IMPACT STATEMENT

Legislation title: Authorize disposal of usable surplus equipment pursuant to City Code

5.36 (Ordinance)

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Purpose of proposed legislation and background information:

Portland Police Bureau (PPB) uses ruggedized laptops in their police vehicles, called Mobile Data Computers (MDCs) to access law enforcement databases and write reports. PPB contracts internally with the Bureau of Technology Services (BTS) to provide expertise and procurement functions for technological equipment.

The FBI's CJIS rules require that PPB have more than just one security measure (authentication) in place to login to computers that access their system, necessitating the purchase of external hardware to provide two-factor authentication. BTS provided POSH MX5-K9 units, which are Smart Card/RFID readers.

The bureau's current MDCs have reached the end of their useful lives and are being replaced. The bureau has selected new MDCs that have two-factor authentication built-in, making the MX5-K9 units unnecessary.

The Bureau of Technology Services has determined that selling these units back to the manufacturer, POSH Mfg. USA, LLC (POSH), is the most cost-effective and efficient option for disposal, per City Code 5.36.010.

Financial and budgetary impacts:

The PPB will gross approximately \$12,250 from the sell-back of the MX5-K9 units to POSH.

Community impacts and community involvement:

There should be no measurable impact on the community regarding this issue.
