

**ORDINANCE No.** 189180

\*Authorize an Intergovernmental Agreement with Metro to contribute \$25,000 in cooperation with Metro and other agencies to participate on a committee to study the needs and develop a plan to address the lack of available trade-based skilled labor to work on government projects in the Portland region (Ordinance)

The City of Portland Ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. The Chief Administrative Officer in January 2017 agreed in principle to partner with METRO and other local government agencies to jointly fund a study with the intent of developing a strategy to implement a regional approach to support career opportunities for women and people of color in the construction trades.
2. The City has contributed Fifty Thousand dollars (\$50,000.00) to this study and has received the report developed by METRO in conjunction with their consultant.
3. The Intergovernmental Agreement attached as Exhibit A contains the Scope of Work and responsibilities of all participating agencies of which the City of Portland is one.
4. This IGA requires additional participatory funding of Twenty-Five Thousand dollars (\$25,000)

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:


- a. The Chief Procurement Officer is hereby authorized to execute an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) with METRO as a contribution to participate on the panel which will engage and manage the consultant who will convene the members and facilitate the development of the strategy.
- b. The Chief Procurement Officer is authorized to execute amendments to this IGA provided they have been approved as to form by the City Attorney's Office and provided such amendments do not increase the financial obligations of the City.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay in payment would delay the start of this critical study. Therefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.


