ORDINANCE No. 189199

Authorize contract with Northwest Disability Support for Bike First! bike camp scholarships for students with disabilities who live within Portland city limits or attend a school within Portland city limits for \$30,000 (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- Safe Routes to School offers Bike Safety Education during the school year to 4th/5th/6th grade students at a limited number of schools.
- 2. If a teacher requests an adaptive bike for a student to be able to participate in Bike Safety Education, we make one available.
- Physical activity is 4.5 times lower for children with a disability. Obesity rates for children with disabilities is 38% higher than children without a disability.
- 4. NW Disability Support promotes advocacy and education for an inclusive community through two organizations, one being All Born In.
- 5. Bike First! is an event sponsored by All Born In and was founded in Portland, Oregon in 2006, serving over 400 children in their program.
- Students who experience a variety of disabilities have had success at the Bike First! clinics—some of these conditions include Down syndrome, mild to moderate autism, mild cerebral palsy, visual impairments, extreme fear of falling, fine motor skills, and other developmental delays.
- 7. Through careful research into the elemental physics of bicycle riding, Dennis Blong and his team designed and built a unique type of adapted bike that enables the rider and bike to function together as a system. The new design uses air cylinders to gently cushion the rider while keeping the rider safely upright. As the rider's skill develops over the course of the week, the air pressure is gradually reduced until the rider is on his/her own. The bike mechanic and floor director make the necessary adjustments and guide the riders as they progress.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

 That the Commissioner-in-Charge is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with Northwest Disability Support in a form similar to the contract attached as Exhibit A.
