Dear Sir:

The allotment of War Savings Stamps to the State of Oregon is \$17,000,000. This amount it is expected will be sold in this State during the next year.

The Treasurer of the City of Portland has been appointed an agent of the National War Savings Committee, and war stamps can be purchased at his office commencing January 16th, 1918.

These stamps bear 4% interest and are redeemable January 1923.

It is estimated that 6¢ a day from every man, woman and child in the State will produce the amount required.

I respectfully request that you urge upon the employees of your department the necessity of purchasing these stamps in order that the amount necessary from this State be reached.

This, is one of the war measures undertaken by the Government in order to produce sufficient funds to successfully win the war.

Everybody is expected to do their bit.

Please forward at once a letter to all heads of your departments urging their co-operation.
