Purpose of proposed legislation and background information:
In October 2017, the Portland City Council and the Multnomah County Board of Commissioners adopted parallel resolutions directing the development of this plan to guide the production of at least 2,000 new units of supportive housing in Multnomah County by 2028 (the Resolutions). The Resolutions required that the plan include the actual need for supportive housing, the total cost of meeting the 2,000-unit goal, an assessment of resources currently and prospectively available to meet the goal, and the necessary next steps for implementation. CSH prepared this report through extensive community stakeholder engagement, data gathering and analysis, and national best practices research.

## Financial and budgetary impacts:

Presentation of this report does not impact City revenues, does not impose any costs to the City, and does not impact staffing levels.

## Community impacts and community involvement:

The report is a product of an intensive community involvement process, which included regular meetings of two stakeholder groups comprised of local and state funding entities and service providers, presentations and feedback from to A Home for Everyone coordinating board and subcommittees, and inclusion of community member feedback with lived experience of homelessness. A summary of the stakeholder engagement process is summarized in "Appendix A: Stakeholder Engagement" of the report.
