ORDINANCE No. 189228

*Authorize a contract with Synagro-WWT, Inc. for the Columbia Boulevard Wastewater Treatment Plant Biosolids Inventory Reduction Project at an estimated cost of \$7 million (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

- Section 1. The Council finds:
 - 1. CBWTP is experiencing plant performance issues due to an excess of biosolids in the lagoon with lagoon cells full of solids well beyond design capacity, putting public health and effluent discharge permit compliance at risk.
 - 2. An Emergency has been declared by Commissioner Fish pursuant to PCC 5.33.130, authorizing the City to enter into an Emergency Procurement Contract for biosolids dewatering, hauling, and disposal services of an estimated 12,000 to 16,000 dry tons of anaerobically digested biosolids. The Emergency Declaration was signed on September 11, 2018.
 - 3. The Bureau of Environmental Services selected Synagro-WWT, Inc. to perform the required services through emergency procurement procedures and in accordance with PCC 5.33.
 - 4. The established cost is \$7,000,000. The level of confidence is high. Funds were requested in the Fall Budget Monitoring Process Request to ensure funds are available in the Sewer System Operating Fund, FY 2018-19 Budget, Bureau of Environmental Services, for the portion expected to be paid in the current fiscal year. The remaining resources will be requested as part of the FY 2019-20 budget development under Bureau of Environmental Services, Cost Center ESWW000009.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- The Commissioner-in-Charge is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with Synagro-WWT, Inc. for the purposes described in Section 1, in an amount not to exceed \$7,000,000.
- b. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to pay for the contract from the Sewer System Operating Fund Budget when demand is presented and approved by the proper authority.

Section 2.

The Council declares that an emergency exists because current CBWTP biosolids conditions pose a substantial risk to public health and effluent discharge permit compliance and require prompt execution of a contract to remedy the conditions. Therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
