Good afternoon, my name is Mary Sipe.

I support Mr. Salzberg's appeal of this Noise Variance Permit.

Apparently Son Latino has been holding these events since May without a Noise Variance Permit. Then when neighbors complained, they applied for a permit for their August, September and October events. Then when they did get a permit, they violated conditions of that permit.

- They did not provide notification to neighbors at least one week prior to the event.
- The sound was audible further than a block away.
- They did not reduce sound levels upon request.

This appeal is a great example of why the current appeal process needs to be revamped. Having appeals presented to City Council is cumbersome and ineffective.

This is a perfect example. The first event occurred on August 19<sup>th</sup>. Mr. Salzberg filed his appeal on August 22<sup>nd</sup>. The hearing was placed on the City Council Agenda four weeks later. In the meantime, two more events were scheduled.

Often there is no point in filing an appeal because the event or events have occurred before the hearing can be scheduled for City Council.

Three years ago on July 9, 2015 Paul Van Orden presented several proposals to City Council to amend the Noise Code, Title 18.

One of those proposals was to have appeals of noise variances be brought before the Code Hearings Officer rather than City Council. A Noise Task Force was formed to explore the merits of those proposals. I was appointed to that Noise Task Force by Commissioner Fritz. Unfortunately the Task Force was unable to come to consensus and did not make any further recommendations.

When Mr. Van Orden presented his Noise Office update to City Council last August, the proposal to have appeals heard by the Code Hearings Officer was one of his five priorities, yet it has still not been presented to City Council for consideration.

It is time to stop talking about the much needed revisions and updates to the City's Noise Code and start doing something.

Why did Mr. Salzberg even need to file an appeal?

The Noise Variance Permit states:

"Violation of the conditions of this variance constitutes ground for revocation of the variance..."

Mr. Van Orden has the authority to revoke and/or modify the permit when conditions are violated.

It is my understanding that a citation was issued. That is good, but why wasn't the permit revoked or revised?

This permit is also an example of the concerns I have expressed about the structure of the Noise Variance Fee Schedule.

This permit is for events occurring on 5 Sundays. The fee that was charged was \$205.00 for an accelerated review.

The Noise Office considers this one event but it is actually 5 events.

The way I see it is they should have been charged \$205 for the August 19<sup>th</sup> event plus \$105 for Sept 2<sup>nd</sup>, Sept 16<sup>th</sup> & Sept 30<sup>th</sup> & Oct 14<sup>th</sup>...for a total of \$625.

Why are we not charging for every event? Like I said in my testimony a couple of months ago...the more days they make noise the less they pay!!

Dear Toni,

I'd like to appeal the noise variance filed for Son Latino on the roof of Yoga Union for August 19, September 2, 16, 30, and October 14th for the following reasons:

1) Failure to notify affected residents promptly, per 18.14.020.

Applicant informed neighbors of the event taking place Sunday August 19th event by flyer on Friday August 17th, which happened after city offices were closed for the weekend, leaving no reasonable time for neighborhood input.

2) The owner of the building permit #2012-176292-LU failed to disclose on the initial application that he would be operating amplified outdoor events during evening hours.

When public input was requested during the permit review process, the owner did not disclose that there would be loud events that may affect the residences, which surround the property on all three sides.

- 3) The Yoga Union rented the space and the sound equipment to a third party and had them apply for a noise variance independently. 18.14.020 says variances are the responsibility of the owner/operator of the sound devices.
- 4) The events are audible up to three blocks away (e.g. on Lincoln street at 50th) and are intolerably loud on Sherman Street.

This is a residential zone, and therefore should be treated as such. One residence is immediately adjacent to the property. This is not a downtown club zone. This is not a commercial zone.

5) The events are not just occurring on weekend nights; the 10pm end time is too late for people who must be in bed by 8pm.

Last Sunday my partner was still unable to sleep in an insulated basement with closed windows, earplugs and a pillow over her head because of the noise.

6) The Yoga Union is inconsistent with their noise variance applications.

Although there was a variance for the above events, this business is routinely broadcasting amplified events from their rooftop, without any consideration to those around. This was the only time a variance was filed, as far as I know.

I and many of my neighbors are willing to come to a hearing if needed. I have spoken with a number of my neighbors who are fed up with Yoga Union's loud rooftop events. This area specifically has greatly increased it's residential density, not it's commercial density, therefore this zone should be used for daytime retail business, as the original permit was filed, not regular open-air amplified events.

Notice should not simply include the residents who live right on that block, but is intended to reach other neighbors who are impacted by the request for a noise variance.
- F. Applicant will notify the Noise Office at (503) 823-5350 or at <a href="mailto:noise@portlandoregon.gov">noise@portlandoregon.gov</a> of any rain cancellation and alternate Sunday to be used in place of the listed dates.
- G. Applicant will notify the Noise Office at (503) 823-7350 of any complaints they receive. The Applicant will keep a record of how they responded to concerns raised by the community in order to report their actions back to the Noise Control Office.



#### To the Applicant:

- 1. Carry this document with you during the activity. This is not a permit to make more noise than is minimally necessary for your needs.
- 2. Violation of the conditions of this variance constitutes grounds for revocation of the variance, and denial of future applications, and may also result in the issuance of citation(s) for violations of City Code.

3. If a Police or Noise Control Officer should appear, his/her instructions will supersede this variance and take precedence.



- **I.** Appeals to City Council. A variance decision of the Noise Control Officer or the Noise Review Board may be appealed to the City Council as follows:
- 1. Eligibility to appeal. A variance decision may be appealed by the applicant, his legal representative, any affected neighborhood association, or any person who has submitted oral or written testimony on the application.
- 2. Appeal acceptance criteria. Notice of intent to appeal shall be in writing to the City Auditor's Office within 10 days of the effective date of the decision. The notice shall identify the decision that is being appealed, and include the appellant's name, address, and signature, phone number, relationship to the variance decision action, and a clear statement of the specific reason(s) for the appeal including any alleged misapplication of City Codes.
- **3.** Upon receipt of such appeal, the Auditor shall then place the matter upon the Calendar of the City Council.
- **4.** At the time of the hearing, the City Council may consider such new matter as it deems appropriate, as well as the record developed before the Noise Control Officer or the Noise Review Board, and thereafter may affirm, reverse, modify or remand the decision
