referring to Off Martin. The veh then parked at the curb and several blk subjs dismounted and one RAYMOND JOE who is known to the writers got out of the car and said "There's that mother fucker, that had his club out up at Union and Going". The writers told MR JOE to refrain from using obscene language as there were several innocent parties looking out from themaix their windows due to the commotion outside. MR JOE continued to use abusive language without the affinities and attempted to provoke the writers into a fight. The writers cautioned MR JOE and his other unidentified companions to keep the noise level down. Approx 2 minutes after MR JOE maxed and his group had arrived, Black Panther leader KENT FORD appeared on the scene parking double parking his veh in the middle of the street. MR FCRD was asked by Off Newman to park his car properly and he xew refused to do so. MR FORD was subsequently issued tag #A103287 for double park. While completing the tag on MR FORD's car he pulled it over to the curb and began attempting to provoke the writers into an arrest. He stated that Off Newman had completed a false mit police report and had lied on him approx 1 month ago. He stated that he would show challenge in any of the officers to a dual at any place . Upon completing the tag on MR FORD's car it was place under the windshield wiper due to the fact that he had told the writers that he would not accept it because it would not be safe for them. After depositing the tast tag the writers proceeded to the police car and departed as the scene since the Gerlach Tow had arrived by the this time and towed the car that was originally involved. During the above incident, the only people that were known to the writers were MR FORD and MR JOE, however, most of the group appeared very, very militant and fight like. It is not known to the writer just how they knew the writers were at that particular location.

SUBJECT: Possible attempt on Police Officers on 7-11-70, time and location unknown.

SIR: While tagging a parked auto, this date, at approx 8:30PM at Vancouver and Shaver, I was approached by 2 young nbc subjs whom I have talked to before, one being a **Sector 1** age 14 years; the other being **Sector 1**, age 15 years. **Thé/shbjs** This officer has had contact with these subjs before, due to the fact that they monitor police calls. Subjs appear to be/pro-police, having given this officer minor items of info several times before that has turned out to be fairly reliable. They informed me that on this date, some time withing within probably the next 24 hours, an attempt would be made to entice a one or two-men car into such a location that a group of militants, they declined to say/they d be the Panthers or another militant group, would be able to either disable the car and the officers, or cause serious damage to either, or both. They declined to give any further information at this time, and rather than push the subjs, I felt it to be prudent to let the matter rest with the info they had given me.

Sir, after covering a call at a grocery store, 3965 N Mississippi, I was with officer Bates in the alley behind this store, re a call MAN WITH A GUN, had occasion to talk to several 15 to 16 white males in the alleyway behind the store; they live in a residence behind the store, and they informed us that approx 15 to 20 minutes prior to our receiving the call re the man with the gun, that they had heard what sounded like shots just N of Shaver in the block between Mississippi and the next street West. That they had observed a subj going Southbound on Mississippi at a high rate of speed in a veh which they learned several minutes later from their friends that this subj had apparently fired these shots. Subj went S one to two blocks from Shaver, then turned west. These officers upon returning to the front of the store, after all of the cars having cleared, had occasion to **EXEMPT** observe about 7 nbc males whom it is known are members, or associates of the Black Panther jparty, walking to the front of this store in a large group.

At 9PM, date, I had occasion to stop a car at Union and Fremont for making a prohibited left turn, this being a beige Volkswagen, 2/dr sedan, California BDJ 612, the veh was driven by one EUGENE CLARK, 10322 Knight Street, Oakland, Calif., phone 569-9149, dob 11-16-46. Calif Op Lic# P443501, and in talking to this subj he pointed out to me a bus, which at this time was westbound on Fremont approx 4 blocks W of my location which would be between Vancouver and Gantenbein, being followed very closely by two other vehs. He informed me that they had been following this/cat these cars and this bus as the 55 to 69 subjs in this car were currently headed for the area of Unthank Park and they did not want to get lost. The subj CLARK then informed me also that they, passengers and occupants of these cars and bus, were all from Oakland, Los Angeles, and ix the San Francisco-Sacramento area. He did not state why

they were up here. The passenger in the veh was a STEPHEN RICHARDSON, nbc male, 24 years old who stated he was also from Oakland, California, and declined to state why they were up in this area.

NARRATIVE:

Sir: Continuing this case, the writer and Sgt Schwartz met with MR LAVISKE and DDA Bruun and MR TARLOW in an effort to obtain a complaint against KENT FORD, LINDA THORNTON and SANDRA BRITT for extortion against the MAC DONALD HAMBURGER CORP.

The DA's Office declines to issue a complaint on this case, as they feel there is insufficient evidence at this time to prosecute. They did suggest that MR LAVISKE obtain a court order forbidding the subjects to picket his store at Union and Fremont. MR LAVISKE is obtaining legal counsel and will attempt this. This meeting took place at approx 3pm on 8/12/70.

While at the meeting, received a telephone call from the Assistant General Manager, Tom Wiggins, who advised that, at that time, 3pm, 8/12/70, there were approx 9 pickets at the store at Union and Fremont, six black and three white. Wiggins stated that these pickets were stopping the customers of MAC DONALD's, as they crossed the sidewalk handing them pamphlets and advising them against buying hamburgers at MAC DONALDS. Wiggins said the pickets were becoming very belligerent and forceful.

We were informed that later that evening, approx 6pm, 8/12/70, that the MAC DONALDS Hamburger stand was closed, due to the forcefulness of the pickets.

Sir: This date advised by Captain Taylor that he had been contacted regarding illegal picketing at McDonalds Hamburger at Union/Premont. The picketing was being conducted by a group of blacks because they had asked for a \$300 a month donation from MCDONALDS to further their programs and had been refused. Captain Taylor detailed me to meet a representative from MCDONALDS at NE 7/Fremont at 1:30 p.m.

Cars 72 and # 74, both two-man cars, along with Detectives Griffiths and Walker and ID man, Schloth, and myself met with Mr. Laviske, the general manager at NE 7/Fremont. I explained the law of trespass to Mr. Laviske and that he would have to order the pickets off his property, and if they failed to leave, he could arrest them. He was also advised that the pickets could legally picket on the sidewalk but could not legally block the entrance and exits.

At this point it was mutually decided that Mr. Laviske and myself would proceed to MCDONALDS and Mr. Laviske would advise the pickets to leave. We were met there by the Detectives, ID man, who observed and listened to the conversation. Upon arrival we located KENT FORD and I asked him if he was in charge of the pickets and he affirmed this. I advised him that Mr. Laviske did not want the pickets on his premises and that they could be arrested for trespassing if they didn't leave. I also told him that it was legal to picket on the sidewalk if the sidewalk was not blocked. Mr. Laviske then personally informed him to remove the pickets or they would be trespassing. FORD then removed his pickets to the sidewalk where they continued to picket. Mr. Laviske has made a report of the cause of the **diamyzeannia** disagreement to Sgt. Schwartz of Detectives, whose report should fill in the details of the request by KENT FORD. The picketing was legal and orderly upon our leaving.

NARRATIVE

Sir: This date MR LAVISKE, general manager of MacDONALDS HAMBERGER, came to this office, accompanied by his assistant, TOM WIGGINS. MR LAVISKE explained to us that about 6 weeks to two months ago his wife was contacted at home by LINDA THORNTON who called, asking for contribution to the breakfast for school children sponsored by the Black Panther program, #2 the Malcolm X Dental Clinic, and #3, the Fred Hampton People's Clinic. MISS THORNTON did not mention how much money was expected to be contributed.

MRS LAVISKE told THORNTON that she would have to contact her husband, MR LAVISKE.

THORNTON called back again about three weeks later and set up an appointment for her, THORNTON, and KENT FORD to meet with LAVISKE. MR LAVISKE said this appointment was never kept.

LINDA THORNTON called again on Thursday, July 30. THORNTON talked to MR LAVISKE and was very demanding and forceful, stating that she wanted cash for the before-mentioned three programs. MR LAVISKE told her that MacDONALDS did not give cash to contributions of this type, but might possibly give food for the breakfast program. THORNTON indicated this would not be acceptable and hung up.

Picketing started at MacDONALDS at Union and Fremont at about 12:15 AM August 1. The pickets were several teenage children, approximately 12 years, lead by LINDA THORNTON and two other adult negro females.

MR LAVISKE arrived at the MacDONALDS Hamburger store and asked LINDA THORNTON who was in charge and LINDA THORNTON said KENT FORD. KENT FORD then arrived at the MacDONALD store from about a half a block away and did talk with LAVISKE. LAVISKE asked FORD what they wanted and FORD turned to LINDA THORNTON and asked how much was needed and LINDA THORNTON said \$300; \$100 for each program and MR LAVISKE said this was not acceptible. FORD then asked for one penny on every dollar of business. FORD said the

other merchants on the street were contributing and said the little store down the street is giving \$75 a month. Did not indicate what store. LAVISKE asked for a delay to make a decision, after he could talk with his partners and it was agreed that they would meet again on Tuesday, 11 AM.

LAVISKE did meet with FORD and another individual at 11 AM on Tuesday told him he could not make contact with his partners and advised that he would like to contact FORD again on Thursday. FORD answered in the affirmative and said he would be at the dental clinic all day Thursday.

MR LAVISKE said two black representatives from MacDONALDS Hamburger did arrive on the plane from Chicago on Thursday and they went to the dental clinic and was unable to locate FORD. They spent the entire day in the Albina area trying to locate FORD without success and the two representatives returned to Chicago without contact being made.

Friday, 8/7/70, NATE PROBY called and met with MR LAVISKE about 1 PM.

MR PROBY told LAVISKE that he thought he could get KENT FORD off of MR LAVISKE's back if LAVISKE would contribute \$100 for advertisement fees to a radio program that NATE PROBY runs.

MR LAVISKE made a tape of this conversation; however, did not agree to contribution.

On Monday afternoon, August 10, MR LAVISKE received a telephone call from a male who requested that LAVISKE call MR FORD or SANDRA at phone no. 282-5115. MR LAVISKE called MR FORD at 10 AM on Tuesday, August 11, and told him that he would not make a commitment for any contribution. This telephone conversation was recorded.

Picketing started again on Tuesday, August 11, at approximately 11:30 AM. See Officers Report by Sgt. Hempe.

MR LAVISKE is very desireous of signing a complaint if this is possible. The possibility was discussed as to MR LAVISKE obtaining a civil restraining order against the KENT FORD group.

MR LAVISKE was advised if further contact is made by this group, to contact Sgt. Schwartz who will detail someone to take the information.

We attempted to contact MR LARRY BRUEN of the DA's Office who will be assigned to this case; however, was unable to make contact at the writing of this report. DDA Bruen will be advised of these facts.



Summary of investigation of the possible extortion case, Solicitation of Funds from small businesses for the Black Panther breakfast program in the Albina area.

NARRATIVE

Sir: On June 10, 1970, we were directed by Lt. Still to conduct an investigation on a possible extortion. This being the solicitation of funds from small businesses in the Albina area by the Black Panthers breakfast program.

Detective Smith and Davis along with several uniformed officers from East Precinct and North Precinct did contact a number of small businesses in that area.

The reports on the businesses contacted and the results of the contacts are contained in this case file.

This case file was forwarded to Deputy District Attorney Bruun on June 19. DDA Bruun did consult with DDA Desmond Connall and on June 29, advised Lt. Still that at the present time, there was not enough evidence of extortion to take this case before the Grand Jury.

The reports indicate that KENT FORD assisted by FREDDIE WHITLOW, SANDRA BRITT, and LINDA THOMPSON, and other unknown negro males, have by intimidation been obtaining money from the Albina businesses for the Black Panther breakfast program. The business people in the area that have given to the program largely did so because of fear of retaliation from this group, either in the form of vandalism or fire bombing. However, the DA's Office feels that the evidence available is not sufficient at this time to obtain a conviction in court.

This case was then split out and a copy was taken to the Record Division where it was numbered and filed.

A copy was forwarded to Lt. Still for his consideration and possibly obtaining a complaint against the subjects involved for soliciting funds
